

First Selectman's Corner

Dear Friends & Neighbors,

Spring has arrived! I encourage you to spend some quality time outdoors enjoying the tranquility of our small town and check out all the upcoming events as the weather warms. Explore our parks and the Essex Land Trust trails. Take some time to enjoy the Garden Club's May Market and the Burning of the Ships Parade, the Memorial Day and July 4th Parades, and the Ivoryton Farmers Market on Saturdays (June through October.) Think about signing the kids up for summer camp with the Park and Recreation Department. Go visit the River Museum, take a ride on the Essex Steam Train, or see a show at the Ivoryton Playhouse! While you are out and about, I encourage you to support our local businesses.

Before we get into budget talk, I'd like to thank all who came out for the annual Essex Go Bragh Irish Parade. Many thanks go to Mary Ellen Barnes, our Director of Park and Rec, and her staff for a job well done! The weather cooperated and, once again, we had visitors from far and wide coming to enjoy all our town has to offer.

We are in our annual budget season at both the Town and the Boards of Education. Numerous hours will be dedicated by boards of selectmen, finance and education as well as staff to prepare a fiscally responsible budget while supporting critical services. A number of factors will have an impact on our fiscal year 2019-2020 budget. These include:

- Principal payments for the 2017 General Obligation Bond will begin next fiscal year. As a result, debt service will see an increase of 14.3%.
- The Grand List experienced growth of approximately 1.4% due in part to the last real estate revaluation,

• A reduction in the relative number of Essex students at Regional School District #4 (R4) will cause a shift in the in the Average Daily Membership (ADM) share used to calculate the cost split and will reduce Essex education costs.

Our total budget increase for both Town and education is expected to come in under 1%. The public hearing for the Town and Essex Board of Education budgets will be held on April 24th at 7:30 pm in the Essex Town Hall Auditorium. On Tuesday, May 7th the R4 referendum will take place at the Town Hall from noon to 8:00 pm. The full Town of Essex fiscal year 2019-2020 will be voted on at the Monday, May 13th Annual Budget Town Meeting starting at 7:30 pm in the Town Hall auditorium. I continued on page 3

Sister Cities Essex Haiti (SCEH) Board Members' recent trip to Deschapelles

Essex residents Terry Parkinson, SCEH Library Chair, and Jenifer Grant, SCEH Vice President in charge of projects, traveled to Deschapelles, Haiti, over the week of March 18 to work with the Deschapelles Community Library staff and to meet with the organization's liaisons for its music, tennis, and robotics projects.

Since the Deschapelles Community Library's inception in 2010 until its completion in 2016, Terry has been SCEH's team leader instrumental for planning and operations for the library. Jenifer has been traveling to Deschapelles since the 1950s and is fluent in Creole, Dechapelles's native language. She has strong ties with many in the Deschapelles community.

The trip was significant because of unsettled conditions in Haiti over the past few months brought on by public dissatisfaction with the country's political leadership. Though the travel and communications disruption has been hard on the community, its location in the Artibonite Valley of central Haiti has insulated it somewhat from the strife, mostly centered in Port-au-Prince, two hours away.

Terry and Jenifer reported that the library and other programs have been operating successfully during this period, providing valuable opportunities for the community without interruption during this turbulent time. The library has proved a haven, providing a safe place for children and families to gather to read and enjoy workshops and lectures.

Sustainable Essex Committee

Sustainable Essex held a well- attended free educational event at the Town Hall on March 27th about C-PACE, a program that allows commercial, industrial and multi-family property owners to receive up to 100% in low-cost, upfront, long-term financing for clean energy upgrades to their properties.

The Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy program (C-PACE) is administered by the Connecticut Green Bank. It provides upfront funding for building owners to implement large energy efficiency and clean energy projects such as heat and cooling equipment replacement, window and door replacement and insulation and solar panel installation. Property owners pay for the improvements over time through a voluntary amortized assessment on their property tax bill. If the property is sold the repayment obligation transfers to the next owner. This is an attractive program, especially to building owners who would like to implement large projects without having to commit large amounts of capital.

The Town of Essex sponsored the meeting because we know that the program will make our local economy grow stronger as our town's portfolio of energy-efficient buildings increases. C-PACE buildings help create jobs and reduce our town's carbon footprint. They make our town a better place to do business and result in a stronger and healthier community. Sustainable Essex is helping Essex progress in the statewide

The Sustainable Connecticut program provides a list of actions and initiatives that can be implemented to earn municipalities points toward certification. Among the broad array of projects that our committee is currently working on are:

- · Mapping Tourism and Cultural Assets
- Reporting Materials Management Data and Reduce Waste
- Recycling Additional Material
- Designing and Implementing a Housing Needs Assessment
- Assessing Climate Vulnerability

In December 2014, two students, Julia Doran and Paulina Adams, were in Contemporary Issues, a class in which students learn about the rapidly changing world around them (events such as the Syrian Refugee Crisis). Julia and Paulina were moved to tears while watching a video about such people living in misery. Social Studies teacher Mr. Russ Arrigoni told them that if they were so disturbed they should do something about it. The girls asked Mr. Arrigoni to be the teacher advisor as our school started the World Food Programme. Since then, the club has grown in numbers and raised over \$12,500.

