### MCCOOK POINT PARK, HOLE N' WALL, & CINI PARK

Open daily from 8:00 am to sunset

Pets are permitted on beaches from the Tuesday after Labor Day until the Friday before Memorial Day ONLY\*\*; must be under owners control at all times and it is the owner's responsibility to clean-up all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year.

Restrooms will remain open until mid-November as weather permits.

Contact the Parks and Recreation office for Pavilion reservations/availability.

Tobacco Free Parks

State Statute 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.

### ANY BEACH FACILITY / SEE BELOW REGULATION

State Regulation (Public Swimming Area Regulations) Section 19a-36-B61 (10) states domestic animals shall be prohibited in the water and the land immediately adjacent to the water of a public swimming area when the public swimming area is open for use.



### **BEACH/PARKING PASSES**

Parking permits will go on sale beginning April 3rd at the Parks & Recreation Office. Permits will be sold from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm throughout the season. From May 25 - June 29 the office will extend the office hours to 7:00 pm on Thursdays. To obtain a season permit, ALL applicants must present their valid car registration at time of purchase. If you are new to town, please bring your tax bill or lease to expedite the process. To avoid lines, you can mail in a copy of your registration, a copy of your latest tax bill (if vehicle is not registered to an East Lyme/Niantic address), the fee (checks payable to Town of East Lyme) and a self addressed envelope, and we will process your request and mail your beach pass to you.

As of Saturday, May 27 (Memorial Day Weekend) all vehicles must have a parking permit to enter the parks through September 4 (Labor Day). Park hours are 8:00 am to dusk. Lifeguards are on duty daily from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, beginning tentatively mid-June.

### PAVILION RENTAL

The pavilion is available for full day or half day rental (9:00 am to 1:00 pm or 1:30 pm until dusk) during the summer season (Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day) for East Lyme/ Niantic residents/taxpayers. Rentals are also available before Memorial Day and after Labor Day; Non-Residents are able to rent during that period. Please contact the Parks & Recreation office for information and availability.



Families who would like to explore the local area can choose from the Mashantucket Pequot Museum, the Mystic Aquarium, the Mystic Seaport or the Roger Williams Park Zoo in Providence, R.I. Lovers of the outdoors can also visit the Connecticut State Parks and Forests which also allow discounted admission and/or free parking.

Free Family Passes are available for seven different locations. Those nearby include the Custom House and Lyman Allyn in New London and The Florence Griswold in Old Lyme. For those hoping to explore more of Connecticut, The Wadsworth Atheneum in Hartford and the New Britain Museum of American Art won't disappoint. Whether your interests are Aquariums, Zoos, Art, Science or History, these museums are sure to instruct and delight.

The system for checking out passes is simple. One pass per family may be checked out a time. All passes are available on a first come, first served basis. Passes cover admission only; special programs/exhibits are extra.

Passes are checked out for two nights to borrowers 16 and older. There are neither renewals nor back-to-back checkouts of the same pass by the same family. For pass availability, call the Library a (860) 739-6926 and select#4 on the menu for the Circulation Desk. Participants do not have to be an East Lyme resident. They only need a valid CT library card.

### **East Lyme Veterans**

In October of 2013 the state of Connecticut established a Veterans Representative volunteer position in each town to help connect local vets to resources, services, organizations, and events. ### East Lyme Fire Marshal's & East Lyme 911 Center

For some residents your spring cleaning lists already include yard work and while there are restrictions on what items are acceptable, perhaps an Open Burn Permit can suit your needs. Visit the East Lyme Fire Marshal's Office to apply for an Open Burn Permit. Open Burning is limited to the burning of brush only, on residential property upon which the permittee resides and is subject to certain requirements such as Forest Fire Danger, Air Quality Index and wind speed. Burning must cease if so directed by any member of the Town Fire Marshal's Office, any Officer of the Fire Department or any Official of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection. Once you receive your Open Burning Permit, this permit must be available on site during the burn. Burning is allowed only between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm on a sunny or partly sunny day with the wind speed between five and fifteen miles per hour. Prior to burning, the permittee is required to contact the East Lyme Dispatch Center at 860-739-3419 to receive authorization that burning is allowed for the day.

The permittee is required to contact the East Lyme Dispatch Center upon completion of burning. If you're planning on having a recreational fire or a bonfire/campfire at your residence the East Lyme Fire Marshal's Office requests you contact the East Lyme Dispatch Center at 860-739-3419 and notify the dispatchers. A recreational fire is an outdoor fire, burning materials where the fuel being burned is not contained in an incinerator, outdoor fireplace, portable outdoor fireplace, barbeque grill or barbeque pit and has a total fuel area of 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height for pleasure, cooking warmth or similar purposes. Recreational fires shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material. Only seasoned dry firewood can be burned. Burning of yard waste, leaves, refuse, trash, building materials or other materials is expressly prohibited. A garden hose, fire extinguisher or other means of extinguishment must be readily available for immediate use. It is requested that the resident contact the East Lyme Dispatch Center upon completion of the fire. Stay up to date on upcoming storms and weather alerts by visiting www.ctalerts.gov. The CT Alert ENS (Emergency Notification System) uses the state's Enhanced 9-1-1 (E9-1-1) database for location-based notifications to the public for life-threatening emergencies. But the E9-1-1 database includes only traditional wire-line telephone numbers in the state (the "land line" phone you may have in your home). CT Alert ENS Citizen Sign-up Page Allows you to add other means of communication to the CT Alert ENS, in addition to your current home phone "land line" if you have one. Take a moment to visit www.ctalert.gov and sign up your mobile devices to receive the alerts.

