# Town Manager's Corner

Hello East Hampton,

The last time I wrote a letter for the East Hampton Events Magazine, we were coming into spring and looking forward to the warm weather and moving into the new Town Hall. Well, what a crazy few months it has been! The weather warmed up and then cooled right back down, we have moved into the new Town Hall and in the middle of it all, we came face-to-face with a new issue: COVID-19. The pandemic and its impact on us has been surprising. Our lives have been turned upside down as we learn to do everything a bit differently, which, for many of us, means doing it from home and without the usual social interactions we desire. It has been hard, but as this edition is produced, we are looking toward opening more of our businesses and municipal services and preparing for summer.

Work continues in Town. The Council has approved a plan for in-lake treatment of Lake Pocotopaug, and that project is well underway. Aeration will be used to improve the lake conditions so that we can anticipate a full season of recreational use. To address the long-term health of the lake, the Council approved a Conservation-Lake-Commission recommended contract for improvements in the lake watershed that will help filter runoff to prevent sediment and pollutants from reaching the lake. The work, which continues to implement the 2017 Nine Elements

Watershed Plan for Lake Pocotopaug, is largely funded by grants and is expected to be complete in early summer.

Last time, I talked about budget preparation. Well, that work continues but is heavily influenced by the economic conditions brought about by the closure of businesses in response to the pandemic. The original budget process was halted, and a new process undertaken that puts a pause on many planned changes and enhancements in order to present a budget with minimal increase. While residents will not be voting on this budget, the Town is working hard to prepare a plan that puts as little new burden on the community as possible. To further help taxpayers that may be struggling, interest rates on late payments have been slashed for three months allowing residents who need to postpone their payments the ability to do so with very little impact.

So, while lots of our daily lives has been changed, we are looking forward. Forward to the opening of our favorite local businesses and to stopping in at the new ones that opened in last few weeks. Forward to getting into summer recreation and summer programs, which, although they will be different, will still provide **continued on page 5**

# Office of the Assessor

## ELDERLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED RENTER'S REBATE PROGRAM

Residents 65 years of age or totally disabled may be eligible for a rent rebate under CT State law within the municipality where they currently reside. Income guidelines apply and are adjusted each year. Applications will be available April 1, 2020 and must be filed on or before October 1, 2020 with the Assessor's Office.

Per the State of CT Office of Policy and Management for the

2019 calendar year, the maximum income for a single taxpayer was set at \$37,000. The maximum income for a married couple was set at \$45,100. Additionally, the applicant must have lived in CT for one year.

# Office of the Collector of Revenue

The Town Council voted to adopt the "Lower Interest Rate Program" on April 13, 2020, per Governor Lamont's Executive Order No. 7S.

The "Lower Interest Rate Program" will allow interest to be charged at a rate of .25% per month from April 1, 2020 through July 1, 2020. This will provide a window of approximately 90 days where the taxpayers can pay their

delinquent bills at a reduced interest rate. On July 2, 2020 the interest will revert back to 1.5% per month from the original due date of the tax.

This program will also apply to new tax bills becoming due and payable on July 1, 2020 with the last day on which to pay being August 3, 2020. If a taxpayer pays on August 4th or later interest will be charged at a rate of .25% per month,

instead of the normal rate of 1.5% per month. The program will remain in effect through October 1, 2020. On October 2, 2020 the interest will revert back to 1.5% per month from the original due date of the tax.

The "Lower Interest Rate Program" applies to real estate, personal property and motor vehicle taxes.

## Public Works

The Department of Public Works has begun our routine spring maintenance program. Even though the winter was a milder one than normal, the cold weather still managed to produce many potholes with our roadways. Public Works crews have begun to address these along other routine spring maintenance items such as curbing replacement, guardrail and sign maintenance. Winter equipment is being examined and evaluated, necessary repairs made and routine maintenance items are being performed.


The early spring weather this year has allowed the department to get a jump on our spring maintenance and also complete some much needed drainage projects around town in preparation for paving. Asphalt plants have opened and road paving projects have begun on Meeks Point Road and Lake Drive.

