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The Town Manager's Corner

To the Residents of Tolland:

Tolland continues to be recognized by outside groups as one of the best towns to live in both within the State as well as the country. Just recently our education system was ranked 36th best in the State which is a wonderful tribute to our educators and students. Working closely with my counterparts throughout the state as well as our colleagues in our own Board of Education we continually look for ways to enhance the quality of the services we provide at a lesser cost.

In recent years we have regionalized our health insurance programs combining with six other Boards of Educations and Towns and in just three years have saved over a million dollars. We have combined with Coventry and South Windsor to provide IT support. Working with the Board of Education we have just completed a \$10 million upgrade of HVAC systems in school buildings utilizing a performance management concept that allows for future energy savings to pay for the vast majority of the cost of the improvements. In addition we have created a combined utility account which has the ability to grow to help offset the cost of future HVAC improvement needs. Currently we are in the midst of the construction phase of the Library expansion project, final design of the highway expansion project and final design of the conversion of the former Parker School to 36 units of elderly housing. All these projects are the beneficiary of State grants which is a tribute to the ability of Town staff to leverage available state and federal dollars in order to reduce the cost of these public improvement projects on Town taxpayers.

We are currently in the midst of our 2016/2017 budget preparation. Please check our web page at www.tolland.org for latest updates and public hearing dates scheduled as part of the budget process.

The Board of Education has done an outstanding job in presenting me as part of the capital budget process the need for upgrades to school facilities. Unfortunately many of the needs are expensive and ones that can no longer be deferred. For example the roofs at the Middle School, Birch Grove and TIS are beyond their useful life and have a cost to replace in excess of \$6 million. In total there are \$9.5 million worth of improvements which I am recommending be bundled into a bond issue which would require a referendum question as part of the 2016 fall election. The work would be performed over a three year period and when complete would address the major facility needs of our school system for the immediate future. In the future I am confident the school system, with funding support, will do a much better job of maintenance which will allow us to realize the full investment made in upgrades to school facilities. We are fortunate that due to a declining debt schedule we are able to bond projects such as this without an increase in our debt service.

It is important for residents to become knowledgeable about this issue and other elements of the overall Town and Board of Education budget. As always if any residents have questions about any aspect of the budget, please do not hesitate to contact me at swerbner@tolland.org.

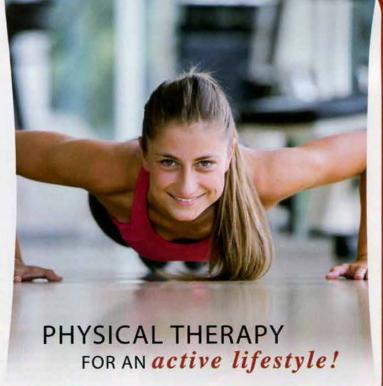

In 2015, patrons of the Tolland Public Library could read Newsweek online for free, meet award-winning authors, learn to play chess, research their family tree and even compete in a poetry slam thanks to \$15,828 in grants from the Tolland Public Library Foundation.

The Foundation also hosted six talks on Tolland history as the town celebrated its 300th anniversary and taught owners of small businesses how to market their products through social media.

It all made for an exciting year, just as the library embarked on an ambitious expansion into the former gym at the Hicks Memorial Building at 21 Tolland Green, Library Director Barbara Pettijohn said.

"Our library staff and patrons are grateful for the grants we received all year from the Tolland Public Library Foundation," she said. "As our library grows in 2016, we look forward to partnering with the Foundation on more lively programs and important initiatives."

Established in 1996, the Foundation receives donations to benefit the Tolland Public Library and to enhance library services beyond what the town budget provides.

Most of its funding is drawn from income from the Phoebe Dimock King and Elizabeth C. King Eaton Endowment. Eaton, a medical librarian in Texas who died in 2009, made a large bequest to the Foundation to honor herself and her mother, who had served on the Tolland library staff for many years.