HOW WAS THE NATIONAL WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME STARTED?

The World Food Programme was established in 1961. After a disastrous earth-quake in Boein Zahra, many people were left homeless and in need of food and shelter. Dwight D. Eisenhower tried an experiment with food aid through the UN system. It was continued by the Food and Agriculture Organization and United Nations General Assembly. They have continued to grow as a group and are continuing to aid people in need overseas. At the rate they are going they have predicted they will completely end world hunger by 2030.

PADDLING SEASON IS HERE

The ice and snow are gone, and paddling enthusiasts are eager to get outside and enjoy the outdoors once again. Whether you paddle flatwater, whitewater or surf ocean waves, make sure your canoe, kayak, and stand-up paddleboard are labeled with your name and contact information.



Paddle craft are often left on racks, shores or docks when not in use and spring storms or floods carry these unattended vessels into waterways. Affixing the "If Found" sticker on board your

paddle craft will help emergency responders determine if a true emergency exists if your boat is found.

The "If Found" sticker for human-propelled (kayaks, canoes,

SUPs) and other non-registered boats is designed to help save lives, recover missing property, and reduce the time, effort and resources expended on non-emergency search and rescues.


The waterproof stickers provide space for your name and two phone numbers. It's important to list two phone numbers because if you fall overboard, your cell phone may end up in the water with you and no longer work. It's also important to use a waterproof and UV resistant marker on the label. Place the sticker in your canoe or kayak cockpit or on the side of your SUP.

FISH was founded locally in 1970 to provide free rides to medical appointments for residents of Essex, Deep River and Chester.

Residents of our three towns wanting rides and having no other means of transportation may call 860-388-2693 up to noon the day before their appointment (Friday noon for a Monday ride) to schedule a ride for the following day. The destinations are within the triangle of Middletown to the north, Guilford to the west and New London to the east.

In 2018, FISH drivers provided 943 free rides, of which 446 were for residents of Essex. This total of all rides is a 26% increase over the number of 2017 rides of 747.

The modest FISH budget is funded by grants from the Essex Community Fund, the Community Foundation of Middlesex County, the Essex Rotary Club, the Essex Savings Bank, the Deep River Community Health Committee, the Town of Chester, Smith Brothers Insurance and other organizations, as well as by contributions from our drivers, riders and friends.



Fat, Oils & Grease (FOG) Should Not Go Down the Drain

Essex and most of southern Middlesex County are served by subsurface sewage disposal systems (aka septic systems) and it's important that owners of these systems ensure they are functioning properly. Only a few areas in Chester and Deep River are served by a public sewer system and community members play a critical role in assuring it is operating at 100%. Accumulation of fats, oils, and grease can wreak havoc on both private septic systems and public sewer systems.

Fats, oils, and grease (FOG) are byproducts of cooking and are generated from meat fats, shortening, butter, sauces, and dairy products. When FOG in food products are washed down the drain from cookware, plates, and utensils, they can negatively impact a building's interior plumbing, private septic system and public sewer system. FOG cools down, hardens and builds up on the inside of pipes and sewer drains. The buildup will eventually block pipes and potentially result in wastewater backups into the home or business or breakout onto the ground's surface and into the surrounding environment.

Septic system owners can protect the environment, their property, and their investment by pumping the septic tank every 3-5 years (refer to the Town of Essex Wastewater Management Ordinance) and by refraining from the discharge of FOG down the drain. Scraping FOG off cookware and serving ware prior to washing or putting into the dishwasher and using screens in all drains will eliminate solid food particles from entering the building's wastewater system.

Foodservice establishments must be especially vigilant about their washing practices and must minimize FOG put down the drain. Due to their problematic wastewater having a higher concentration of FOG, food service establishments with a wastewater design flow of 500 gpd or greater are required to install and properly maintain a grease trap mechanism. Internal grease trap mechanisms must be cleaned very frequently (daily or weekly) and external grease tanks must be pumped by a licensed wastewater hauler on a weekly or monthly basis depending on the amount of grease generated. Simple and routine maintenance prolongs and protects the existing septic system and protects the business from unwanted and costly problems.

It takes a coordinated effort by home and business owners to implement and maintain "Best FOG management practices," which in turn, protects the environment and our community from public health nuisances.



