


From Your First Selectman, Mark B. Walter

Dear East Haddam Residents,

For over 300 years, East Haddam citizens have adjusted their work to suit a constantly changing economic environment; first agriculture, then ship building along the Connecticut River and manufacturing in our water-powered mills. Since WWII, we have added home construction, light manufacturing and tourism to our list of local jobs. Now, we are challenged by a difficult economy. Fortunately, East Haddam's diverse economic history provides us with unique opportunities to adapt once again. Ship building may not dominate anymore but everything else is still here including a large number of townspeople with skills that allow them to earn some or all of their living from home-based businesses.

But many towns can claim these traits. What makes East Haddam a special place, a place so special to us that we actually live here? I would argue that our interest in the arts and the outdoors sets us apart from most Connecticut communities. Mention the Goodspeed Opera House and East Haddam in the same sentence and most people know exactly where you live. The same is true with Gillette's Castle and Devil's Hopyard State Parks. Our support for open space has put us on the short list of Connecticut destination towns where everything from hiking and kayaking to hunting and fishing may all be accomplished in one spectacularly beautiful riverside town that is easily accessible but far away from the cities.

The same resources that make East Haddam an interesting and rewarding place to live also make it a great place to visit.

I attended a meeting in December, the purpose of which was the preservation of the Hadlyme Ferry. Its continuation is threatened by the State's looming



multi-billion dollar budget deficit. Many residents who spoke told how their relatives and friends visit this area because of the attractions and the scenic beauty of the whole area. They always leave amazed. Bruce Elfstrom, owner of Overland Experts of East Haddam, told about training hundreds of U.S. Special Forces in off-road driving. He said the soldiers always want to ride the ferry and cannot believe the US still has places like East Haddam with operating ferries.

We have to take advantage of these incredible natural gifts. I have asked our Economic Development Commission (EDC)

and the Conservation, Agriculture, and Open Space Commissions to spearhead the effort. I believe we should make our open space land and public parks even more accessible to our residents and visitors. One idea is to create a map system that clearly identifies places to park and enter these lands. Another idea is to identify additional acreage that could be purchased by either the town or the East Haddam Land Trust and that should be preserved for future generations of East Haddam citizens. The state has recently awarded East Haddam and the Land Trust grants to help defray the costs of purchase. Later this winter, February or March, there will be an opportunity for residents to decide whether to approve the purchase of three parcels. These properties are intended to complement others already owned by the town and to help maintain East Haddam's rural nature and agricultural heritage. If purchased, the properties will make it possible for a walking trail to be constructed along the Moodus River and hundreds of acres of farm land to be preserved. As the winter progresses, more information will be provided.

The Middle School Conversion Committee has worked very hard to evaluate the conversion of the former middle school into municipal space. The Committee just proposed to the Selectmen a \$12.2 million dollar renovation to complete the first part of their charge. I want to thank everyone on this committee for all their dedication in evaluating this project. I am, however, deeply concerned about the cost of this project and have expressed this to the Committee. The cost significantly exceeds the original estimates and under the structure of the current proposal would cost the median homeowner over \$300 per year in taxes for debt and operating costs. I believe this is too heavy a burden to place on our residents and I believe the costs far outweigh the benefits. We will need to examine a much smaller project.

To help in the evaluation of this and many of the capital projects on our plate the Board of Selectman created a Financial Needs Round Table to help flesh out short and long term

financial strategies for our town. This group is made up from members of our Board of Education, Board of Finance, Planning and Zoning, plus the First Selectman as chair. We will strive to continue our constant focus on not overburdening you, the taxpayers of East Haddam.

The Village Revitalization Commission has started to show off some of their conceptual drawings to gather your feedback and request interest from possible contractors that may have interest in this project. This project, years in development, would make the village a destination retail area that compliments the existing village. The vision, based on multiple surveys of town residents, would house shops, offices,

bed and breakfasts and restaurants. In addition to providing more retail options for residents, once fully developed, it will be a significant taxpayer to the town. See article on page 6.

