


# **East Lyme Bike & BBQ**

### **SATURDAY OCTOBER 1**

The East Lyme Bike & BBQ to benefit open spaces and historic places invites avid and recreational bike riders alike for a spectacular ride along a family friendly 9-mile historical house tour, 26 mile, 62 mile, 85 mile, or 100 mile course. The family friendly course will take you to 3 historical houses around East Lyme: the Smith-Harris House, the Thomas Lee House and the Samuel Smith House. Participants are welcome to stop at each house for a rest and tour of the property. For the other courses, there will be checkpoints along the rides for riders to use the restrooms or to refuel.

All rides disembark from the beautiful, coastal Rocky Neck State Park located in Niantic, CT just off of exit 72 on I-95. The courses will head north along the canopy covered roads of southeastern Connecticut and will exhibit some moderate to difficult hill climbs. All courses will circle back to Rocky Neck where a mouth-watering BBQ from Mago Point Smokehouse will be served to top off the day.

all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year.

Restrooms will remain open until mid-November as weather permits.



State Statute 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.

### \*\*NO PETS May 27 – Sept. 5, 2016 AT ANY BEACH FACILITY: SEE BELOW REGULATION

State Regulation (Public Swimming Area Regulations) Section 19a-36-B61 (10) states domestic animals shall be prohibited in the water and the land immediately adjacent to the water of a public swimming area when the public swimming area is open for use.

### **Beach/Parking Passes**

To obtain a season permit, ALL applicants must present their valid car registration at time of purchase. If you are new to town, please bring your tax bill or lease to expedite the process. To avoid lines, you can mail in a copy of your registration, a copy of your latest tax bill (if vehicle is not registered to an East Lyme/Niantic address), the fee (checks payable to Town of East Lyme) and a self-addressed envelope, and we

will process your request and mail your beach pass to you.

All vehicles must have a parking permit to enter the parks through September 5 (Labor Day). Park hours are 8:00 am to dusk. Lifeguards are on duty daily from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, through mid-August.

### Pavilion/Tent Rental

The pavilion/tent is available for full day or half day rental (9:00 am to 1:00 pm or 1:30 pm until dusk) during the summer season (Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day) for East Lyme/Niantic residents/taxpayers. Rentals are also available before Memorial Day and after Labor Day; Non-Residents are able to rent during that period. Please contact the Parks & Recreation office for information and availability.

# **Public Safety**

You're going about your daily routine and then it happens. You witness an accident or a loved one is having a medical emergency and you have to call 911. Some of you may have dialed 911 in the past and for some this may be your first time. Here are some things you can expect to occur and be asked by your 911 Dispatcher.

Your call comes into our Dispatch Center and the Dispatcher's first question will be "Where is your emergency?" It's important to tell the dispatcher the address of where you're located. If you call from a fixed home or business phone, your address will be displayed to the dispatcher but you'll still be asked to confirm. If you use your cellular phone, GPS coordinates and a general location on a map is displayed to the dispatcher. If you are unsure of where you are, describe your surroundings to the dispatcher, the road you're on, landmarks you're near or the closest house number. The dispatcher will then ask for your name and the phone number you're calling from. This information is important so if the line gets disconnected the dispatcher can call you back. The dispatcher will ask you "What is the nature of your emergency?" This is where you will tell the dispatcher why you've dialed 911. With those simple questions the 911 Dispatcher will then determine what services your emergency requires and start help your way.

Even if the dispatcher has already started services to your location, stay on the line. The dispatcher will ask you a set of secondary questions depending on the nature of your emergency and update responding units with the information you provide. If you or a loved one is having a medical emergency you can expect to be asked questions like "are you having difficulty breathing?" or if you're a fall victim "did they lose consciousness?" "is there any bleeding?" and "is the bleeding controlled at this time?" If you're calling 911 to report a fire the dispatcher will ask "What is on fire?" "Is anyone in the building?" and "Is anyone trapped?" You may be asked to safely evacuate and keep others away from the fire. If you're calling to report a motor vehicle accident you'll be asked questions such as "Is there anyone trapped in the vehicle?" or "is the vehicle on fire?"