Sleep Soundly with Inspire

Sleep apnea is a serious problem that can cause high blood pressure, heart failure and stroke.

Symptoms of sleep apnea include, but are not limited to, getting up frequently to use the bathroom, waking up feeling tired and not well rested, excessive daytime sleepiness, waking up with headaches and problems with memory or concentration. If you experience any of these symptoms, you should see your doctor.

The standard treatment for obstructive sleep apnea is the use of a CPAP machine, which is a positive pressure therapy that involves the use of a mask, hose and small machine. The CPAP mask works by having a flow of air create a pressure in the back of your throat and mouth to hold open the soft tissues that are falling back and closing your airway.

If patients cannot use a CPAP machine then they may be offered an oral appliance or surgery, such as transoral robotic-assisted surgery. They may also be offered an implantable device called Inspire Therapy, which is similar to a pacemaker.

Dr. Mark D'Agostino, Middlesex Health's chief of Otolaryngology, was one of the first in the country to offer Inspire Therapy, which treats sleep apnea by implanting into patients a small device that senses breathing. A stimulation cuff is placed around a nerve that controls the tongue, allowing patients to breathe normally through the night. Patients control the therapy with a remote control.



Spring Into Rosé

Spring is finally here and as the days become longer and the weather warms up, the perfect wines to drink are Rosés. The rosé style of wine has become increasingly popular every year, and why not? Aside from being refreshing, rosés pair well with a vast array of foods and are extremely palatable to almost any wine drinker.

Rosés are comprised of mostly red varietals but are occasionally blended with a small amount of white grapes. You might ask, where does the pink color come from? Well, the juice from all grapes is clear, the color of the wine depends on how long the skins stay in contact during the wine making process. The longer the skins stay in contact, the darker the color of the rosé. In my experience, the deeper rosés tend to have dark fruit flavors such as blackberry, cassis and plum, while the pale rosés taste of strawberry, cherry and watermelon. French rosés from Provence, for example, tend to be a pale salmon-like color and are light and refreshing in body, while Cotes-du-Rhone rosés are brighter pink and weightier in the mouth.

Because of the long run of White Zinfandel in the United States, many people believe that all rosés are sweet. White Zinfandel is made in a different fashion than true rosés. It has lower alcohol and higher residual sugar. Most rosés are in fact drier than one would expect. This makes them easy to pair with many different foods, from appetizers to entrees and desserts.

It is time to invite your friends over, uncover and strike up the barbeque grill, and crack open a refreshing bottle of rosé. It will surely please your entire crowd. Happy Spring!

ELT's 50th Anniversary Hike – The Reopening of Windswept Ridge Preserve

On October 6th, 52 enthusiastic hikers joined the Essex Land Trust to celebrate its 50th anniversary with a tour of the newly expanded Windswept Ridge (WSR). Hikers gathered at each of the three entrances and stewards led each group to a central meeting area for refreshments, a history of the property and a demonstration of a tree coring.

For its first 17 years, Windswept Ridge was a fairly basic small neighborhood park. Over the last three years, the Land Trust increased the preserve's acreage by 50%, tripled the trail mileage and addressed some of the preserve's original challenges. After many hundreds of hours of steward time, the new Windswept Ridge Preserve was ready for its big reveal.

Windswept Ridge is now the land trust's 3rd largest contiguous preserve and the only one that connects Essex, Centerbrook and Ivoryton. There are now three entrances - the original entryway on Windermere Way, a new entrance at the end of the cul de sac on Windsor Lane and behind Essex Financial on Plains Road.

We engaged a professional trail builder who developed a creative loop approach to address the steep terrain from a recent acquisition. The valley of the property is dominated by wetlands that limited access between the east and west sides.

Recently, the Land Trust's Chief Steward Geoff Furtney designed a set of three bog walks covering over 100 feet, allowing easy and dry access over the wetlands connecting the Yellow and Blue trails:





- The Lost Shoe Bridge, aptly named by the 11 VRHS seniors who carried in all the wood on a wet and muddy Community Service Day;
- Bridgett's Bridge aptly named for a good friend at the Ivoryton Tavern who heroically puts up with us during our weekly Steward's lunches;
- The last and longest of the bog walks is still awaiting a name. Take a hike through the property and send us suggestions for a name to Gfurtney@aol.com.

Myron Stacks, the youngest old man among the stewards, tackled the steep terrain that connects the Green Trail to the new Red Trail loops. This required heavy leveling of the trails, installing steps and building a set of stairs offsite and carrying onto the trails for installation. They are really a sight to be seen and hiked.

To cross over a centuries old large stone wall, Bill French built a wooden bridge offsite that was transported, rebuilt onsite and gives a nod to the Rialto Bridge in Venice Italy.

