First Selectman's Corner

Our capital projects continue to move forward. Any visit to Moodus is incomplete without stopping to see what has changed at the Old Middle School site. The outer shell is now complete. Landscaping is under way and the interior is roughed in. Work is scheduled to be completed during January and we'll be moving in mid-February. The renovations at the Company #1 and #2 firehouses are progressing rapidly. Company #2 firehouse will be enlarged by two bays to allow for safe and protected storage of all of our equipment. Company #1



firehouse will see its interior brought up-to-date. Both will have exhaust filtering systems installed to protect people and equipment from dangerous diesel fumes. In the end our emergency services will be better prepared to safely serve our community in times of need. Our Town Wide Radio System project is moving closer to a final design.

The 9th of September was a very special day for both East Haddam and one of our leading businesses, Shagbark Lumber and Farm Supplies. If you had looked behind Shagbark's barns a few years ago you would have seen grazing animals or a crop of hay. Today you see solar panels almost without end. On September 9th we joined together with 750 of our neighbors to celebrate the dedication of that system - a system which will provide 100% of its power for use by our schools. Green power provided at a reduced cost is anticipated to save our schools over three quarters of a million dollars in the years to come. Getting to this point wasn't easy. Many challenges appeared during the two years it took to design and build the

system. In the end all of the challenges were overcome. The beauty is that the power is green, you'll find no carbon footprint here. Students will have the inspiration of knowing that their schools are powered from a nonpolluting electrical source, and that this



will continue for generations to come and continue to inspire others who follow them. Later on that same day, September 9th, we gathered at the First Church Cemetery to celebrate the life of Venture Smith. Venture was born in Guinea, West Africa. At the age of seven he was captured and sold into slavery, for "4 gallons of rum." He was eventually transported to Fishers Island, NY, grew up as a slave, married and was then relocated to Stonington Point, CT where in 1765 was able to purchase his freedom. He then lived and worked on Long Island, NY to raise the money to purchase his wife and children's freedom. In 1774 he moved with his family to East Haddam, CT. Over time his farm here grew to 134 acres with three houses, twenty boats, two fishing businesses and a commercial orchard. His ventures included river trafficking, lumberjacking, carpentry and farming. All

this without the ability to either read or write. When you consider the circumstances life confronted him with, you can only imagine what a remarkable person he was, a man of exceptional intelligence strength and courage. An inspiration for us all.

On September 13th, 15th and 16th we celebrated the life of Captain George Comer. Between 1876 and 1919 he spent well over half his life at sea. As a self-taught ornithologist and anthropologist he took advantage of his journeys to collect information and specimens of every description for numerous institutions and museums. These included the Peabody, the American Museum of Natural History, the University of Pennsylvania and many others. A memorial in his memory was erected in 1938 on land donated to the state of Connecticut by his family. The monument is located on Mount Parnassus Road adjacent to the Harris Homestead and our community garden. In September we rededicated that memorial starting with presentations on the 13th and finally with a re-dedication of his memorial on the 16th. On September 13th Fred Calabretta, Curator of Collections and Oral Histories at Mystic Seaport, spoke of the life and adventures of Captain George Comer. He described the captain's trips to Antarctica, Hudson's Bay, Greenland and back to East Haddam. Bernadette Dean, Inuit and cultural advisor about Inuit and Arctic history, as well as a descendant of an Inuit family who became close to Captain Comer during his visits to Hudson's Bay, shared her knowledge on Friday the 15th as did Bernadette Driscoll Engelstad, Curator, researcher and writer on Inuit art and material culture at the Smithsonian Institute. She shared her insight into Captain Comer's contributions and his importance

in preserving the historical record of the Inuit people. On September 16th the Memorial located on Mt Parnassus Road was rededicated to the memory of Captain Comer in a moving and well attended ceremony.

I want to welcome Susan Waide as our new Economic Development Coordinator. Susan will serve as a liaison between established and new businesses and East Haddam departments and commissions as well as regional agencies. Susan comes with over 25 years of experience in economic development and marketing and has been a resident of East Haddam for over 20





Board and Commission Vacancies

Once established this committee should complete its task within 120 days.