The citizens will need to determine which of these projects the town will go forward with. It continues to be my goal that the town looks at the kind of projects that will create more jobs, increase property tax revenue and our personal and financial security knowing that we are all working toward protecting the best features and soul of our town. It's great to have visitors from all over the world actually look forward to a return trip if for nothing more than a quaint ride across a river on a ferry.

East Haddam Residents Complete CERT Training

During the fall of 2010, East Haddam Emergency Management sponsored two Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) trainings. The CERT Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help.

The East Haddam CERT Team, now totaling more then thirty members, will play an active roll in assisting the Emergency Management Department throughout the year. Already,




CERT Team members have assisted in running two flu clinics that were held in November 2010. These flu clinics were held in partnership with the Chatham Health District and provided vaccinations to nearly 400 East Haddam Residents.

Additionally, CERT team members will continue to receive ongoing training throughout the year. Planned trainings for members include shelter management, animal sheltering, and CPR/AED Training.

In addition to the members of the CERT Team, East Haddam has a dedicated group of Emergency Management Volunteers who are available to assist when needed. East Haddam is very fortunate to have these committed volunteers trained to assist during times of need.

East Haddam Village Revitalization

The East Haddam Village Revitalization Committee recently facilitated the completion of a conceptual design based on its vision for the conversion of the town office site property into a commercially viable area in East Haddam.



Local architect and East Haddam resident George Fellner was hired by the town to conduct the design work after the committee selected him through a quality-based, competitive selection process.



Mr. Fellner worked closely with the committee to develop a site plan and architectural designs (see examples included) along with photo-realistic concept renderings that reflect the committee's vision of the village site as a "daycation destination" - a walking village with mixed commercial



and residential/professional use, including twostoried buildings, with retail space on the first floors and professional offices/apartments/bed & breakfast units on the second floors. The conceptual design includes a small village green along the Connecticut River to be used for miniconcerts, arts & crafts fairs, holiday festivals, farmers market, and other events.

The concept renderings will be used to help move the project forward, including attracting potential developers for the site. The committee meets on the fourth Thursday of the month at the Town Hall Annex at 7:00 p.m.

Hiking Trail at Nichols Field

Hale-Ray Agricultural Education students have created a new hiking trail on the Nichols Field property in East Haddam. The Ray FFA Chapter has recently taken stewardship of this property and has been awarded an FFA grant that will allow them to purchase the tools to install more trails in future years. The current trail is 1/3 mile in length and is an easy and lovely walk for the East Haddam community members to enjoy!





It's Back! (Snow, that is)

We hear frequent complaints about the dangerous road conditions that result when people push driveway snow out into our public roads. We actually have an ordinance prohibiting this practice, which states, "No person shall plow, throw, put or cause to be thrown or put any snow or ice from any private property or from any area in the rear of said private property or in area between a private dwelling house or structure and the legally laid out sidewalk into any public highway in the town of East Haddam." Please keep this in mind this winter. Your neighbors will appreciate it.

Sand for Winter Ice

Residents of East Haddam are reminded that they may take only a small amount of sand from one of the municipal sand piles for their personal use in sanding steps, walkways, or ice patches in driveways. Piles are located at the corner of Haywardville and Early Roads and at the Town Garage, off Mt. Parnassus Road near Shagbark. For safety reasons, residents should not obtain sand during storm conditions when operators are loading trucks and entering and leaving the site.

It is understood that sand is provided for private, personal use and is not to be used commercially or for profit, or for any application other than as a safety precaution. Residents needing more than a few buckets of sand per winter should purchase their own supply.

A Celebration of Open Space in East Haddam

The East Haddam Land Trust and the East Haddam Environmental Roundtable jointly sponsored a Celebration of Open Space in East Haddam on Saturday, November 13. The purpose of the event was to recognize those who have committed land to permanently protected open space in East Haddam over the years.