RED TRAIL TIP

These three loops offer some exciting sights - a soaring seven trunk tulip tree, a recently exposed rock cliff, and a hanging glacial boulder. But this trail, closest to the parking lot behind Essex Financial, is an aggressive uphill climb. From experience, the easiest approach is to hike down the Red Trail. Park behind Essex Financial but start by going straight out the Blue Trail to the second set of bog walks and then go left up the Yellow Trail. From there, take a left onto the Green Trail which will connect to the Red Trail. Hiking down the Red Trail with a slight but longer uphill climb on the Yellow Trail is much easier. Your heart and knees will thank you.



The last word... Presented by William Pitt - Janet Peckinpaugh



A career that began in his family's kitchen continues in the family kitchen today. Whether preparing a lovely scallop or a veal chop with mashed potatoes, dinner is Jacques Pépin's "culmination of the day." The piano, he says, is the nickname for the stove. That makes Pépin a master muscian.

DESTINED FOR THE KITCHEN

Pépin's skills were honed early. Home was working in his parents' restaurant near Lyon, France. A Paris apprenticeship began in 1949 at the age of 13 (interestingly, Julia Child was working in Paris at the same time). His military service in France (1956-58) found him as the personal chef to 3 heads of state (including Charles De Gaulle) at a time when chefs toiled in anonymity. There was no such thing as a celebrity chef. If commanded to the dining room, things had gone awry. "Now, [being a chef], all of a sudden, you are a genius," he quips. "It is a very different world. I am lucky to be a part of it."

A year after coming to the US in 1958, he was working at New York's finest French restaurant, Le Pavillon. He turned down the position of chef to the Kennedy White House. He opted to develop food lines for Howard Johnson. It all worked out. A NY Times food editor connected Pépin with Helen McCully, a food industry icon. She introduced Pépin to then unknown Julia Child. The delightful cooking duo went on to win a daytime television Emmy Award in 2001. Yes, the friends would often argue. "On the whole we agreed on what was important," he recalls. "Quality, simplicity."

"Extraordinary," he reminisces. "Nothing was planned. I am very existentialist that way. You do something and it projects you somewhere else. You do that and it projects you elsewhere." One thing has always led to another for Pépin. Trips to the Catskills in the early 1960s led to his catching the "painting bug." His paintings are now a new business line. This June, his

works will be on display at the Guilford Art Center. At the Catskills, he became a ski instructor. And on those slopes he met his wife of 53 years, Gloria. He calls his daughter (Claudine) and granddaughter (Shorey) his greatest accomplishments. During the 1960s he also earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Columbia University.

A LIFE OF EVOLUTION

No life is without hardship. A 1974 car accident nearly claimed Pépin's life. He could no longer withstand the rigors of 7 days a week, 10-14 hours in the kitchen. His life transformed into "teaching, writing, and just cooking." Since 1975, he has written 30 books. He also became and remains a beloved fixture on television. He isn't a fan of today's harsh reality cooking shows. "You are asked to put a lot of yourself in your food. Love is a very important component. Yelling at you? There is no way you can teach with that approach... Cooking is interactive. You follow your taste. You taste and adjust. You taste and adjust."

At 83, he recognizes his own progression. "For many people in the country, I was known as the quintessential French chef... If you look at my books, there is the soup and cilantro with banana on one page, then the salad and fried chicken, and then the lobster roll. After half a century in the US, I am probably the quintessential American chef." Pépin's life/career has been profiled on the PBS series "American Masters." "I am probably the first cook to have an American Masters," he notes.

The Madison, CT resident continues to teach, paint, and enjoy life. Whether it is a game of boule, mushrooming, or walking his poodles along the beach, food still remains center stage. He is currently the Dean of Special Programs at the International Culinary Institute of New York and continues a 37- year teaching stint at Boston University. He performs countless cooking demonstrations across the country. In 2016, the Jacques Pepin Foundation was formed. His books/manuals of cooking techniques form the curriculum for soup kitchens from Boston to Seattle. The idea is to take what Pépin has created over so many decades to assist disenfranchised individuals - those who may be coming out of jail, are homeless, or are recovering from addictions.

JACQUES PÉPIN...NOT INVINCIBLE?

"Yes, yes," he relates. "One time. It was 30 years ago or more. It was in the early 70s, a 3-hour show with dancing and singing. I did a cheese soufflé." Pépin came on the stage two hours into the show to put the soufflé in the oven. There was no way of checking on the controls so he did not know the oven was set on self-cleaning mode. He went back on stage for the unveiling. "I have never seen anything so burned." He laughs heartily. "It was crust on the outside and still liquid on the inside... There was no recovery on that one. But it was the biggest standing ovation I ever had."


