

by putting in your information, so try it. Even if solar is not for you, consider having your home assessed through the CL&P's Home Energy Solutions (HES). On Dec. 10, 2014, we had our Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony at Town Hall, with the Middle School Band providing seasonal music. Of course, the weather did not cooperate, the rain chasing the band into the Meeting Hall, where they played some terrific music. Thanks to Essex Savings Bank and the Lyme Old Lyme Chamber of Commerce, the students and guests all enjoyed cookies and hot chocolate after the event. It was a lovely and well attended ceremony.

The Boathouse Hains Park Improvements Committee will continue to work on the details of the design for the boathouse and the Master Plan of Hains Park. Some new members were appointed by the Board of Selectmen, and they include a representative from Park & Rec Commission, District #18, Board of Finance and the Building Official. As reported earlier, there will be public information sessions to share the changes to the plan that was presented at the Oct. 6, 2014 Town Meeting to keep residents informed.

The Rte 156 Bike Path and Sound View Improvements Committee has continued to meet to discuss some of the details of the plans and specification, but the focus has been on preparation for the Public Information meeting for March. BSC Group, Inc. is ready to present the preliminary design, but the Committee felt it was important to hold the Public Information meeting later in the year, to allow for seasonal residents to attend. It will be important to have this meeting in early March, 2015 in order to stay on schedule for completion of construction prior to the Summer of 2016. An announcement of the actual date of the presentation should be forthcoming. February 13, 2015 has been proclaimed by the Boards of Selectmen of Old Lyme, Lyme, East Lyme, Salem and Old Saybrook as "Loving Parting Day" in honor of the 350th Anniversary of the amicable separation from Saybrook. On that date in 1665, representatives of the settlers on both sides of the Connecticut River signed the agreement known as "the Loving Parting", making East Saybrook a self-supporting community, separate from the Saybrook Colony. 1667, the Connecticut General Court assigned the name "Lyme" to this new community, which also had its own church, known as the First Congregational Church. For more information on the Loving Parting and the history of the Lymes, please visit the Old Lyme Historical Society on Lyme Street (the former Grange Hall). We have a very interesting and rich history in our community.

The Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2014 was a very positive report on the strength and stability of the Town. Our finances are in good shape – tax collections were healthy, and our surplus increased from about 16% to 20%, due to prudent fiscal planning and spending. During late winter and early spring of 2015, the Board of Finance will meet weekly to work on the budget for Fiscal Year 2016. The budget hearing is planned for April 20, 2015, and the budget vote will be on May 18, 2015. For more information on the budget proceedings, be sure to read the minutes on the Town website. Please feel free to pick up your own copy of the 2014 Annual Report at the Selectman's Office.





The boating season is starting and we wish to inform people who would like to place a mooring in Old Lyme waters, including Long Island Sound, that a permit is required. The application form for a mooring permit is available at www.oldlyme-ct.gov under Harbor Management. The fee of \$25 should be sent with the application when mailed or delivered to Town Hall.

If a marina handles the setting of your mooring, please be sure to submit an application with the fee because the marinas do not acquire permits and it is the responsibility of the mooring owner to do so.


The Harbor Master will conduct periodic inspections to be sure that moorings placed applied for a permit. Moorings with no permit, or no identification as to owner, will be tagged by the Harbor Master and removed if contact is not made within 3 weeks.

Want to Advertise? Call Betty Martelle at (860) 333-7117 We recommend painting the owner name on the float, not stick on vinyl letters, to ensure the mooring can be identified.

Please remember to carefully check your mooring tackle when reusing to be sure all components are in good condition, particularly shackles. The requirements for mooring tackle are shown on the HMC section of the Town web site under Harbor Management Plan.

Please contact the Harbor Master if you have any questions regarding obtaining a mooring permit, placement of the mooring or other subjects. To contact the Harbor Master, or Harbor Management Commission, call the Town Hall Administrative Assistant at 860-434-1605 ext. 212 to leave a message.

