

Selectman's Corner

It is our annual budget season and I am proud of the way this year's budget came together as a collaborative effort with the Boards of Selectmen, Education and Finance. We kicked off the budget season with the first ever tri-board meeting to jointly discuss the financial challenges we all faced and published a combined budget book that used the same format for all boards. This increases our transparency of how our tax dollars are spent at all levels of our municipality.

I am happy to report that our overall proposed expenses have DECREASED for the current fiscal year. Due to intense focus on increasing efficiency and reducing costs our expenses have been relatively flat the past few years. While many other towns as well as the state and federal governments face fiscal crisis, we in East Haddam are on a sound financial footing. Our goal each year of my administration has been to reduce our expenses without affecting services to our citizens.

The 2011-2012 proposed budget now passed to the Board of Finance represents a 1.9% or .23 mill increase. This represents a decrease in the General Government expenditures of (-\$439,586) and an increase in the Education budget of \$298,413.

OK, so expenses are down, but we are asking for a very

small increase in the mill rate. If I were you, I would be thinking "what gives?" right now. The reason for the proposed increase is simple; revenues from the state, from permits, etc are down significantly due to the




recession (more detail below).

This proposed budget includes investments in technology that will give added access to the information our residents need from the Town without the necessity of coming to the Town Office Building. This plan will also create a safer storage system with easy search capabilities that residents can access via the internet 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Furthermore, we have achieved these reductions in expenses by continually adding more interlocal agreements between our neighboring towns.

We have our first two photo-voltaic installations thanks to our new Clean Energy Task Force and Craig Bradway of DCS Energy. You can check them out at the Senior Center and our salt shed at the public works complex.



Senior Center

Over the last four budgets the Board of Selectmen and Board of Finance have reduced East Haddam's total budget each year; unfortunately our revenues continue to decline. As I wrote earlier, the weak economy is to blame for these shortfalls. The State which relies on income and sales tax revenue is facing a \$3.5 billion dollar shortfall. Locally, our grand list grew by less than 1% generating additional tax revenues of only \$160,000. Intergovernmental revenues are down \$137,738 interest income is down \$45,000, local revenue is down \$59,125 and other fund sources are down \$284,899.

We are all paying more attention to these economic trends due to the credit meltdown.

The debt we are able to carry as a home owner, business owner or town is based on revenues and existing long term bonded debt. Since bonds are normally a twenty year obligation we must be very careful about the total debt to which we are committed. Presently we are carrying \$23 million in total debt to finance the High School, New Middle School, Sewer plant and Open Space. The payments on this debt total \$2.3 million per year.

As many of you know, the Old Middle School Conversion Committee has just submitted its recommendation to the Board of Selectmen that we spend another \$13 million on a 67,000 square foot renovation. Let's look at the actual cost of such a project. Our total town annual debt service payments would rise to \$3.3 million.

This would be approximately a 40% increase in our total debt service resulting in an immediate 1.3 mill rate increase.

Before any referendum to commit our town to a long term debt both the Board of Selectmen and the Board of Finance must be convinced that this is a course that will leave the town in a strong financial state with the flexibility to handle our economies' uncertain future. I personally think this project is far too big, that it is far too expensive and that there are other more cost effective ways to modernize our town facilities.

So what are our next steps? The good news is that we now know what it costs to renovate the entire old middle school complex and we have the plans ready as one option. I will be starting a committee to examine a more scaled down proposal or rethink a "phased approach" to solving our desire to re-purpose the old middle school.

Lastly, congratulations and a huge "thank you" to all the donors of this year's Muscular Dystrophy challenge! I was locked up in Middletown until I met bail with your donations. Not only did we make bail but we were the highest bail raiser with \$2,857 dollars.

Thanks also goes to Linda Cherry, Sophie Soja and Toni McCabe for their leadership in helping to create our new food bank in the lower level of the Grange Hall. We can't wait to show off the new facility.

Now let's all enjoy Spring!

Economic Development Commission

There has been significant activity on the East Haddam Economic Development Commission over the last few months. We have welcomed two new regular members (Edward Odell and Gerry Rucker) and two alternates (Ralph Parady and Pamela Rubenbauer).

We're pleased to report success with two of our recent outreach events. The East Haddam Townwide Business Night, which was hosted at the Grange Hall on January 31, was very well attended. The event was sponsored not only by the EDC but Essex Printing, Hayden Wine and Spirits, and Desservir Bakery. At this event our town Land Use Administrator spoke about how to obtain a home occupation permit for those working from home or may be considering setting up a home office. Maria Keiser from eCircle discussed the benefits of peer-to-peer consulting, and Paul Hughes, from the Middlesex Chamber Revitalization Commission, spoke regarding the availability of Chamber funding for small businesses.