Residents must be East Haddam/Moodus registered voters to apply. For an application or more information regarding any of the vacancies, please contact the Selectmen's Office at 860-873-5021. Together we will keep East Haddam "A nice place to visit, and a better place to live."

From the Assessor

New property values for the October 1, 2017 revaluation will be sent out mid-November. The information will also be available online. Vision Government Solutions will hold informal hearings in December for those who wish to meet to discuss their new assessment. The 2017 grand list will be finalized by January 31, 2018 and the Board of Assessment Appeals will hold its hearings in March 2018. Applications to appeal to the Board are due in the Assessor's Office by February 20th, 2018.

The Assessor's office has its own web page on the town website (easthaddam.org).

Included is information on real estate, personal property, and motor vehicle assessments; property tax relief for seniors, veterans, and the disabled; renters' rebate; information on revaluation; access to applications and forms pertaining to the Assessor's Office.



Explore Local Forests, Join a Land Trust Woodswalk

Enjoy the trails through East Haddam Land Trust (EHLT) preserves during autumn and winter when leaves and temperatures have dropped offering wider open views of our New England landscape and allow for invigorating, brisk hikes.

Woods are beautiful during this time of year, with mostly bare trees standing tall against deep blue skies. Young beech trees, which often hold their dead leaves during winter, glow in golden hues when morning and evening sunlight reflects off the leaves. The gray tones of the many stone walls running through the woods - often marking sheep grazing pastures of old farms - contrast beautifully with the mosses and native evergreen ferns growing at the base of the walls.

Explore EHLT preserves by following the colored trail markers posted along each trail. Our handy and informative preserve maps, downloadable from the preserve pages at www.ehlt.org, provide directions to, information about, and trail lengths for each preserve. Hard copies of these maps are also available at the Town Office building, Ballek's Garden Center, Staehly's Farm, and Nathan Hale Pharmacy.

Join an EHLT Woodswalk on Land Trust preserves and elsewhere from 1:00 – 3:00 pm on the last Sunday of November and January 11/26 and 1/28. EHLT's ever-popular New Year's Day Hike runs from 1:00 – 3:00 pm on January 1. Hike locations are updated at www.ehlt.org and on Facebook.

EHLT preserves are marked by brown signs with gold lettering, in contrast to East Haddam Open Space parcels denoted by blue signs. Hunting is not permitted on EHLT preserves. Still, it's prudent to wear orange when near wooded areas during hunting season.

During hikes, look for mature trees with trunk diameters larger than others of their species. Your find could be one of East Haddam's largest - see EHLT's Big Trees Project at www.ehlt.org.

EHAA Ambulance



The past few months have been busy for EHAA Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) and Emergency Medical Responders (EMRs) with ongoing education, training, and community events. EHAA has a few members currently enrolled in an EMT Course. Students are learning about patient assessment, cardiac arrest management, airway management, patient immobilization, diabetic emergencies, respiratory emergencies and trauma. Just recently, two members passed their EMT Certification testing and will now ride as a 4th on ambulance calls until they reach required benchmarks and become full crew members.

In early September, EHAA members participated in a Homeland Security Active Shooter drill in Haddam. EHAA worked with surrounding towns during this exercise.

A few EHAA members attended a statewide forum examining the opioid overdose epidemic and ways to combat the crisis at UConn Health on September 20th. The event, co-hosted by UConn Health and Connecticut's Department of Public Health's Office of Emergency Medical Services, discussed how to curb the growing epidemic and its complexities, the rise in use of the dangerous synthetic opioid called fentanyl, and the drastic increase in overdose deaths in Connecticut.

Beginning October 1st, New Car Seat Laws become effective.

Children must remain rear facing: Until they are age 2 and until they weigh 30 lbs. Children must be in a 5 point harness: Until they are age 5 and until they weigh 30 lbs.