It's almost spring and while we may still be shoveling out those last few inches of snow, it's time to make sure your homes and businesses are ready for the coming warmer months. Here are a few items that East Lyme Public Safety would like you to put on your spring cleaning lists. Many homes and businesses in town are equipped with Burglar and Fire Alarms and we would like to make sure your information is up to date with our Dispatch Center. If you're new to town and activated a home security system, if you've just installed a new alarm system or are a business owner in town with an alarm system in place we recommend that you update the Dispatch Center with current key holder and primary contact information. Key Holder refers to any person whose name appears on the alarm registration form as a key holder or is designated in writing by the alarm owner or user to respond to the premises of alarm activation when requested by the Police Department or Fire Department (e.g., Reset system, gain entry, etc.). The information you provide is kept on a secure server not connected to the internet and is housed at the Dispatch Center. You'll find a copy of the Alarm Registration Form in this issue that you can send into the Dispatch Center P.O. Box 519 Niantic, CT 06357 where our dispatchers will update your home or business address with the current information.

### **FEMA News for Residents**

The Town of East Lyme is a participant in the Federal Emergency Management Agency Community Rating System (CRS) program which entitles its residents to discounts on their flood insurance policies. The CRS program recognizes and encourages activities that reduce flood damage to existing buildings and protects new buildings beyond the minimum Nation Flood Insurance Program protection level. The Town of East Lyme currently provides property protection advice by providing individuals with information as to what they can do to protect their own properties from flood damage. Those who have a federally backed mortgage, or plan to refinance with a federally backed lender, are required to purchase flood insurance if their home is shown in a high-risk flood area, known as a Special Flood Hazard Area, on the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps. Residents are urged to contact their insurance agent or visit www.floodsmart.gov to learn more about how and where to get a policy. There are many ways to protect a property from flood damage, including but not limited to the following:

- Demolish the building or relocate it out of harm's way;
- Elevate the building above the flood level;
- Elevate damage-prone components, such as the furnace or air conditioning unit;
- Dry flood proof the building so water cannot get into it;
- Wet flood proof portions of the building so water won't cause damage;
- Construct a berm or redirect drainage away from the building;
- Maintain nearby streams, ditches, and storm drains so debris does not obstruct them; and
- Correct sewer backup problems.

There are several qualified people at the Town of East Lyme who can talk to you about flood hazard, flood protection measures, and/or possible financial assistance. For more information, please visit the town website at the following link:

### Harbingers of Spring ~ Tree Planting Time in East Lyme

In the middle of February, we long to see that first robin at McCook Park, the first pussy willow bud at the inner harbor walkway to Cini Park, and the first crocus peeking from the snow at the gardens at the Hole-in-the-Wall. Now, you can join those signs of spring.

The East Lyme Public Trust Foundation in co-operation with the East Lyme Parks and Recreation Department is again pleased to offer THE PROMISE of TOMORROW'S TREES - a project to raise funds for the support of the Niantic Bay Boardwalk and other projects of the Trust. This commemorative tree program makes available to the public, trees to be placed in public spaces in East Lyme.

In 2015, 8 trees were sponsored at McCook Park. In 2016, 5 dog-wood trees were sponsored at the Cliff Walk to McCook Point. In 2017, we are offering Phase III a walkway of trees along the chain-link fence at McCook Park on Columbus Ave. The trees, which will be located between the side gate and the railroad tracks, will be a flowering, low growing species chosen

by the Parks Department. Don't miss your chance to become part of beautifying this new location.

However, McCook Park is not the only public space where people can choose to plant trees. If you are a former athlete, parent, or grandparent, perhaps, you will wish to commemorate the many games you participated in or viewed at Bridebrook Park. If you have always entered the Boardwalk at Cini Park, perhaps, you will want to commemorate the pleasure of a walk by the Bay with a tree located in the Park. Members of the Smith-Harris House and the Samuel Smith House can commemorate the many volunteer hours they have spent at these historical homes with a tree on the grounds. Book lovers can commemorate the satisfaction they have received from the many services of the Library by planting a tree at the Library Courtyard, and employees and citizens of the town can choose a commemorative tree at Town Hall.

A contribution of \$600 for a tree will cover the cost of the tree, planting, an 8"x4" plaque, a base, and a water bag to assist in the stabilization of the tree. Planting will take place this spring-2017. Since the East Lyme Public Trust Foundation is a non-profit 401c, contributions are tax deductible.

June Hoye is the chairperson for the project in partnership with Dave Putnam, the Director of Parks and Recreation. Her committee includes Carol Marelli and Bill Rinowski-administration, and Pat and Jack Lewis, who assist in publicity.