When you call 911 for a police matter, the 911 dispatcher will ask you similar questions, "Where are you?" "What is your name?" and "What is the nature of the emergency?" Since the Town of East Lyme is a Resident Trooper town, the Connecticut State Police dispatch East Lyme Officers. Your 911 call will be transferred to the Connecticut State Police Troop E in Montville and you will speak directly with a State Police Dispatcher.

That dispatcher will ask you the same series of questions as your local dispatcher but will follow those up with secondary questions pertinent to your specific emergency.

The Dispatch Center has many tools to assist you in your emergency. Using your cellular phone to dial 911 can get tricky and you may talk to another Dispatch Center before being transferred to East Lyme depending on where in town you are and what cellular phone tower your phone pings off of. If you're down near the shoreline your signal might hit towers that will direct your call to either Old Lyme, Montauk, NY or Waterford. If you're travelling on the highway your signal might hit towers that will send your call to Old Lyme, Waterford or the Connecticut State Police. Dispatchers in those respective towns will determine where your emergency is and transfer you to the correct Dispatch Center.

Even if you don't think your call is an emergency, we advise you to dial 911 so the dispatcher can determine what services you may need. Dispatchers are on duty 24 hours a day and 365 days a year.

Stonington Borough, which contains Stonington Point, was established in 1801, but has played a part of New England's rich history since the 1600's. You can find beautiful architecture along its main road, Water Street, or take a trip into history at the Old Lighthouse Museum or the Captain Palmer House. But for the local diving community, Stonington Point's allure lies beneath its waters.

On any given day, you might find students from Seaview Scuba Dive Center who are embarking on their first journey into the underwater world. You will also find old salts who've been diving the world's oceans for decades but choose to come

back and call Stonington Point home. Due to its use as a maritime port, divers might find, with a little patience and a good eye, artifacts from a bygone day such as clay pipes, gold watches, lanterns, Civil War era bullets, and more. For those who enjoy watching the sea critters, the area boasts a wide variety of fish and invertebrates (such as crabs and lobsters). On daytime dives, you'll run into the usual suspects: Cunner, Scup, Spider Crabs, Fluke, and Flouder. If you decide to brave the dark and go for a night dive, you'll find the area awash with too many critters to count including the prehistoric looking Horseshoe crab and the color shifting squid. Towards the end

of the summer, you might also see some juvenile tropicals that were swept north in the Gulf Stream. Local divers can be found year-round, even though winter temps can reach below 30 degrees Fahrenheit and summer temps only reach the high 70s. Stonington Point has a little something for everyone, and it's made evidently clear in the summer months when the parking lot of full of divers of all experience levels and interests. ### **East Lyme Swim Lessons Program**



### The Samuel Smith House and Farmstead

The Samuel Smith Farmstead on 82 Plants Dam Road has been a busy place from early spring through the summer months. Land has been cleared of wire and debris, trees have been trimmed, wiring has been updated, and stonework and chimney work have been completed. The Rotary Club's Community Garden Project has been thriving and provided vegetables for the area soup kitchens.

There are still garden plots available to reserve for next year. The fee is \$30 for the season. There is an automatic sprinkling system to make tending the plot much easier.

The Archeologist's Research of a year ago is now going to be extended. The results of the earlier digging shed a great deal of light on the 1700's time. In June, the town of East Lyme received confirmation of the funding of Phase II Archeological Survey ad Architectural Research project for the Samuel Smith House and Property. Funding will come from the Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation for \$9650 with a 100% match from the State Historic Preservation Office of Federal CLG program. This will continue the investigative work begun last year by the Public

Archeological Survey Team to further detail this house and property with construction dating from 1685-1800.

On October 1, East Lyme Park and Recreation as well as the three historic houses in town will host their first East Lyme Bike and Barbeque to raise needed funds for the houses. See information on the Town of East Lyme web site. During the bike ride, the houses will be open and will serve as rest stops for the riders.



- Leaves can be brought to the designated area at the transfer station free of charge; however, plastic bags must be emptied at the site.


