## **Town Clerk's Office**

November 8, 2016 will be a historical election for President of the United States. Applications requesting an absentee ballot can be obtained from the Town Clerk's Office or online at www.sots. ct.gov (elections & voting, voter resources, absentee ballot and procedures, application for ballot). Absentee ballots will be mailed out as follows:

- August 10, 2016 for US citizens serving in the military
- September 24, 2016 for US citizens traveling or living outside of the United States

• October 7, 2016 for US citizens requesting a ballot and who cannot vote in person on the day of the election

Please remind students attending college out-of-state to request their ballot so that they can vote at this very important election.

The ballot will also contain five (5) local questions concerning proposed changes to the town's charter. The full text of the changes can be viewed at www.easthamptonct.gov under the Charter Revision Commission's page.

## **Youth & Family Services**

East Hampton Youth and Family Services, located at 240 Middletown Avenue, is focused on providing quality services to our local youth and their families. Services include individual therapy, couples therapy, family therapy and crisis intervention. All services are provided at no cost for town residents. We are currently accepting new clients, and

have both weekday and weekend appointments available. In addition, prevention programming is coordinated with town departments and community based groups. The goal of each of these programs is to help young people foster healthy and positive habits while reducing high-risk behaviors. These programs capitalize on strengths, build character,

## **Assessor's Office**

As the fall approaches it is once again time for the assessment office to begin the annual process of developing the Grand List. The Grand List is the compilation of all taxable and tax exempt property - Real Property, Personal Property and Motor Vehicle. The Grand List is used in determining the mill rate once the budget has been approved.

**REAL PROPERTY:** The Town of East Hampton, pursuant to Section 12-62 of the General Statutes, conducted a revaluation for the Grand List of October 1, 2015. Those values will remain in effect until the next revaluation. Revaluation is every five (5) years. The town continues to experience growth from new construction and our office works closely with the building department in permit tracking. To accomplish this task we are working to stream line the data sharing by utilizing applications unique to our needs.

**PERSONAL PROPERTY:** Connecticut General Statues requires all persons liable to pay taxes on Personal Property to file a list of such property with the Assessment Office no later than November 1, 2016. Personal Property subject to taxation includes: Property used in the operation of any business such as machinery and equipment, commercial furniture and fixtures, leasehold improvements, computer equipment, vending machines, supplies, unregistered vehicles, farm tools and machinery, mechanics tools, and all other tangible property located or otherwise situated within the municipal boundaries of the Town of East Hampton as of October 1, 2016.

MOTOR VEHICLE: Information on registered motor vehicles taxable to the town is provided twice a year directly from the Department of Motor Vehicles. This includes pertinent vehicle information extracted from active DMV records, after pricing in accordance with the CT Legislature selection of NADA clean retail. The assessment office only values a small fraction of the cars, and must use the same NADA values of clean retail. Registered and non-registered vehicles and equipment are valued using various sources and will be reviewed each year. Commercial type vehicles are annually reviewed.

## What Can You Do To Help Clean Up Lake Pocotopaug?

What you do in your own back yard can impact the entire watershed, including the health of Lake Pocotopaug.

If your home has a roof, a lawn, or a driveway, chances are your property creates storm water runoff. Property owners can play a role in improving water quality by soaking up storm water runoff to prevent it from reaching nearby lakes, streams, and other waters.

#### SOME EASY, IMPORTANT STEPS YOU CAN TAKE:

Soak up rain at its source. Rain that falls on your roof, driveway, and other hard surfaces flows into storm drains and then into Lake Pocotopaug, picking up contaminants along the way. If rain soaks directly into the ground, the soil absorbs the contaminants, keeping them out of the lake.