Through a Foundation grant, residents started 2015 by getting "fiscally fit" though a free series of lectures on personal finance.

The fifth season of the Eaton-Dimock-King Authors Series brought debut novelist Karen Guzman, young adult author Cindy L. Rodriguez and author Jeff Goldberg, whose book chronicled the UConn-Tennessee women's basketball rivalry, to Tolland.

In March, the Foundation sponsored its fourth annual poetry slam for students aged 12 to 18 from Tolland and surrounding towns. It will hold the next poetry slam March 10 at 6:30 p.m. in Conference Room A of town hall.

From April through October, the library celebrated the town's 300th anniversary with well-attended lectures that examined

every 50 years of the town's history. The series ended with a lively panel by three teachers, Ivy Morrison, James MacArthur and Carlton Cayward, who reminisced about "Growing Up and Teaching Tolland" from 1965 to 2015.

In the summer, grants from the Foundation and the UConn Chess Club allowed the library to offer chess lessons to Tolland students in grades 3 and up. The lessons are continuing throughout the current school year.

In the fall, the Foundation held another popular talk on "How to Pay for College" and purchased college and financial aid guides for the library.

The Foundation's funding also provided library patrons and Tolland residents with useful databases, including Ancestry.com, the Job Now! employment database and TumbleBooks, an online animated collection of 540 books, puzzles and videos.

Another Foundation grant now allows library cardholders to read three magazines – Newsweek, US Weekly and Outside – for FREE from any computer or mobile device using the Flipster digital magazine subscription service.

Library patrons can read the magazines online at the library, from home or anywhere using a smartphone or tablet. Just visit tolland. org, click on the library page, follow it to "login to databases" and then login into Flipster using your library card bar code.

Flipster can also be accessed by clicking here. The Foundation is considering expanding the Flipster offerings in the future.

Give Flipster or one of these databases a try today! For more information or assistance, call the Tolland Public Library at 860-871-3620.

As the library is expanding, the Foundation is exploring what technology and materials to purchase that are not included in the project's budget, Linda Byam, president of the Foundation's board of directors, said. Under restrictions in Eaton's bequest, the EDK Endowment income cannot be used to fund library salaries or investments in the library's physical plant.

"Libraries have truly evolved into community hubs, and the Foundation was pleased to help make Tolland Public Library a destination in 2015," she said. "It's going to be a great partnership again in 2016."

What is Economic Development?

Tolland Partners With Ellington To Examine Economic Development in a small community.

Heidi Samokar, AICP, Director of Planning and Development and Greg Williams, Chairman, Tolland Economic Development Commission

In mid-January members of Tolland's Economic Development Commission, Planning and Zoning Commission, the Tolland Community and Economic Development Corporation and staff joined their counterparts in Ellington to explore the "Fundamentals of Municipal Economic Development." The Connecticut Economic Resource Center (CERC), with funding support from Eversource, provides municipal training to communities across the state.

The CERC team posed key questions that all municipal leaders, staff and volunteers involved with local economic development should ponder, including:

- · What is economic development and why should you care?
- How does your town fit into the broader regional and global economy?
- · What is your reputation in the economic development market?

One key takeaway was the importance of business retention. When is the last time you read the headline "Business XYZ is Still Operating in Tolland"? Likely never. Headlines are generated when a business leaves and sometimes when a new business opens. Yet retaining the businesses that are here today is one of the most important elements of economic development. Successful and productive businesses build community pride and can help convey that a community is a business-friendly place.

Often, we confuse "real estate development" with "economic development." Real estate development is transactional - it can be exciting, something new in town. But economic development is really about the people. It is a more transformative and ongoing process that can include real estate development but goes to the heart of a community - its people. A healthy community can provide diversified job and career opportunities, housing options across the economic spectrum, an educational system to develop our future leaders and a community vested in the success of itself and each other.