These two projects are anticipated to be complete before Memorial Day

Public works crews have also begun regrading and addressing drainage issues on the 8 miles of gravel roads within the towns road network. Road sweeping has also begun and will continue until the town's entire paved road network has been addressed.

Cemetery clean-up and mowing will begin shortly and be completed prior to Memorial Day. Roadside mowing will begin in May and continue through summer and fall.

The Transfer Station will be open Saturdays from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm.

All registration forms must include payment. Payment is required at the time of registration. All registrations are taken on a first come, first served basis. We accept MasterCard and Visa. Please make checks payable to East Hampton Parks and Recreation. Cash payments should be made in the office only. Please do not try to register or pay program instructors unless indicated. Registration confirmations are available by email if subscribed to on your main account page at [www.easthamptonct.gov](http://www.easthamptonct.gov). No other confirmations are provided; however, if you have registered with us and paid, you will be on the final roster.

### Program Refund Policy as of September 1, 2018

If you are unable to attend a program you have registered for, please contact us. You must contact us 7 days before a program starts to receive a 100% refund. Cancellations inside of 7 days will receive a 50% refund or be issued an account credit for another activity. After the program starts no refunds will be issued. Our ability to refund money for trip cancellations depends on our contractual agreement with the travel companies.

In the event of inclement weather, all programs are cancelled if school is closed or has an early dismissal. Cancellation information is posted on WFSB Channel 3 Early Warning Network. Households who have subscribed to the online registration site's email notifications will receive an email regarding the cancellation. Program times are subject to change based on enrollment numbers. Programs will be cancelled if the minimum enrollment number is not reached.

Cost: \$115.00 (\$165.00 if attending both camps)

**\*\*PLEASE NOTE:** Any 9th grade participant seeking enrollment in Session 2: Pre-Season Camp must start in the Session 1: Foundation Building Clinic so that the clinic director can assess each 9th grade participant's level of volleyball skill and technique to recommend if Session 2 would be appropriate. Experience beyond Middle School volleyball can help with skill development and knowledge for Session 2.

#### Program Curriculum:

- Participants will be instructed in the volleyball skills: passing, serving, attacking, and team defense. As athletes improve their skills, they will be taught more challenging volleyball skills and techniques.
- Athletes will be placed into groups based on athleticism and ability so that each participant can grow appropriately in their current skill set. The end goal of the clinic is to teach the skill and technique of volleyball so that athletes can play in groups and team settings.
- Sportsmanship and teamwork are concepts that will be emphasized throughout the clinic.
- The clinic seeks to foster a love of the sport and encourage athletes to continue their volleyball training to build East Hampton into a competitive program in Connecticut.

#### The East Hampton P&R Volleyball Clinic offers 2 sessions:

**Session 1:** The most effective way to introduce volleyball to younger aged athletes is to introduce the fundamental skills and techniques specific to volleyball that players must master overtime. This session takes the energy and excitement of this great team sport and puts it all together into one fun-filled camp. All aspects of the game are taught through drills and exercises that focus on passing, setting, hitting and serving. This program is designed for all experience levels (beginner to advanced) and will incorporate essential life-lessons such as teamwork and sportsmanship. Athletes will develop and enhance fundamental skills of the game through game-based drills and scrimmages.

**Session 2:** Designed for the more experienced player, this session pushes participants to extend their learning and ability to compete at their highest level. Session 2 is open to high school students only and will focus on positional skill development and team offense/defense strategies that are utilized in high school programs. This session will emphasize specific positional skills development and incorporate learning into small, task-driven games and 6 on 6 scrimmages. Furthermore, participants will be expected to apply their learning into offensive and defensive schemes that emphasize volleyball concepts in teams and systems. Grade 9 students participating in Session 2 will be by invitation by camp Director only.