Children must use a booster seat: Until they are age 8 and until they weigh 60 lbs.



There will be a Municipal Election on November 7, 2017, 6:00 am to 8:00 pm at the Nathan Hale-Ray High School gymnasium on School Drive in Moodus. We will be voting for First Selectman, Selectman, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector; for members to serve on the Board of Finance, Board of Education, Board of Assessment Appeals, Planning and Zoning Commission (Regular and Alternate), and for Library Trustees. We always need people to work at the polls. If you are interested please call our office at (860) 873-5029.

How to Register to Vote for the November 7, 2017 election (must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18):

"Whenever the sidewalk, or any part thereof, adjoining or fronting any building lot of land or any street, square or public place in the Town of East Haddam, shall have upon it an accumulation of snow, sleet or ice, it shall be the duty of the owner, occupant or any person having the case of such building or lot, to cause such sidewalks to be made safe and convenient by removing the snow, sleet or ice therefrom, or by covering the same with sand or some other suitable substance, and in case such owner, occupant or other person having the care of such building or lot shall neglect to do so for the space of eight (8) hours during the daytime, the person whose legal duty it shall be to clear the sidewalk, and so neglecting, shall be fined not more than twenty five (\$25.00) dollars for each occurrence, and every hour of neglect to make the sidewalks safe in accordance with the provisions of this section, after notice from the First Selectman or his designee, shall constitute a separate offense."



Piles are located at the corner of Haywardville and Early Roads, and at the Town Garage, off Mt. Parnassus Road near Shagbark. For safety reasons, residents should not obtain sand during storm conditions when operators are loading trucks and entering and leaving the site.

It is understood that sand is provided for private, personal use and is not to be used commercially or for profit, or for any application other than as a safety precaution. Residents needing more than a few buckets of sand per winter should purchase their own supply.

The East Haddam Elementary School community had an excellent start to this school year. Over the summer, the building was accessible for painting, cleaning, reorganizing, and designing classroom spaces for our young students. These improvements enhance the beauty of the school's renovations and they are noticeable everywhere. It was a pleasure to welcome students and families to start school this fall.

The elementary school hosted their annual *Meet and Greet* afternoon and Open House evenings for all students and their families. The PTO Executive Board and volunteers worked alongside staff during the first couple weeks of school to assist kindergartners adjust to their morning arrivals, lunchtimes, and dismissals. It is also a pleasure to welcome all returning staff along with Mrs. Daphne Miller leading our new STEM program, Mrs. Lisa Cahill joining our third grade team, and Ms. Allison Rainwater, as our school's new music specialist.

In addition to all that our school offers our students and families, our World Language program is now in its second year of implementation. Señorita Kristen Krause has tailored instruction to enhance last year's language acquisition skills for our first, second and third graders. All preschool through third graders learn to speak Spanish through games, chants, poems, songs, and handson activities. Students also create stories and learn to listen and comprehend children's literature in Spanish.

Furthermore, we are excited to offer to our elementary school students a new Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Lab this year. The extensive possibilities for innovative, student-centered lessons and creative programming focus on technology, engineering and math concepts in conjunction with earth, space, physical, and life sciences. Students utilize the Engineering Design Process while engaging cooperatively in hands-on, inquiry-based learning. The Engineering Design Process is a series of steps that engineers follow as they solve problems and design solutions. This approach to problem solving in weekly classes will encourage our young scientists and engineers to collaborate, explore, design, test, redesign and test again.

Our new STEM Lab is designed to enhance, support and extend our math, science, and literacy curriculum. Students actively engage in activities that support the Standards for Mathematical Practices, as well as the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). These standards encourage students to approach real-world phenomenon, like scientists, and to reason and critique using evidence, while thinking mathematically and engaging in engineering design. The students' work in problem-solving deepens their understanding of the content presented across the math, science, technology, and literacy curriculum. As the program grows, enhancements will include cross-disciplinary connections with the arts as students learn by designing, experimenting, and discovering in the science, technology, engineering, *arts*, and mathematics STE**A**M Lab. The start of this school year welcomed a new program to the Middle School. The program is known as STEAM. Steam consists of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics. In STEAM, students work collaboratively to solve real word problems by planning and building solutions. Once the written plan (created on the back of recycled engineering blueprints) is logical and mathematically correct, students devise ways to use purposely limited materials to build their solutions according to their plan.