All the honorees received certificates expressing appreciation for their foresighted commitment to preserving East Had-

dam's open space and rural character and for the fact that the land they have protected will be enjoyed for generations to come.

In all, forty people were recognized. Several of them spoke movingly of their attachment to the land they have preserved.

First Selectman Mark Walter addressed the group. He pointed out that open space not only preserves East Haddam's rural character, natural environment, and the quality of life of its citizens but also helps drive East Haddam's economy. People visit East Haddam to enjoy the scenic views and to hike the protected acres open to the public. The economic value of East Haddam's open space is reinforced by the fact that Yankee Magazine has recognized East Haddam as a top 25 New England foliage destination.

Rotary Club of East Haddam

The Rotary Club of East Haddam sends a sincere thank you to all those in the community who supported this year's Thanksgiving Food Drive. Donations by town citizens were matched by a grant from Liberty Bank and the funds collected benefitted the town Food Bank. The Rotary Club helped to pack and distribute over 120 food baskets to local families this year.

Participating Organization Reports: The newly formed Agriculture Commission reported that it is in the process of identifying all of East Haddam's farms and agricultural businesses. The East Haddam Future Farmers of America reported that, working with the Conservation Commission, they have assumed stewardship responsibility for the town-owned Nichols open space. The East Haddam Economic Develop-

ment Commission reported esta-blishing a Tax and Business Incentive Ordinance, distributing 3,600 tourism brochures highlighting East Haddam's recreational and other attractions, other tourism initiatives, including reuse of Sunrise Resort and Grandview Camp, and EDC web site improvements.

As former First Selectman Sue Merrow pointed out, it was fitting the event occurred on a beautiful fall day looking out across Moodus Resevoir over acres of permanently protected open space.

During these tough economic times, why in the world should we buy more open space? Don't we have enough?

It's easy to see how acquiring open space makes good environmental sense. What most of us don't know is protected open spaces - public parks, preserved farmland, and private conserved lands - provide substantial economic benefits as well*.

Consider the following benefits of protected open space in East Haddam:

Promotes economic development. Open space creates opportunities for business activity that supports outdoor recreation.

Increases residential property values. Homeowners are willing to pay a premium to live in close proximity to protected open space.

Preserves rural character. Rural character is an asset that increases in value over time as more small communities in Connecticut become overdeveloped.

Keeps local taxes stable. Developed residential or commercial areas increase the need for municipal services such as roads, environmental services (e.g., storm management, water quality), education, and emergency services (e.g. Fire, Police).

Keeps government small. Developed areas increase the demand for public administration such as record-keeping, permitting, voter registration, land use approvals, dispute resolution and legal counsel.

Messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices, including land-line phones, mobile phones, email, and more. If you don't confirm receipt of the message, the system will try to reach your next contact number or device you entered into the system. This system replaces the town's AlertNow system but does not affect the Alerts that are sent by the Board of Education. We will also send out school closings and delays on this system for those that request them.

Additionally, by signing up you can choose to receive additional nonemergency alerts such as East Haddam Swing Bridge closures, Road construction affecting your area, crime watch information, and Community News and Events.



From the Assessor

The October 1, 2010 Grand List of all real and personal property is anticipated to be certified on January 31, 2011. Assessment notices will be mailed for all personal property and only real estate that had increases due to improvements on the property. Any persons who wish to appeal their assessment may appeal to the Board of Assessment Appeals in March 2011. Requests to the Board are due by February 20, 2011. Written requests should include the property owner's name, name and address of the person appealing the assessment, type of property being appealed (real estate or personal property), reason for the appeal, and opinion of value. Although any written request is accepted, forms are available on: www.easthaddam.org, the East Haddam web site. The mailing address for the Board of Assessment Appeals is P.O. Box 623, Moodus, CT 06469.

The Assessor's Office will begin taking applications for the Homeowners Credit Program and Additional Veterans Benefits on February 1, 2011. To qualify, total income must not exceed \$32,300 for a single person and \$39,500 for a couple (joint income), including Social Security and Medicare.

