Dear Friends and Neighbors:




On April 1, 2020, Justin Berwick became a permanent employee on the Public Works crew. Justin started as a temporary employee twelve months ago, filling a position temporarily vacated by a full time employee. During this past year, Justin improved his existing skills and learned many new ones, becoming proficient operating much of the public works equipment. In January of this year, we started to hear about a new coronavirus infecting the citizens of Wuhan, China. And now, less than three months later, we are combating a world-wide pandemic right here in our little town of East Haddam. The impact to the town, state and nation has been unbelievable. Our normal means of greeting, meeting and socializing in general, has been profoundly changed. We have been asked to stay home, frequently wash our hands, practice social distancing and wear a mask when out in public spaces. It feels strange, frightening and frustrating. But we must remain vigilant in our efforts to mitigate the impact of this pandemic in our community, despite the challenges.

On March 18 we closed the Town offices at the Municipal Office Complex to protect the staff and to enable us to keep many of the Town operations running. Right now no Town employees are sick. Because of that we have been able to issue building permits, conduct building inspections, record births and deaths and issue wedding licenses, among many other things. Health inspections are being done by the Chatham Health District staff. Many Park and Recreation programs are cancelled but some are still going on remotely. The Senior Center continues to distribute sustaining nourishment to our seniors while keeping them safe. The Food Bank has been getting tremendous support from the Town's corps of volunteers, so that the food can still be safely distributed. The Libraries are closed but folks are availing themselves of the online

services. It's a new way of living and governing. I know we miss the old normal but we are sticking to rules in the "new normal" and it is making a difference in keeping the virus in check in East Haddam.

By the time you read this, the budget will have been passed, not by the citizens, but by the vote of the Board of Finance. In light of the financial and social impact on the Town, the goal was a zero mill increase. Was this the way the Board of Selectmen, Board of Education or the Board of Finance wanted to pass a budget? NO! We wanted a referendum, as is normally done to pass the budget. But the Governor's Executive Order mandated it be done this way in order to avoid any transmission of COVID-19. Every citizen needs to know that the members on these three Boards wanted your input and that they did what was required to address the needs of the Town while also recognizing the impact of COVID-19.

Other unfortunate changes for this spring and summer will be the cancelling of many of the events we have all come to enjoy. The Memorial Day Parade is cancelled. Numerous other events will probably follow suit. Please go to the Town's website at: www. easthaddam.org for all of the latest information. Even though certain activities will be missed, our state parks and open space properties remain open. We have miles and miles of hiking trails, continued on page 6

We hope that the situation resolves as quickly as possible and that we can all get back to some sense of normalcy!



Memorial Day Parade

The Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has brought many changes to our lives in recent months and it has impacted many of the pleasures we enjoy daily.

It is with great sadness that we are informing the public that the Town has made the decision to cancel the Memorial Day Parade and Services for this year. Should the COVID-19 situation improve before Memorial Day we will provide revised plans to the public via the East Haddam News and the Town website.

We encourage everyone to put out their flags in honor of Memorial Day. If you have any questions, please call the Selectmen's Office at: 860-873-5021.

Homeowner's Tax Credit Program

Due to the growing concerns over the spread of the COVID-19 virus, Governor Lamont has issued Executive Order No. 7S which suspends the requirement for homeowners who are already on the homeowners' tax credit program to come in and reapply this year. They will automatically get the same credit that they received last year. First time applicants must submit proof of income by May 15th, 2020. This includes the 2019 1099 Social Security statement, income tax return, or any other income for 2019. The documents can be mailed, faxed, emailed or dropped in the tax collector's drop box by the Municipal Office Complex front entrance.

Tax Collector

The Tax Office is busy preparing for the mailing of the 2019 Grand List tax bills. All bills will be in the mail June 30, 2020 with a due date of July 1, 2020, payable by October 1, 2020 without interest.

Payments by mail must be postmarked by October 1, 2020 to avoid interest. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic Governor Lamont has issued Executive Order 7S allowing municipalities to defer taxes due by three (3) months, resulting in the due date of October 1, 2020. A reminder bill will NOT be sent.

If you still owe taxes on the 2018 Grand List, an attempt should be made to clear up the back taxes before the new bills come out. Liens will be placed on all outstanding real estate balances. This is an additional charge.

Tax payments may be made in person, by mail or online.



The East Haddam Town Clerk's Office produces the original birth certificate for any birth that occurs within the Town, certified copies of original birth certificates are received in the Clerk's Office when the birth occurred within the State of Connecticut and the mother is a resident of East Haddam.

The East Haddam Town Clerk's Office produces the original marriage certificate for any marriage that occurs within the Town's borders. Certified copies are received when either the bride or groom are a resident of the town; and the marriage occurs within the State of Connecticut.

Original death certificates are received in the East Haddam Town Clerk's Office for any death that is pronounced within the Town's borders. Certified copies are filed with the Town when the decedent is a resident and the death occurred within the State of Connecticut.

Town Clerk - Presidential Preference Primary

Connecticut's Presidential Preference Primary has been postponed to coincide with other State Primaries (if necessary) on August 11, 2020. Due to the Covid-19 virus processes are not following normal protocol and are changing daily.

If the primary goes forward, it is anticipated that an absentee ballot application will be forwarded to each voter entitled to receive one from the Secretary of State's Office.