CERC reminded the audience that the Economic Development team is broader than an Economic Development Commission and businesses. To be successful, residents, local and regional institutions, elected officials, and town employees beyond development staff also should play a role. Two online communities that epitomize this vested community include Tolland Friends and Neighbors and ourTolland.org. Every day we see examples of people helping people improve life in our community. We encourage our residents and businesses to play a hands-on role in "economic development" and we will aim to keep the community informed about initiatives and opportunities.



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Tolland Planning and Development Building Department

Did you know that many permits can be applied and paid for online? From the homepage of Tolland.org, click on the Government tab, then Building Department. While you're on the Building Dept. page, please browse through our many informative handouts. There is quite a bit of information regarding swimming pools, decks, additions and the permit application process in general. Remember to schedule a final inspection appointment to properly close out your permit. Open Building Permits will impede the sale of your home and may give cause to an insurance company to deny a claim for fire or personal injury.

Spring brings many outdoor projects to the forefront. It is likely that you may want to power-wash your home, repair a fence, replace a few shingles, paint the house or stain a deck. While none of the above requires a permit, it is highly recommended that you still hire licensed and insured contractors. You should also always get a written proposal from the contractor and ask for references. Never pay in-full for a job in advance; a partial deposit is common and fair to everyone involved.

Now that warmer weather is finally here, many of you may be thinking of installing a swimming pool. A building permit is

required for all in-ground pools and any above-ground pools that are more than 24 inches deep. Building codes have changed a bit and we are here to offer guidance for a code-compliant installation. Items commonly missed by installers are proper bonding of the water and perimeter area; not having a floating pool alarm; not having a proper fence or gate and running the pump off of an extension cord instead of permanent wiring.

The Building Official, James Paquin is typically available in the office to answer questions from 8:00-10:00 am and Noon-2:00 pm, plus 6:00-7:30 pm on Thursdays.

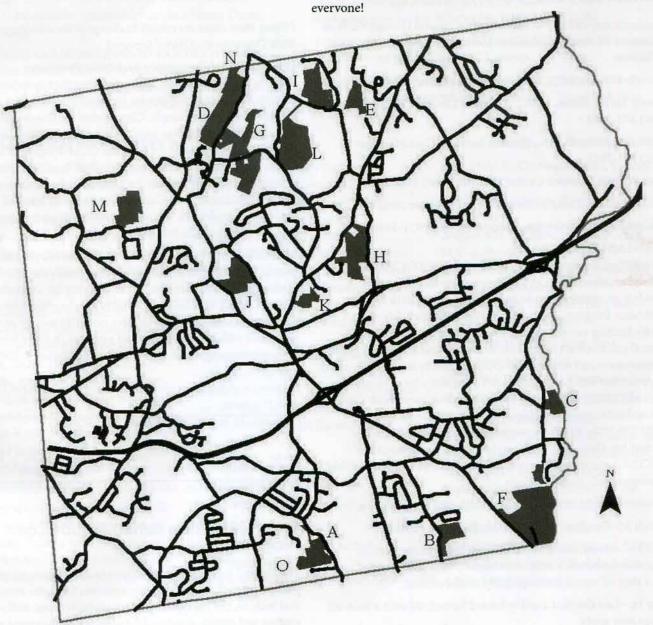

Fair Housing Notice

Beverly Bellody, Director of Tolland Human Services, serves as the Fair Housing Officer for the Town of Tolland. Under the Federal Fair Housing Act, prohibits discrimination in the sale, rental, and financing of dwellings, and in other housing-related transactions, based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status (including children under the age of 18 living with parents or legal custodians, pregnant women, and people securing custody of children under the age of 18), and handicap (disability).