The deadline for applications is May 13. Applications for

the Homeowners' Local Option Program will be accepted from February 1, 2011 until May 13, 2011. The age and proof of income requirements are the same as for the state programs but the income limit is \$50,000 per household.

Disabled veterans must submit proof of disability by March 31, 2011 to receive exemption benefits. Qualifying income for Additional Veterans Benefits is the same as the Elderly and Totally Disabled Tax Relief Program. Applications for the Additional Veterans Benefits will be accepted until October 1, 2011.

Any person or entity starting a new business in town should notify the Assessor's Office so that we can send a personal property declaration in the fall. Personal property assessments are based on the declarant's filing. These assessments can be appealed to the Board of Assessment Appeals in March 2011. Please note that recent legislation has raised the assessment limit for appealing to the board from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000. Assessment appeals over \$1,000,000 will be tried in the Superior Court.

Great News in Our Schools

I am very pleased to have the opportunity to tell you about some of the wonderful accomplishments happening in our schools.

Student Achievement

East Haddam Schools opened the year with the news that we have made tremendous gains (as high as 30 percent) in our 2010 Connectic7ut Mastery Test (CMT) scores across the board for grades three through eight. CMT testing is an annual state-wide test administered to all CT public school students in grades three through eight. Subject area mastery in math, English, and science is measured by requiring students to complete a series of rigorous questions using both narrative and problem-solving techniques. Although results state-wide showed gains for many schools, East Haddam Schools made remarkable progress. It is now our challenge to maintain significant growth in our scores for the long term – a challenge we embrace with enthusiasm!

ConnCAN Ranks East Haddam Elementary School in the Top Ten for 2010

The CT advocacy group known as ConnCAN has recently notified us that it will rank East Haddam Elementary School as First in Improvement and feature us as a Top Ten School in its annual list of the top 160 Connecticut Public Schools.


Communication and Technology

Registrar of Voters News

The East Haddam Registrars of Voters conducted an election on November 2, 2010, which included federal and state contests. Of East Haddam's 5,763 eligible registered voters, 3,716, or 64%, took the opportunity to vote. This included

1,315 democrats of 1,856 or 70%; 939 republicans of 1,242 or 75%; 1,434 unaffiliated of 2,614 or 54%; and 28 from other parties of 52 or 53%.

Beth Shalom Rodfe Zedek

Serving the Communities of East Haddam/Moodus and Surrounding Areas

Synagogue traces its Moodus roots back to 1906

October 21 of this year marked the ten-year anniversary of the consecration of Congregation Beth Shalom Rodfe Zedek (CBSRZ) as a center for Jewish religious and social life and a source of culture and learning for the river and sound communities. The synagogue was formed when two congregations joined together, Beth Shalom of Deep River and Congregation Rodfe Zedek of East Haddam-Moodus.

In 1906, Jewish families centered in Moodus formed an informal group of worshipers. Nine years later, they bought an old house and turned it into a synagogue. Congregation Rodfe Zedek was formalized. Two decades later, across the Connecticut River, a similar story unfolded. A chicken farmer, Isadore Romanoff, held services at his house using a Torah kept in his desk. This was the birth of what eventually became Congregation Beth Shalom, which purchased a Lutheran church on Union Street in Deep River, its home for more than half a century.

In its first decade, CBSRZ has endeavored to serve not only its Jewish community, which includes many inter-religious families, but to reach out to its neighbors to offer programs in music, books and authors, art, and education. A number of non-Jews are regular participants in weekly study of the Torah, the Five Books of Moses.

In 2011 CBSRZ will be sponsoring numerous events that are open to the public.

On January 16 there will be "Books & Bagels" with renowned food writer Dori Greenspan, who will discuss her newest book, *Around my French Table: More than 300 recipes from my home to yours.* This event is free.