**Objective:** To build on skills in Level 2 through additional guided practice  
**Requirements:** Students entering this level must possess a Level 2 certificate or demonstrate all the Level 2 skills  
**Skills Covered:** Jump into deep water, head first entry from sitting or kneeling, submerging and retrieving an object, bobbing, survival float for 30 seconds, treading water for 30 seconds, front crawl 15 yards, butterfly 15 feet, back crawl 15 yards, elementary rescues, safe diving, check-c all-care

**LEVEL 4-Stroke Improvement**

**Objective:** To develop confidence in the strokes learned thus far and to improve other aquatic skills by increasing endurance through swimming greater distances  
**Requirements:** Students entering this level must possess a Level 3 certificate or demonstrate all the Level 3 skills  
**Skills Covered:** diving, underwater swimming, feet-first surface dive, 1 minute of survival floating, treading and back floating, 25 yards of front crawl, breast stroke and back crawl, 15 yards of butterfly and elementary backstroke and sidestroke, compact jump from height in a lifejacket, throwing assists and caring for conscious choking victim.

**LEVEL 5-Stroke Refinement**

**Objective:** Coordination and refinement of strokes  
**Requirements:** Students entering this level must possess a Level 4 certificate or demonstrate all the Level 4 skills  
**Skills Covered:** Shallow dive, tuck and pike surface dives, 2 minutes of survival floating, back float and treading water, flip turns on front and back, 50 yards front and back crawl, 25 yards butterfly, breaststroke, elementary backstroke and side stroke, 2 minutes of survival swimming, rescue breathing

## Library News

Hello! This message is coming to you from April Hannon, East Hampton’s Children’s Librarian. As you read this in June, I imagine life looks a little different than it did the day that I wrote this letter. I am writing to you in late April, a time when we as a community are still waiting to see if schools will be closed for the remainder of the year and if the state will open in phases. We are uncertain in so many ways.

But while there are uncertainties, there are also new beginnings. Library staff has been trying new ways to serve you, such as providing digital story times and other virtual events.

We’re creating eBook cards, so that East Hampton residents who previously did not have a library card can gain access to hundreds of our digital resources. So far, as of April 28th, 81 residents have taken advantage of this opportunity.

But as a library and as a community, one of our most important

beginnings is a bit more personal to us, as our library director Ellen had a healthy baby girl!

While summer may look different this year, we are committed to providing our 8-week Summer Reading Program for children, teens, and families. Both Summer Reading Kick-off performers have agreed to go virtual if needed.

We take our summer reading personally. Every child who signed up for summer reading in 2019 had a one-on-one goal setting session with a library staff member or reading specialist from Memorial or Center School. Each week during “A Universe of Stories,” children reported on how their reading goal was going and received a new planet sticker for their “Planet Passport” each week. Cheering on each child’s personal goal is at the heart of our program, and why we are so happy to report that 121 children who signed up for summer reading last year checked in for eight consecutive weeks, and 145 children for three to seven consecutive weeks.

Summer Reading 2020, “Imagine Your Story,” will kick off on June 26 for children, and June 29 for teens. Check our website



## Youth & Family Services and Social Services

Social Services and Youth and Family Services continued operations during the Coronavirus by working remotely. During this time, we effectively managed to continue the delivery of most of our services.

Social Services continued to help families and individuals negatively impacted by Covid 19 by connecting them to services. To date, we have not had to go into our direct assistance dollars. Individuals and families who had work hours reduced or who were laid off reached out to us for both food and energy assistance. Callers with food insecurity due to a reduction/loss of hours at work were directed to the Food Bank. Callers in need of energy assistance worked

with our case manager to extend utility services, enroll in payment protection plans, and get oil deliveries as needed. We worked closely with families who may have needed 211 services, following up with them weekly to ensure their needs were being met.

Youth and Family Services saw more of a change to its operations due to Covid 19. We were, unfortunately, forced to cease all counseling services including telephonic sessions. We are hopeful that we will be up and running with therapeutic services by late August/early September. We were also forced to cancel two big event programs. We were, however, given permission by the state

to redirect funding dollars that were meant to pay for the programs we had to cancel. Our department decided to do activity bags for families self-isolating at home. We did a total of 216 activity bags. To avoid crowds and threats to social distancing, our department planned to deliver bags to families that ordered

Both Social Services and Youth and Family Services are preparing for the move to our new location. In an effort to maintain the health and safety of our team and the public, we will look carefully going forward at the delivery of our services once we open again.




