Springtime in East Lyme is a truly wonderful time! Buds and blooms begin to populate our parks and beaches putting an exclamation mark of beauty on our already beautiful places. The warmer spring air invites us all out to enjoy brisk walks, runs or leisurely strolls through our fan favorite town of Niantic; shops and restaurant doors swing open letting the winter mustiness out and the fresh air of spring in, energizing both product and staff alike. Farms and trails in Flanders are alive as wildlife begins to move out into the sunlight. Enjoy great hikes at Darrows Pond or in the great trails of Oswegatchie Hills groomed and maintained by our dedicated volunteers.

The purr and putting of boat engines can be heard in the river and the bay as covers come off, fishing gear is cleaned and updated, or the sun simply draws our many boating enthusiasts out for a great ride on the water. Our new swing bridge is fully operational; Cini Park upgrade is complete with plenty of parking for the party boats which are ready for business. (Watch for new transient moorings and dingy docks near Cini Park).

One half of the boardwalk is complete and available for enjoyment along our beautiful new beach. The big news is after years of design, our permits are in place, bid documents



will be in and construction should be under way on the western half of the Boardwalk, adjacent to the Hole in the Wall beach. We are hoping for substantial completion by late fall or winter, but when done, we will have a 1.1 mile concrete walkway with 75-100 year storm protection for all to enjoy.

So bring your family and friends to East Lyme and jumpstart your spring with the many wonderful things to do, to eat, to shop and to stroll.

A big thanks to our Parks and Recreation and town crews for keeping our town ticking! I look forward to seeing you.

Director's Note

As spring approaches I wanted to report on a couple of renovation projects taking place this spring; construction on the western half of the Niantic Bay Boardwalk is scheduled to start in early March with a proposed finish date of early December. As part of the construction, a portion of the upper parking lot at McCook will be closed and access to the Hole in the Wall Beach at times will be restricted. Please look for construction updates and further information on the town's web site www.eltownhall.com or on the East Lyme Parks and Recreation Facebook page.

We are also in the design phase for a new restroom facility at Veterans Memorial Park. The new bathrooms will be handicap accessible and provide services for park users as well as hikers using the Oswegatchie Hills Nature Preserve.

The Parks and Recreation Commission have also approved a \$5.00 increase in all McCook Point Park sticker fees. The increase is necessary to help offset the cost of operations at the park and the recent increase in the minimum wage. It has been a number of years since the commission increased their fees: Resident fees last increased in 2006 and this is the first increase in the senior

rate since 2002. Revenues from sticker fees help offset the cost of Gate Attendants, Lifeguards, Park Supervisors, Boardwalk Attendants, Beach Grooming, upkeep and supplies of our restroom facilities, rental of porta potties at Cini Park, daily garbage removal and general upkeep of our facilities.



I would also like to welcome and congratulate Michael McDowell who as of January 1st became the Program Director for the East Lyme Youth Services Bureau as well as handling Special Events. Mike is a great addition to our service team.

As always I would like to thank all of our advertisers who make this magazine possible and their support of our department. I hope that you take the time to read our magazine and partake in the many program offerings that enrich you, your family and the community.

Park & Beach Information

MCCOOK POINT PARK

- Open daily from 8:00 a.m. to sunset
- Pets are permitted from October 1 April 30; must be under owners control at all times it is the owner's responsibility to clean-up all pet waste.
- Restrooms will remain open until mid-November as weather permits.
- · Contact the Parks and Recreation office for Pavilion reservations/availability.
- · Tobacco Free Parks

STATE STATUE 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste. Dogs will be allowed on Town beaches from October 1 to April 30. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year.

NIANTIC BAY BOARDWALK

Approximately half of the boardwalk that is accessed from Cini Park was opened in June 2013. The Hole in the Wall access will remain closed as construction is scheduled to start in early March with a proposed finish date of early December. As part of the construction, a portion of the upper parking lot at McCook's will be closed and access to the Hole in the Wall beach at times will be restricted. Please look for construction updates and further information on the town's website www. eltownhall.com.

BEACH/PARKING PASSES

Parking permits will go on sale Monday, May 5th at the Parks & Recreation Office. Permits will be sold from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. throughout the season. From May 22 - June 26 the office will extend the office hours to 7:00 p.m. on Thursday's. To obtain a season permit, ALL applicants must present their valid car registration at time of purchase. If you are new to town, please bring your tax bill or lease to expedite the process. To avoid lines, you can mail in a copy of your registration, a copy of your latest tax bill (if vehicle is not registered to an East

Lyme/Niantic address), the fee (checks payable to Town of East Lyme) and a self addressed envelope, and we will process your request and mail your beach pass to you.