CBSRZ will also hold its third annual Music & More series (five concerts; open to the public) beginning on Sunday, February 27 with soprano Susan Von Reichenbach singing Gershwin, Weill, Bernstein, and classic Italian and

French songs. Others in the series are ShirLaLa, hip Jewish music for families, on April 10; Howard Fishman, toast of Manhattan jazz clubs, on June 5; A Klez Act, a klezmer song and dance fest, on June 29; and Chestnut Hill Concert with pianist Mihae Lee and cellist Ronald Thomas on August 21. On November 24, CBSRZ was greatly saddened by the passing of its beloved congregant Miriam Klar. Miriam was renowned as a warm welcoming hostess at Klar Crest, her family's Moodus resort. At CBSRZ she was a regular member of the "Holy Scrollers," the weekly Torah-study group, where she was not shy about making the points she felt needed to be made. Miriam was born in Brooklyn, NY and received an Associates Degree from Middlesex Community College. Miriam loved her hometown of Moodus and enjoyed listening to the Music on the River with her husband, David.

Rabbi Rachel Goldenberg officiated at Miriam's funeral in CBSRZ sanctuary. The rabbi spoke of Miriam's upbeat spirit and recalled a party Miriam held last August in her own honor to say goodbye to all her friends from the congregation,



some of whom she had known since the days when the Klars were stalwarts at Congregation Rodfe Zedek. Miriam will be greatly missed.



Eagle Scout Builds Outdoor Stations of the Cross at St. Bridget of Kildare Church in Moodus

On a beautiful autumn afternoon, community members, family, friends, and parishioners of St. Bridget of Kildare Church in Moodus came together for the dedication of a newly constructed outdoor Stations of the Cross. The stations were constructed as an Eagle Scout project by Colin D'Amelio, with the blessing of the pastor of St. Bridget, Rev. Gregoire Fluet.

When asked why he wanted to take on such a project, Colin, who is an altar server at St. Bridget's, said that he "wanted to give something back to his Church and have a place that people could visit and pray at for a long time to come." He also wanted to dedicate the stations to Father Fluet's mother, Dorothy Fluet, who passed away in July. He believes that this will be a lasting tribute to her and a gift to the whole community.

The idea for outdoor stations was first presented Father Fluet in June, and it was at that time that Reverend suggested that they be constructed on the hill beside the church next to the existing Lourdes Shrine.

The shrine was constructed in October of 1988 and was in need of some cleaning and refurbishing. It became the perfect place to construct the stations in conjunction with

cleaning up the shrine. Funds for the project were raised through a pasta dinner and separate donations from parishioners and community members. Construction began in September continued throughout the summer by family, friends, parishioners, and

Boy Scouts from Troop 22 in East Haddam. The project included trimming of shrubs, cleaning of the existing shrine

area and walkway, excavating post holes, placing marble chips, planting boxwood plants, building station boxes, wiring outdoor lights, and placing station statues and numbers. The station statues were purchased through Patrick Baker & Sons in Southington, CT and were created in New York City.

The dedication of the stations was led by Father Fluet on Saturday, October 23. As he blessed each station, the

thirty or so parishioners walked the stations, singing the Stabat Mater. The date of the dedication of the stations corres p o n d e d almost the day, twenty-two

Disability License Plates

Plates and permits do not allow you to disobey state or local parking regulations. They also do not exempt you from parking fees unless a locality has adopted an ordinance to that effect.

Misuse of Parking Permits or Plates

With the parking permit and license plates goes the responsibility for making sure they are used properly. If you misuse plates or a parking permit or allow another to misuse them, the Department of Motor Vehicles may revoke the plates/permit or deny renewal. The most common misuse is when someone other than the person with a disability uses

the plates or permit to park in a space reserved for people with disabilities.

Traveling Out-of-State

Connecticut plates and permits for people with disabilities are available only to Connecticut residents. However, Connecticut honors out-of-state plates and permits for people with disabilities, and most other states also honor Connecticut permits and plates.

If you are traveling to another state, check with the police or motor vehicle agency of the other state to be sure.