## WAYS TO REDUCE RUNOFF:

- Reduce impermeable surfaces
- Rainwater is a resource: Cut down on your water use by

capturing and using rainwater in the garden by redirecting your gutter downspouts into rain barrels

- Install a rain garden and plant bare areas in your yard with natural vegetation
- Create a buffer garden of natural vegetation along the lakeshore. Buffer gardens slow the flow of water from your lawn into the lake and will absorb nutrients and fertilizers before they can enter the lake
- If you must fertilize, do so very sparingly. Fertilizer makes your lawn green, and it makes the lake green! Use low phosphate, slow release nitrogen fertilizer on vegetated areas only
- Maintain a natural lake shoreline. Clearing trees, erecting walls, and dumping sand can disturb the ecosystem and negatively affect lake health
- Never dump anything into storm drains. Storm drains flow directly into Lake Pocotopaug.

## **Finance**

## **East Hampton Receives Bond Rating Upgrade**

As part of the process required to issue bonds the Town had to go through a credit rating. The Town received the news that they were upgraded to 'AAA' from 'AA+' in December by Standard & Poor's Rating Services (S&P). S&P noted in its rationale that the upgrade reflects the town's record of general fund surpluses that S&P believes demonstrates financial stability and supports its view of strong management. S&P also noted the long term rating reflected its assessment of the town's:

Very strong economy, with access to a broad and diverse metropolitan statistical area (MSA);

Strong management, with "good" financial policies and practices under their financial management assessment (FMA) methodology;

Strong budgetary performance, with balanced operating results in the general fund but an operating surplus at the total governmental fund level in fiscal 2014;

Strong budgetary flexibility, with an available fund balance in fiscal 2014 at 11.3% of operating expenditures; Very strong liquidity, with total government available cash

at 18.0% of total governmental fund expenditures and 7.7x governmental debt service, as well as access to external liquidity they consider strong;

Strong debt and contingent liability position, with debt service carrying charges at 2.3% of expenditures and net direct debt at 68.0% of total governmental fund revenue, as well as low overall net debt at less than 3% of market value; and Very strong institutional framework score for Connecticut municipalities.

Town officials [explained][I think this is the wrong verb] the 'AAA' rating to a high credit score. A higher bond rating results in more interest from prospective investors and results in lower interest rates paid on the debt. Over time, the savings from lower interest rates could equate to hundreds of thousands of dollars.

As of June 30, 2016 the Town had \$27,715,000 of long-term debt outstanding or \$2,132 per capita. The average for all Connecticut municipalities as of June 30, 2014 (latest data available) was \$2,324.

## ATTENTION OLDER ADULTS **ON MEDICARE:**

Medicare's Annual Enrollment period is October 15, 2016 through December 7, 2016. It is important for all Medicare recipients to check their plans to make sure that they will be enrolled in the plan that will work best for them. For most people this is the ONLY time during the year that you can change your plan.

If you have Medicare D plan it is very important that you use the Medicare Plan Finder on Medicare.gov. Just enter your prescription medications into the plan finder and then you will be able to compare the different plans and select the one that will cost you the least amount of money for the year. The insurance

companies often change their formularies (what medications they cover) and the tiers (level of coverage) each year. You may find that a medication that was covered this year will not be covered next year or you may have to pay a lot more for it. The cost for the plans are driven by the prescription medications you take. A husband and wife may have to be on different plans if they want the lowest cost of prescriptions.

If you have a Medicare Advantage plan it is important that you check out the changes for the next year. Or, if you are not happy with the plan, the Annual Enrollment time is when you are allowed to make a change.

If you would like help with checking your

Medicare plans please make an appointment with a Choices Counselor through the East Hampton Senior Center at 860-267-4426. This is a FREE service to anyone in the community on Medicare. You do not have to be 65. The Choices Counselors are trained to provide you with a comprehensive understanding of the Medicare options, so you can make informed decisions regarding your healthcare.

The State of Connecticut offers some additional help for people with low incomes. Your eligibility could also be checked by making an appointment with a counselor. This can be done ANY time during the year, not only during Annual Enrollment.

## **Rep. Ziobron - Funds to Benefit Seized Animals**

East Hampton – State Representative Melissa Ziobron presented a check in the amount of \$16,151.68 to CT Department of Agriculture (DOA) Commissioner Steven K. Reviczky. Rep. Ziobron organized efforts to raise money for an animal cruelty incident in East Hampton which occurred in February of this year.