Our 8th Annual Chowder Cook Off also did very well this year. For the first time this event was held in tandem with a Business Expo organized by the newly organized East Haddam Business Association. We are grateful to La Vita Gustosa and the Gelston House for hosting these events, and we want to especially thank all the volunteers, restaurateurs, and organizations that participated and made the event such a success.

We have been getting regular reports on the progress of the Goodspeed actor housing project. Naturally it is impossible not to take notice of the progress as one drives through the village; as of this writing, we are told two of the units on Creamery Road are nearly ready for occupancy.

Another item the Commissioners have been monitoring is the village mobility project. Architects Fuss and O'Neill made a presentation at our regular March meeting. Pending approval from the State Department of Transportation, we hope to see the crosswalks installed in the village during the summer.

In addition to her regular duties, our Economic Development Coordinator Melissa Ziobron has been working closely with Joe Clark to support planning for the East Haddam Brewery, which is now moving through the zoning and permitting process.

The EDC has taken recent steps regarding vacant commercial properties: we have asked our Planning and Zoning Commission to consider a blight ordinance. We are currently developing a website where we will seek to maintain an active list of available commercial properties, which will be linked directly from the town website.

WHO SHOULD USE A DESIGNATED DRIVER?

A Designated Driver is a drinking-age adult who agrees not to drink any alcoholic beverages, and to safely transport anyone else home. Designated Drivers should not drink any alcoholic beverages; therefore, they are never the person least drunk. A Designated Driver can be used anywhere people ride together after drinking alcohol. Designated Drivers are also important when someone is taking medication that makes them drowsy or otherwise impaired and not fit to drive.

Safe Ride programs are intended for those who drink or plan to drink alcohol or take prescription and non-prescription drugs that may affect driving. Find out about Safe Ride programs in your community, and how they operate. If one does not exist in your community, ask local businesses and community service groups to start one, to ensure that everyone has a safe and sober way home.

By starting or expanding a Designated Driver program, your community will help fight impaired driving. Designated Driver and Safe Ride programs, highly visible law enforcement mobilizations and training programs, help change attitudes about impaired driving.

Dog Licenses

Connecticut State law requires all dogs aged six months or older to be licensed in the town in which they reside. Licenses are renewable during the month of June for the coming fiscal year. Proof of rabies vaccination and of spaying or neutering is also required, if not already provided.

The fees for dog licensing are as follows:

\$ 8.00 - spayed or neutered - per dog

\$16.00 - not spayed or neutered - per dog

\$51.00 - per kennel (10 dogs)

\$102.00 – per kennel (20 dogs).

\$ 1.00 - transfer license from another CT town

\$ 1.00 - lost dog tag

\$ 1.00 - late fee per month

Dog licenses may be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office or through the mail. Look for reminder notices to be mailed beginning June 1. If licensing through the mail, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope. Any veterinary paperwork sent in will be returned along with the license and tag.

Down the Drain

Right about now, with the snowmelt and spring rains upon us, we are thankful to have roads that are designed to drain properly, keeping us safe in our travels. That water does, however, need to go somewhere. In some cases road drainage is designed to drain to adjacent land over long stretches, while other times it is necessary to collect the water and transport it to another spot for discharge.

In the past, road drainage was considered relatively clean water. Today we know that it can carry excess nutrients, bacteria, heavy metals, oils, grease, salt, sand, and other debris when it discharges. Additionally in summer, with asphalt surfaces reaching well over 100°F, it produces flushes of warm or even hot water. The closer the discharges are to bodies of water, the higher the potential for water degradation.

One of the first steps to effectively manage stormwater from an environmental perspective is to figure out what is actually out there and where it drains to. With that in mind the Eightmile River Wild & Scenic Coordinating Committee, or ERWSCC for short, teamed up with the three main watershed towns of Salem, East Haddam, and Lyme and the Eastern Connecticut Resource Conservation Area, Inc., and went in search of some financial support. That support was received by way of a federal grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Federation by way of the Long Island Sound Future's Fund. Recognizing that towns operate on a town-wide basis, as opposed to following watershed lines, the grant provides enough funding to map all municipal stormwater outlets town-wide.