Anyone interested in becoming a member of the Harbor Management Commission, which has an Alternate Member position available, can contact the Chairman by leaving a message at the same number above.



A Message: from John Pfeiffer, Chair of the Historic District Commission

We are part of an American society that treasures innovation, technology, progress, and development. We actively strive towards an ever evolving system where growth is mandatory and achievement is often measured by various kinds of monuments erected along our journey.

In this ongoing effort, we often lose sight of from where we have come and those who came before us. We are the reason for their struggles as are our children being the reason for our lives. It is valuable to reflect upon the past and gain appreciation of who we really are. An understanding of the past, and a respect for it, are in many ways the basis for respecting ourselves. It gives us identity!

In Old Lyme in the early 1970's we formed the Old Lyme Historic District. Those who spearheaded the effort, clearly recognized the value of the past, the direction in which we were headed regarding development, and the necessity of preserving a little piece of ourselves.

Our job on serving on the Historic District Commission is to work towards the preservation of the historic resources within the district and maintain their integrity. Those who have moved into the District have become special partners in the stewardship of this resource and are committed to its preservation. Residents of Old Lyme too, have a big part in preserving the District. It is, in many ways, our identity. It is where we: conducted town business, went to school, went to church, bought our groceries, picked up our mail, bought our tools and hardware, got our cars and machinery fixed, our plumbing needs arranged, saw our doctors, bought our prescriptions, got our hair cut and got the news of the town, bought our books and holiday presents, savored our ice cream and soda while listening to a juke box and quietly wandered the stacks of the library.

It is hard for most of us to recognize that during the Colonial and American period, Lyme street and avenues along Lieutenant River had been a bustling shipping community with docks, wharves, warehouses, shipbuilding yards, and homes that accommodated the wide range of residents that lived, farmed, worked, and traded both within Old Lyme and in other ports along the eastern American coast, West Indies, and as far away as China. Our community was made up of a wide spectrum of people and occupations. Their homes and businesses, barns and stone walled fields, docks and wharves are still present and attest to a past that truly constitutes a valuable resource. During the latter half of the 19th century, Old Lyme became home and school for artists. They came to a community where there were patrons who supported and nurtured their work. Our artists strove to capture the unique mixture of our natural landscape, domestic architecture, shoreline agrarian and business fiber. Their treasured works are all around us, as are their homes, school, studios, and scenes that they saw and interpreted.

What we see today, within the Old Lyme Historic District, is a clear reflection of our heritage. It is who we are.

What is 2-1-1?

Transfer Station Information

Transfer Station/Landfill Hours. The Transfer Station is located on Four Mile River Road and is open Tuesday-Friday, 7:30 am-3:45 pm, Saturday, 8:30 am-4:00 pm. Closed Sunday and Monday. Tax payers vehicles should have a Transfer Station sticker affixed to the right-hand side of windshield. Vehicles without a sticker, should bring proof of property address (i.e., tax bill, mortgage statement or closing papers), along with a driver's license and registration.

Bulky Waste and Demolition: Vehicles will be charged by weight at \$110/ton. Recyclables should not be mixed in the same load with Bulky Waste or Demolition debris. Loads less than 100 lbs. are charged a minimum fee of \$5.

Brush is charged on a per load basis. No wood or limbs thicker than four inches are accepted.

Resolving Differences

Our relationships are a source of emotional support, security, and the feeling that we are not alone in the world. When things are going well, we love and feel loved, we offer support and seek it out ourselves. But relationships always involve differences as well. We can't always see things the same way or rely on the same solutions. If we want our relationships to be healthy and supportive, we must understand how to nurture them through these challenges. Resolving differences can be done in positive ways, using empathy and openness, rather than seeing it as a conflict that is either "won" or "lost." To resolve conflicts in a relationship-building way, we need to follow certain guidelines. Communication must be positive and non-blaming, allowing both persons to state their perspectives without criticism or interruption. Sometimes just being heard goes a long way toward easing the conflict. We need to focus on our own feelings and experiences, using "I" statements instead of blaming or accusing. Listening, trying to understand a different point of view, and a willingness to compromise are all important. So are the ability to say "I'm sorry" and "Thank you." Look upon differences not as creating distance, but as an opportunity for growth in relationships.