The pavilion is available for full day or half day rental (9:00 am to 1:00 pm or 1:30 pm until dusk) during the summer season (Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day) for East Lyme/Niantic residents/taxpayers. Please contact the Parks & Recreation office for information and availability.

What is Loss?

Have you had losses? Haven't we all? We think about loss as the death of someone close. Society has rituals to help us get through this. Friends and family draw closer and funerals or memorial services help consolidate our mixed emotions at celebrating a life. But what happens after everyone goes home? And what about other losses? We have no rituals to help us with the losses of divorce or separation, saying goodbye to a child going off to college, or watching our neighbor's moving van drive away. We mourn the loss of our pets, our mobility, a job. When we experience loss, it's important to reach out for support, to maintain regular schedules, and allow ourselves to grieve. When we remain stoic and deal with feelings ourselves, we become more isolated and the loss is compounded. This is a time to rely on friends and family for comfort, conversation, and connection. Sometimes a loss, even a seemingly minor one, brings up painful reminders of others in the past. A therapist can help to explore these feelings and find a path forward, not erasing our losses, but accepting them and refocusing on our dreams and fortunes.



Town Clerk's Office

The Town Clerk's Office is reminding dog owners that they must register their dogs by June 30.

All dogs 6 months of age or older must be licensed. Fees for neutered or spayed dogs are \$8.00 and for dogs that are not neutered or not spayed, the fee is \$19.

A certificate of neutering or spaying from a licensed vet must be presented when licensing a dog for the first time.

An up-to-date certificate of rabies vaccination must be presented before a dog can be licensed. The rabies tag is not acceptable.

To license by mail, send all required information (which will be returned) along with a check made payable to Town of East Lyme and mail to East Lyme Town Clerk, PO Box 519, Niantic, CT 06357. We do require a self-addressed stamped envelope. Postage on the return envelope is 68 cents for the return of the license.

Public Works Single Stream Recycling

In single stream recycling, recyclables are separated at the processing plant, not at your home. This means that all recycling can be placed in a single container separate from the trash container and can be compacted resulting in reduced transportation costs.

No other containers are used for recycling. A gray recycling can is the only one that will be picked up. Recycling collection has been moved to a cycle of every other week. To view the single stream recycling calendar visit our web site at www.eltownhall.com/public works.

Single stream accepts all plastics with the exception of plastic bags and Styrofoam. As with your trash can the recycling can must have a four-foot separation from other objects including your trash can.

East Lyme Public Safety

East Lyme Public Safety wants to share some very important spring safety tips from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). The CPSC recommends that consumers take the following precautions to prevent injuries from lawn and garden equipment:

- Dress appropriately for the task. Wear long pants, longsleeved shirts (to avoid injuries from thrown objects like rocks or sticks), close-fitting clothes and no jewelry (to avoid getting anything caught in moving parts), sturdy shoes with slip-resistant rubber soles, eye protection, heavy gloves (protects hands when changing, sharpening, or cleaning blades), and hearing protection such as ear plugs when using motor-driven equipment.
- · Before starting up machinery, remove objects from the area in which you are working that can cause injury or damage equipment, such as sticks, glass, metal, wire, and stones.
- · Make sure that safety devices on the equipment are in place and functioning properly before starting work.
- · Never let a child ride or operate a garden tractor or riding mower, even if the child is supervised. Teenagers should only be allowed to operate outdoor power equipment if they possess adequate strength and maturity to do so safely. They also should be supervised by a responsible adult.
- · Keep children indoors and supervised at all times when any outdoor power equipment is being used. Young children move quickly and are attracted to mowers and

mowing activity, especially if they have been given rides on mowers before.

- · Never assume children will remain where you last saw them. Be alert and turn off the mower if children enter the mowing area. Use extra care when backing up or when approaching corners, shrubs, and trees.
- Unplug electric tools and disconnect spark plug wires on gasoline-powered tools before making adjustments or clearing jams near moving parts.
- \cdot Be sure power tools are turned off and made inoperable if they must be left unattended to prevent use by children.
- · Handle gas carefully. Never fill gasoline tanks while machinery is on or when equipment is still hot. Wipe up spills. Store gas in an approved container away from the house. Finally, never smoke or use any type of flame around gasoline or any gasoline-powered equipment.
- · Never work with electric power tools in wet or damp conditions. For protection against electrocution, use a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI). GFCIs come in several models, including a portable plug-in type.
- Be sure that extension cords are in good condition, are rated for outdoor use, and are the proper gauge for the electrical current capacity of the tool.