The firm of Nathan L. Jacobson & Associates, Inc. has been hired to conduct the field mapping as well as identify options for the town when infrastructure needs to be replaced. Some of you may recognize this local firm as one that also provides engineering support to the towns of East Haddam and Salem. While not the primary goal of this project, the team was pleased that its request to utilize the services of a local business was approved.

Let's face it: road drainage is probably not the most exciting topic for the majority of folks. But if you live near the water or enjoy fishing or boating or just a quiet hike along a wooded stream, you most likely appreciate clean water. And clean water, along with ensuring public safety, is the main goal of this project.

Want to do more? ERWSCC launched its RiverSmart Program a couple of years ago in an effort to involve local citizens in protecting the watershed they live in. This program outlines several simple activities that residents can do to improve water quality on their own properties. You can find more information about the RiverSmart Program and get your own free RiverSmart home decal by visiting our website at www.eightmileriver.org.

This program is open to all residents in the town, no matter what watershed you live in.

From the Assessor

I would like all residents to be aware that the Assessor's Office will begin accepting applications for the Elderly and Totally Disabled Renters Rebate Program on May 16. Applicant's total income must not exceed \$32,300 for a single person, \$39,500 for a couple (joint income), including Social Security and Medicare. Applicants must be 65 or older or totally disabled and bring all income, rent, and utility information from 2010. The deadline for filing is September 15, 2011.

In addition, the deadline for filing for the Elderly and Totally Disabled Homeowners Program is May 13. Qualifying income and age requirements for the Homeowners Program and Additional Veterans Benefits is the same as the Elderly and Totally Disabled Renters Rebate Program. It should be noted that the town of East Haddam has adopted by local option an additional tax credit to homeowners 65 and older whose income does not exceed \$50,000 (including Social Security). Applicants must bring proof of income including Social Security for 2010. Applications for the Additional Veterans Benefits will be accepted until October 1, 2011.

As the Tax Collector's Office prepares the July tax bills, those residents whose motor vehicles have been sold, stolen, totaled, or who have moved out-of-state may be eligible for a pro-ration of their car taxes.

Two forms of proof are necessary to pro-rate or remove a vehicle from the grand list. Residents must bring a copy of the plate receipt issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles at the time of cancellation of registration, and a copy of one of the following: bill of sale, transfer of title, receipt from junkyard, notification of total loss, or some other document showing the date on which the vehicle was disposed.

The Assessor's Office has its own web page on the town website. It includes information on real estate, personal property, and motor vehicle assessments; property tax relief for seniors, veterans, and the disabled; renters' rebate; information on revaluation; and access to applications and forms pertaining to the Assessor's Office.

The Community Lions Club officers recently hosted a Chili-Fest in which they prepared a great supper for the members to thank them for all their hard work and dedica-Lion Linda Bradshaw presented an orientation to inform members, new and seasoned, of all the areas that the Community Lions support both locally here in East Haddam and within the state. The Connecticut Lions Eye Research Foundation (CLERF) at Yale and the Low Vision Center of Eastern Connecticut are two major areas that Lions support. An innovative eye screening program funded by CLERF for preschool children ages two to five has been offered to the six nursery schools in East Haddam. The PediaVision S08 Vision Screener can scan a youngster's eyes in seconds and produce a computerized printout of any abnormalities so the child can be referred for treatment. Nearly 20 percent of children in this age group are found to need treatment. The earlier the child's problem is diagnosed, the greater the chance to return to normal or near-normal vision by age seven is possible. Eight Community Lions are being trained to administer the scans at no cost to the parents or the schools.



Single Stream Recycling, Food Bank Garden

In June 2010, East Haddam became one of many towns in Connecticut to move to single stream recycling. Recycling conserves natural resources, saves energy, and reduces the cost of waste disposal for the town. Now all your recyclables - paper, cardboard, milk and juice cartons, plastic, glass, and metal—can be combined in one bin (separate from the trash). All containers must be empty and rinsed clean.

According to the Transfer Station's report for the last quarter of 2010, East Haddam disposed of about 1,229 tons of solid waste (not including construction debris); about 215

tons, or 17%, of that was made up of recyclables. So the average East Haddamite disposed of, per day, about 2.5 lbs. of trash and about .5 lb. of recyclables. Compare this to what the average American produces: about 4.4 pounds of trash per day, according to the Environmental Protection Agency.

Agriculture Commission Established

East Haddam established an Agriculture Commission by vote of Town Meeting on June 1, 2010, making East Haddam one of the few Connecticut towns to have such a commission. Agriculture is an important element of the rural character of East Haddam, linking the town's past with its present and its future. The purpose of the Agriculture Commission is to preserve, protect, and promote farming in East Haddam and to encourage new agricultural enterprises.