STEAM class is a great example of project based learning. Students are following the engineering design model in STEAM. They start by asking questions about the challenge, imagining multiple solutions and collaborating with their team. Students need to work together to plan out and create their solutions. Solutions to problems rarely occur on the first try and that is why improving the solution or altering the plan is one of the most important steps in the STEAM class.

Rep. Ziobron Announces New East Haddam Swing Bridge Schedule



I wanted to take an opportunity to share some exciting news with you! The United States Coast Guard has released a final ruling regarding the East Haddam Swing Bridge establishing a new draw schedule. I want to thank the USCG, the CT DOT, Congressman Joe Courtney and all other parties involved for their effort. I am proud that my constant effort on this issue has paid off. We have had several meetings, which culminated with a stakeholder meeting of the East Haddam and Haddam First Selectmen, Coast Guard staff, CT DOT engineers, and local businesses last summer. It is my pleasure to share this with you as it will make our historic Swing Bridge less chaotic.

According to the report published in the Federal Register by the USCG, CT DOT submitted a request to reduce scheduled openings of the span for recreational vessels during the boating season and to allow the bridge owner to require six hours' notice for bridge openings at night during the winter season. This change to the regulations will better serve the needs of the community while still continuing to satisfy the reasonable needs of navigation.

The draw of the Bridge shall operate as follows:

From May 1 through October 31: The draw shall open on signal for commercial vessels. For recreational vessels, the draw shall open on signal, except that from 6 am to 8 pm, the draw need open for recreational vessels on the hour only.

From November 1 through April 30: The draw shall open on signal for all vessels, except that from 8 pm to 4 am, the draw shall open on signal if at least six-hours' notice is given by calling the number posted at the bridge.



White House Drug Policy Office Awards Drug Free Communities Grant to Local Coalition to Prevent Youth Substance Use in East Haddam/Moodus

We are very happy to announce that the East Haddam Local Prevention Council is one of 791 coalitions, nationwide, to be awarded a Drug Free Communities grant to support the work of preventing youth drug and alcohol use. The coalition will receive \$125,000 in Drug Free Communities funds this year to support environmental strategies and initiatives to address the use of alcohol, marijuana, and prescription drugs by youth in our community. East Haddam Youth & Family Services supports and oversees the work of the coalition and serves as the administrator of the grant.

Richard Baum, Acting Director of National Drug Control Policy, states: "We're losing more than 60,000 people per year to drug overdose, but if we can stop young people from starting to use drugs in the first place, we can save lives. Our local DFC coalitions are a key part of this effort because they are bringing together parents groups, schools, healthcare professionals, law enforcement, businesses, and others to prevent drug use and improve the health of the community."

Toni McCabe, Director of East Haddam Youth & Family Services and Project Director for the Coalition, states "Our goal is to make East Haddam a safe and drug-free place for our youth. Prevention is a powerful tool to counteract youth drug use in East Haddam. We will use this funding to engage all sectors of our community in supporting our youth to make healthy choices and decisions regarding their use of drugs and alcohol."

Two New Hiking Adventures Await You

East Haddam is well known for abundant opportunities to enjoy our town's spectacular outdoor environment. Your Conservation Commission has just added two more locations. Newly mapped hiking trails await you on properties in different corners of town.

First, the Sabine Reserve provides an opportunity to explore the uplands near the Moodus reservoir. This 70 acre preserve with frontage on "the Res" has marked trails totaling over two and a half miles of pleasant hiking in East Haddam's lake country. Just park in the designated area at the end of Daniel Peck Road, which is a left turn off Wickham Road. Wickham is a left-hand turn as you approach Millington Green on Mount Parnassus. Or, take East Haddam– Colchester Turnpike to Beebe Road. At the end of Beebe, turn right onto Daniel Peck Road and park at the cul-de-sac.