Inspectors from the DOA seized several horses, chickens, dogs and a number of rabbits from a farm in East Hampton. The animals were then taken to Second Chance, a large animal rehabilitation center located at York Correctional Facility in Niantic.

"I would like to thank everyone who donated to this special fund," said Rep. Ziobron. "I first organized a 'gofundme' account because animal abuse is simply deplorable, and knowing that our state is in a financial crisis, I didn't feel that Connecticut's taxpayers should bear the entire burden. Since this account was established, I have been extremely moved and inspired by the overwhelming support of so many people. I would also like to thank the Department of Agriculture for their efforts in helping to remove and rehabilitate abused and neglected animals. Thank you all for donating, including the Nathan Hale Ray chapter of Future Farmers of America (FFA) and special friends in Tennessee."

Animals placed in the care and custody of the DOA through investigations by the agency's Animal Control Officers are housed at the department's Second Chance large animal rehabilitation facility in Niantic, CT. Care of the animals at the Niantic facility is



partly paid by donations to the State Animal Abuse Cost Recovery Account, and donations are greatly appreciated.

All of the horses from the DOA's large animal rehabilitation center at the York Correctional Center in Niantic were later auctioned off. Two of the horses seized in February are now being used in an equine therapy program at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center to assist veterans recovering from PTSD.


## **Planning and Zoning Department**

On June 1st, the Planning and Zoning Commission adopted the East Hampton Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD). This document is intended to guide the development patterns and conservation efforts of the town over the next ten years. All Connecticut municipalities are required to update their plan every ten years. Having an updated plan not only allows the towns to guide development and better protect resources, but also allows us to access grant money from various State agencies. In these tough fiscal times, these grants can be invaluable.

The East Hampton Plan of Conservation and Development has been a living document, with minor updates occurring every few years since its last major revision and

adoption in 2006. A focal point of the 2016 POCD is the protection and preservation of Lake Pocotopaug. Much of the watershed is heavily developed and cleaning up stormwater runoff has been a focal point for the town in recent years. In the coming years, the Land Use Commissions (Planning and Zoning, Inland Wetlands, Conservation/Lake) will work to better protect the Lake with new and innovative strategies to clean stormwater before it enters the lake, in addition to guiding greener development. These efforts will aim to reduce the impacts of development without impeding progress.

In addition, the POCD discusses strategies to enhance the economy, provide new and diverse housing options



for all of East Hampton's residents, and enhances the transportation network.

The permitting process helps to protect you and your family, as well as the public, by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction. It also helps protect the value of your investment. The Building Department begins with a review of your scope of work for code compliance and then follows up with inspections

to ensure that code requirements are met. Upon final approval,

a completion document is issued for the project.

Work done without permits and required inspections will impact your ability to insure and finance your home. Unpermitted work devalues your investment, and in many cases, stops the sale of a home. Many banks are now refusing to lend money for new

mortgages or refinancing, and insurance companies are refusing to insure, where improvement projects have been completed without the required permits and inspections. Building Departments often see homeowners come in at the last minute and try to legalize the projects for unpermitted work. This process is very time consuming and adds cost to a project for the homeowner.

A number of factors influence the cost of a homeowner's insurance policy. One of the main influences is the age of your home. An example would be an older roof, which would increase the risk for a water leak and claim. If you replace your roof and follow the permit process, you can notify your insurance company of your new permitted and approved roof. This will lower the risk of a claim which equals savings in insurance costs.

In addition, the money spent on obtaining a building permit will be one of your most valuable investments in your property. A loss or accident involving an unpermitted project may not be covered by your insurance company, which could result in costly additional expenses.