Specifically, the commission is charged with the following duties and responsibilities:

Information: To serve as a conduit between municipal boards and commissions, elected officials, nonprofit agencies, civic organizations, and local farmers.

Education: To recommend changes in local law, regulations, rules, and practices regarding compatibility with agriculture, farms, and farming. To provide information and guidance on agriculture-related issues - such as zoning, inland wetlands, public works - to town departments and other town boards and commissions. To support young farmers and new farmers. To support local, regional, and vocational agriculture education programs.

Conflict Resolution: To serve as a resource for information and nonbinding advice for residents, town commissions, and departments concerning resolution of agriculture-related conflicts.

Economic Opportunities: To identify innovative opportunities for farming in East Haddam. To promote opportunities for residents and local businesses to support and value farming. To work to create a climate that supports the economic viability of farming as a career in East Haddam and to create a sustainable agriculture community. To help East Haddam farmers secure state, federal, and other grants. To work with land-use boards and commissions and East Haddam's Open Space Committee to secure the land base necessary for agricultural uses.

The Agriculture Commission consists of five regular members and three alternate members serving three year terms. The commission meets on the first Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Office Annex. Its meetings are open to the public, whose attendance is welcomed. The commission can be reached at EHAGCOMM@comcast.net.

The first project the commission has undertaken is to identify all the agriculture operations in town. It has tentatively identified over seventy operations, ranging from full-time farms to hobby farms to people who maintain a couple of mowing lots and sell hay to others. The next step will be a letter introducing the commission to those identified, asking them if they would like to participate in a survey or interview to enable the commission to determine how best it can be of assistance. If you are engaged in agriculture and do not receive such a letter in the next few weeks and would like to participate, please email the Commission at the above address.



East Haddam Board of Education Passes 2011-12 Budget

At a special Board of Education meeting held on Tuesday, March 1, Dr. Ellen Solek, Superintendent of Schools, presented the annual 2011-12 school budget proposal to the board. Highlights of the budget proposal include:

- Minimal increases for Certified/Noncertified, and Transportation Contracts
- · Reduction of 2.0 Staff Positions
- Addition of 1.0 Reading Consultant and 1.0 Math Consultant

Dr. Solek highlighted several underlying goals for the budget proposal including Academic Achievement and Accountability, K-12 implementation of state-mandated Scientific Research-Based Interventions, equal access to district-wide technology, and balancing the needs of the East Haddam School District with the need for continued fiscal responsibility amidst challenging economic conditions.

The proposal reflects a dollar increase of \$298,413 and a percentage increase of 1.65%. District-wide salaries and benefits continue to represent about 75% of the total proposal. Health insurance costs have increased by over 16% since the 2010-11 fiscal year, as has the cost per gallon for fuel oil and diesel. The district is estimating revenue from the state's Education Cost Sharing Grant and other sources to be about \$4.3 million dollars for fiscal year 2011-12.

The Board of Education presented its budget in conjunction with the town budget on Monday, March 14 at the Grange Hall. The annual town meeting is scheduled for May 11, with the Referendum scheduled for May 24. 

Registrars of Voters News

The referendum on purchasing land and conservation easements to three parcels was held at the Town Meeting Hall on Town Street on Thursday, March 10, from noon to 8 p.m.

The vote was in the affirmative for all three parcels: Harris property passed 555 yes to 265 no; Dean property passed 518 yes to 302 no; Bogan property passed 526 yes to 296 no. The total number of recorded votes was 822. This included 805 registered voters (798 in person, 7 by absentee ballot); 14 voters who owned real estate; and 3 registered motor vehicle owners. Thus, 14% of the 5,780 registered East Haddam voters participated in the referendum.

A new fireproof cabinet was purchased, allowing data and tabulators to be securely stored. A copier/fax machine has been installed for use by all of the River House offices. The Registrars are very pleased to have a sunny, lockable office.

Local Bank Executive Named to New Advisory Board

The Federal Reserve Bank of Boston has appointed 12 members, including one local bank executive, to an advisory council formed in response to new regulations.

Each Federal Reserve Bank across the country is establishing a First District Community Depository Institutions Advisory Council (CDIAC) in response to the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010. The councils will represent the perspective of smaller financial institutions and provide input on the economy and lending conditions, among other issues, according to a statement.

The First District's 12 CDIAC members represent ommercial banks, thrift institutions and credit unions with assets less than \$10 billion. Members, which are from each of the six New England states, will meet three times annually.