For another new hiking adventure across town from Sabine, we recommend the just mapped Lena Reserve. This 207-acre parcel was acquired several years ago with help from the State of Connecticut and the East Haddam Land Trust. There are 2.75 miles of blazed and mapped trails awaiting you there. Nestled into the federally designated Eightmile River Wild and Scenic Watershed and Lyme Forest Block Important Bird Area, a walk on the Lena parcel will take you into recently logged woodlands. This forest, much formerly agriculture lands, provides excellent bird habitat and a new and interesting hiking experience. To get to the Lena Reserve, take Clark Hill Road to the junction of Tater Hill Road.

Take a right onto Tater Hill and the next left (gravel road) onto Babcock Road. Go to the end and the parking lot is on the left. From Millington Green; take Tater Hill Road to the junction of Clark Hill Road. Bear left onto Tater Hill and take the first left onto Babcock Road.

The East Haddam Conservation Commission maintains 21 miles of trails on town-owned open space for your hiking pleasure, and we have fun doing it. To view and download maps about these two properties and many more, just go to www.easthaddam.org, click on Town Boards, then click on Conservation Commission, and locate the Trail Maps section. Smoking and Eye Disease

Smoking tobacco (cigarettes, cigars, or pipes) can cause lung disease, heart disease, cancer, and many other serious health problems. But did you know that smoking can also harm your eyes?

- Cataracts Smoking increases your risk for getting cataracts. Cataracts is the clouding of your eye's naturally clear lens that causes blurry vision and makes colors look dull, faded, or yellowish. Cataracts are removed in surgery.
- Age-related macular degeneration (AMD) This disease happens when a part of the retina called the macula is damaged. You lose your central vision and cannot see fine details. Sometimes medicine or surgery can help certain people with AMD from getting worse, but there is no cure. Studies show that smokers and ex-smokers are more likely to get AMD than people who never smoked.
- Diabetic retinopathy Smokers who also have diabetes risk getting diabetic retinopathy. Diabetic retinopathy is when blood vessels in the eye are damaged causing blurry or distorted vision and possibly blindness. Treatment includes medication or surgery.

- Optic nerve problems People who smoke risk having optic nerve problems. The optic nerve connects the eye to the brain. Damage to this nerve can lead to blindness.
- Dry eye This is when your eyes don't produce enough tears. Smoking with dry eye will make your eyes more likely to feel scratchy, sting, burn, or be red.
- Uveitis Smoking can lead to a disease that affects part of the eye called the uvea. This is the middle layer of the eye wall. Uveitis is when this layer becomes inflamed (red and swollen). This disease causes a red eye, pain and vision problems.
- Graves' disease This is a disease of the body's thyroid gland. One of the symptoms of Graves' disease is bulging eyes. Smokers who have Graves' disease risk having their eye condition get worse. They can also lose vision.

The good news is that after people quit smoking, their risks for these eye diseases lowers.

Fund Raising for Lake Harvester

Moodus Reservoir is experiencing increased encroachment by native and invasive aquatic plants. With the help of the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station (CAES) and the Town of East Haddam, MRPG has tracked the increasing growth of these plants which are restricting full enjoyment of the town beach, boating and fishing. Numerous methods of control have been studied and tested. The only large space





treatment that is economically effective is non-chemical "harvesting." At the recent MRPG Annual Meeting purchase of the Echo Harvester was approved. The Eco Harvester machine will cost approximately one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000). Committees were formed for "Operations" and for "Fund Raising."

Raising the funds will require support of the community as well as outside grants and special events. This will improve the lake for use by all and extend its life for future generations.

The Moodus Reservoir Preservation Group (MRPG), a 501c(3) non profit charity, is dedicated to preserving the lake for continuing enjoyment of our the town beach, fishing and boating. All dues and donations are tax deductible.