The Building Department is here to assist you in the permitting process. The expert oversight by the Building Department

## **Public Works**

Since our last snow event on April 4, 2016, a great deal has been happening at the East Hampton Public Works Department. Work has begun restoring our truck storage building that was severely damaged by a fire on that same day; along with the replacement of the destroyed plow truck, and repair of another truck parked near the fire. The cause was determined to be wire chaffing. Along with the operation of the Town's Transfer Station, routine road maintenance is ongoing with the following being completed presently: road sweeping of approximately 164 lane miles, stop bar and crosswalk line painting, spring and late summer roadside mowing, and mowing and cleaning Town-owned cemeteries. Centerline painting is scheduled for Sentember/October this year. A contractor was

uled for September/October this year. A contractor was brought in to clean 500 catch basins and Town crews accomplished the balance. Another contractor removed approximately 25 dead or dangerous trees in the Town's right-of-way. The crew does road patching and repair, curb repair on an ongoing basis, and has replaced or repaired several dozen catch basins in various areas. Depot Hill and part of Lake Drive are being refurbished by an outside contractor. The Village Center and other areas were cleaned, mowed, and swept for Old Home Days and High



School graduation. The Department assists other Town departments with facilities issues. Future work being done under the direction of our director is to repair and paint at the Community Center and Fire Companies #1 and #2. Sidewalks are being replaced/repaired in several areas. Recently Park and Recreation's annual Touch a Truck at Sears Park featured several pieces of our equipment. Fall activities include leaf pickup from Town properties and all vehicles and equipment are being readied for the coming fall and winter season.

#### WASTEWATER

The Town of East Hampton's WPCA, through the Colchester-East Hampton Joint Facilities, is directly responsible for over 34 miles of collection system and over 20 lift stations in East Hampton.

The East Hampton WPCA operating budget ending June 30, 2016 was \$1,186,974.00, which included payment of \$817,931.00 to the Colchester-East Hampton Joint Facilities for treatment and operation of the wastewater system. There are over 2,695 properties connected to the wastewater system in East Hampton State regulations that established the WPCA require that the

Authority operate as an "Enterprise Fund" i.e., all fees paid by the users of the system must be used for the operations and maintenance of the wastewater system. There is no Town tax revenue used for the operations or maintenance of the wastewater system. In East Hampton the users pay \$345.00 per EDU for the annual use of the system. Those users with a Town maintained grinder pump pay an additional \$125.00 per year. Based upon 2011 sewer rate information published by Tighe & Bond Engineers, East Hampton's use rate is one of the lowest of the 17 towns surveyed.

#### WATER

The Town owns and, through the WPCA, operates the Town Center Water System (TCWS) and the Royal Oaks Water System (ROWS). The WPCA, through contract services with State-certified water treatment and distribution operators, is responsible for the day-to-day operations of both of these systems. A Special Revenue Fund presently exists for the water budget for the operation and maintenance of these water systems. The operating budget for both systems totaled \$122,415.00, the monthly meter charge is \$46.00, and the commodity charge is \$5.58/ 1000 gallons used. 2015 was the first year that the water systems were self-sufficient.

## Office of the Collector of Revenue aka "The Tax Office"



Greetings from the ladies of the Collector of Revenue Office: Nancy, Mel and Lisa. We are three hard working women who have the task of collecting taxes to enable the Town to function. Without taxes, we would have no Town Hall, no schools, totally unmaintained and plowed roads, no sewers, no protection from our Police

Department, and no other services provided by the Town.

While no one enjoys paying taxes, it is the responsibility of each and every one of us to do so to keep the Town alive. It is a difficult job but we try to do it with a smile, compassion, equity and fairness to all.

The Office collects real estate, motor vehicle, personal property and supplemental motor vehicle taxes and also, sewer use fees. We have over 13,000 people in Town and during this last billing cycle, sent out bills for over 20,780 accounts. We have been sending out two or three part bills for over four years now to cut down costs in sending out second and third mailings. We also have online payments which many taxpayers have taken advantage of. While there are fees associated with using the online payment option,

those fees do not come to the Town but rather to the service provider. It also cuts down on the lines of taxpayers who do come in to pay in person.

While we enjoy the social interaction with each and every one of you, we encourage you to use the online service, mail your bill, or drop it in the brass slot on the left hand side of the front door. The envelopes go into a secure locked box which is checked every morning.

Connecticut DMV's conversion to a new system has created much frustration for Tax Collectors as well as the taxpayers. They say change is good. Let's hope all the quirks and stumbling blocks get smoothed out soon so we can experience positive change. We are always open to suggestions and creative influence to help us keep East Hampton the wonderful town it is.