Under NORMAL conditions there are only five acceptable reasons a voter may cast an absentee ballot.

They are indicated below:

- 1 the elector's absence from their town for all of the hours of voting;
- 2 illness or physical disability;
- 3 active service in the US armed forces;
- 4 religious tenets forbid secular activity on Election Day; or
- 5 service as a polling place official in a town other than their own.

It is highly anticipated that these restrictions will be expanded in accordance with social distancing requirements. Please contact the Clerk's Office for clarifications of the rules in place as the Primary date approaches.

Absentee ballots will continue to be a twostep process. The ballot may not be issued until an application for the ballot has been received. The absentee ballot application with an original signature must be on file in order for a ballot to be counted.

The elector must be enrolled in the party in order to vote in that party's primary. A party enrollment change requires 90 days to go into effect. Stay tuned.



The East Haddam Local Prevention Council (EHLPC) is an alliance of individuals and groups working together to create a strong, safe and substance free environment for East Haddam youth.

Building that healthy environment takes a collective voice from all parts of our community. We need the insights, skills, and participation of a wide range of local stakeholders to achieve our goals, and building community collaboration is integral to addressing our local needs. By developing opportunities and building positive relationships, we decrease the risk of youth drug and alcohol use.

The East Haddam Local Prevention Council is seeking representatives from our community to volunteer their time in the service of our youth.

What's Happening?

The Connection Between Stress and Substance Use

Mental health and substance use are often very closely related. People may turn to substances to help cope with a variety of mental health issues, and in turn, substance use can negatively impact a person's mental health. To be clear, this isn't only true of people with diagnosed mental illness. In fact, *stress* has been identified as one of the key risk factors increasing the likelihood of substance use initiation, maintenance and relapse.



We all experience stress. According to a 2017 survey by the American Psychological
Association, on a stress scale of 1 through 10, Americans average a 4.8. Nearly half of us
have laid awake in bed as a result of stress in the past month. A third of survey respondents reported feeling
anxious or jittery. Thirty-five percent reported feelings of anger or irritability as a result of stress. With the life
disrupting effects of the corona virus, it's likely that many of us have been even more stressed than usual.

Being that we can't entirely escape stress, how do we cope with it? According to the same APA survey, many of us have someone they could turn to for emotional support. About half the people surveyed used exercise as a means to deal with stress. An additional 12% used yoga or meditation. For many people it's getting lost in a hobby that helps them unwind. There are countless ways to address stress without turning to substances that might harm more than they help.

As a coalition, we continue to try to expand our wellness toolkit to ensure community members have the resources they need when they need them. If you haven't seen them yet, check out our Choose Wellness video series, or our pinpoint hiking trail map done in partnership with the East Haddam Conservation Commission. Both can be found on our social media and our website. These are great starting points to help begin better understanding stress and addressing it in a positive way.




Garden Club News

Tips for Enjoying Land Trust Trail Hikes

East Haddam Land Trust trails are great places for outdoor exercise or some interaction with nature. An hour-long walk surrounded by bird sounds and greenery is good for the soul. To enhance your immersion in the sights, sounds, and smells of nature follow these tips.

Clothing should include appropriate layers for the weather and footwear that provides good traction and protects your feet. Light colored clothing helps you see any ticks picked up along the way and tucking your pants into your socks protects legs from scratches and insect bites. Insect and tick repellents are useful during outdoor warm weather forays. Once returning home, always give yourself and children a full-body tick check.

Keep in mind that Mother Nature is fascinating, but not controllable.

With so many dead and dying trees in our area, non-windy days are best for hikes on wooded trails. Whether windy or not,

keep an eye out for dangling tree branches and other potential hazards. If you notice a safety issue such as a tree blocking a trail or a significant washout, contact: info@ehlt.org with the **preserve name** and **trail color** on which you noticed the issue.

If you encounter any of the larger mammals in our region, follow the Connecticut DEEP Wildlife Division's advice. Don't run, stand tall while backing away slowly, make lots of noise and respect that you are a visitor in their home territory.

Safeguard flora and fauna by staying on marked trails and removing your trash. Your footsteps may harm beneficial plants and wildlife living on the forest floor and creatures are often harmed when mistaking trash for food.

And remember, an hour-long walk surrounded by nature is good for the soul.

Harvest House is Ready

The goal of Harvest House has always been to create a sense of community for our patrons and for our sponsors. It is not always obvious when Harvest House is in operation. Everyone is so occupied with the activities of the day. But when Harvest House is closed, everyone feels the sense of loss. As the Harvest House Coordinator, I have received calls and texts from patrons and dinner sponsors saying how much they miss the program and they are awaiting the time when Harvest House reopens. When that signal is given, Harvest House will be ready to begin offering Sunday dinners. There are sponsors ready to offer dinners on Sundays through 2020. All of the sponsors have indicated that they are committed to preparing and serving a wonderful Sunday dinner. And we know that the sense of community will return as well as the delightful conversation.

Harvest House began as a community service project of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. But it has grown beyond that original mission and become a community wide service offering that involves 14 community groups and organizations as well as eight individuals and families. 
The present crisis will pass and when it is determined that the time to resume a more normal lifestyle can begin, Harvest House will be there.