Eklund Pond Phragmite Removal

In 2010 the Town of Old Lyme acquired a 7 acre pond at 316 Ferry Road, behind DEEP headquarters, as a result of a sub-division on SandpIper Lane. This 7 acre pond is a unique and exciting acquisition for the Town as all of our previous acquisitions have been mixed hardwood forests.

Eklund Pond has been a haven for various kinds of wildlife and up until recently, has been a great spot for bird watching and wildlife observation. Many of the State birders check this site regularly. It's an especially interesting habitat because of its coastal location, attracting many migratory birds on their way south in the fall. Other reptiles and amphibians that thrive in fresh water marshes can be observed amongst Connecticut's native wetland plants.

In the 4 years since the Town acquired this parcel, the Open Space Commission has observed the pond being taken over by phragmities. These phragmities have crowded out the native vegetation and changed the habitat and therefore the plant and wildlife diversity that was previously so notable. Left unchecked, Eklund Pond will become completely populated by this monoculture within the next couple of years.

The Open Space Commission applied to the Inland Wetlands Commission and received approval to engage the services of

Snowy Egret Wetland Services LLC, of Old Saybrook, to use their manpower and amphibious vehicle, to cut the phragmities. This is part of a three or more year program to bring the phragmities under control (hopefully) without the use of pesticides.

The goal of this phragmite control program is to restore the vital role this Old Lyme fresh water wetlands plays in supporting native fish, amphibians, birds and other visiting wildlife as well as protecting its unique natural resources for future generations.

The Start of the 2015 Session

For the towns of Lyme, Old Lyme, Old Saybrook, & Westbrook

This legislative session brings many challenges but also many opportunities to steer Connecticut's economy in the right direction. The 2015 session began on January 7th and ends June 3rd. This is what's known as the 'long session' as it is longer since it focuses on all types of legislation (the 2016 short session focuses solely on fiscal matters).

The governor will present a budget proposal in early February that is designed to provide guidelines for legislators. Non-partisan analysts project a budget deficit of nearly \$3 billion over the next two fiscal years. Thus, it is vital his proposals seriously take into account the state's debt and unfunded liabilities.

As a member of the Transportation Committee, I will be focused on improving our roads, bridges, and rails. The governor has made repairing our transportation infrastructure a key component for his second term. These upgrades are crucial, but also costly. Both the governor and I have put forward proposals for a Constitutional amendment to ensure that funds dedicated to the special transportation fund will be used exclusively for that purpose

(a "lockbox"). Too often the special transportation fund has been raided for other purposes, so it is imperative we prevent it from continuing.

As a member of the Environment Committee, I will focus on the continued preservation of the Long Island Sound while also fighting overly burdensome mandates that often target shoreline communities.



As a member of the Higher Education and Employment Advancement Committee, I will work towards making secondary education affordable and ensuring the necessary training for indemand jobs when available.






Wallet Medication Card

The Connecticut Department of Public Health is working with partners including the Connecticut Hospital Association (CHA), the CHREF Patient Safety Organization, Qualidigm, and the Qualidigm PSO to promote awareness of patient safety strategies and empower patients to be more active partners in their care.

As the first step in this statewide effort to engage patients in safety, we have developed a wallet medication card in order to assist consumers in maintaining an accurate record of the medicines they take and other important information. It is critical that your healthcare providers have complete information about your medical history and current medications, and we encourage all consumers to use the wallet medication card or a similar tool to track this information.