Under the Connecticut Federal Fair Housing Act, it is against the law to deny anyone housing based on race, color, national origin, sex, ancestry, religion, children or family status, mental or physical disability, marital status, age (except minors), sexual orientation, or legal source of income. If you feel your rights have been denied in the equal access to the rental, sale or financing of residential property, please contact

ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS:

Connecticut Energy Assistance Program (CEAP/CHAP) Tolland residents may call the Human Services office to schedule an appointment to apply for the 2015/2016 Energy Assistance Program. On behalf of eligible households, the winter heating assistance pays for such heating sources as oil, natural gas, electricity, propane, kerosene, coal and wood/pellets. Homeowners and renters may apply. Eligibility is based on annual gross income and household size. To request a list of required documentation, schedule an appointment or learn more about this and other programs: Seniors- contact Rebecca Ellert, (860) 870-3726; all others contact Administrative Secretary Bridget Joy, (860) 871-3648; residents may also contact the ACCESS Agency in Willimantic, (860) 450-7423. We are unable to process walk-in applications.

Residents should make note of the following Program deadlines*:

March 15- Deadline for deliverable fuel authorizations.

May 2 - Last day that a household can apply to establish its eligibility for benefits unless the household is utility heated and has a shut off notice for its primary source of heat.

May 16 - Last day that a utility heated household with a shut-off notice may apply.

(*Note: these dates are subject to change at the discretion of the State Department of Social Services)

Operation Fuel Emergency Assistance Program

Human Services will take applications for the Operation Fuel Energy Assistance Program for residents who need aid with meeting their energy needs. Closing date for this program is Tuesday, June 30, 2015 or until funding is exhausted. Income Guidelines are the same for both the CEAP Program and Operation Fuel. Note that Operation Fuel is an Emergency Energy Assistance Program. An Operation Fuel energy grant is not an entitlement to all Connecticut residents who fall within the income guidelines. Grants to households are approved at the discretion of the local fuel banks.

PRIMARY HEAT SOURCE: To qualify for oil, propane, pellets, gas/electric utility or wood, clients that qualify for CEAP/CHAP must exhaust those benefits before applying for Operation Fuel. SECONDARY ENERGY: To qualify for electric utility, clients must have a shut-off notice or have no utility service or must need assistance with making a required payment in order to maintain a payment arrangement, or have a past due balance of 30 days or more.

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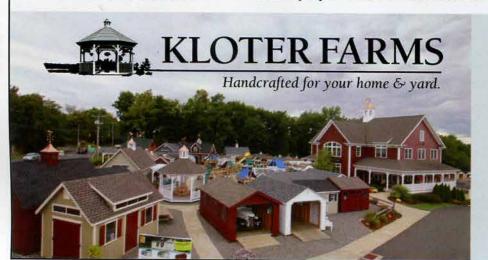

DUI Enforcement Program Grant for Tolland Resident State Troopers

The Department of Transportation approved the Town of Tolland's Highway Safety project application entitled "FY 2016 Comprehensive DUI Enforcement Program for Resident Trooper Towns" effective December 31, 2015, through September 10, 2016. Federal funds in the amount of \$39,750.00 are obligated to this project in accordance with the approved 2016 Fiscal Year Connecticut Highway Safety Plan.

The goal is to increase patrols to decrease the number of impaired drivers on Tolland roadways and prevent drug and alcohol related traffic crashes and fatalities. Laser speed measuring units will be utilized to enforce speed on secondary roads on holidays and summer weekends.

The Tolland Resident Trooper's Office wants everyone to enjoy their holidays and the summer season and if you choose to celebrate with alcohol, we recommend the following tips:

- Plan a safe way home before your celebration begins
- If you plan to get a ride home with someone else, designate a sober driver before any drinking begins
- If you're impaired, use a taxi, call a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation so you are sure to get home safely.

- If you happen to see a drunk driver on the road, don't hesitate – Call 9-1-1
- If you know someone who is about to drive his/her car or ride a motorcycle while impaired, take away the keys and help make other arrangements for a safe ride home.

Town of Tolland Tax Relief Programs

The Tolland Tax Assessor's office is currently accepting applications for tax relief for senior citizens or permanently disabled homeowners from February 1, 2016 through May 15, 2016. There are three separate programs available:

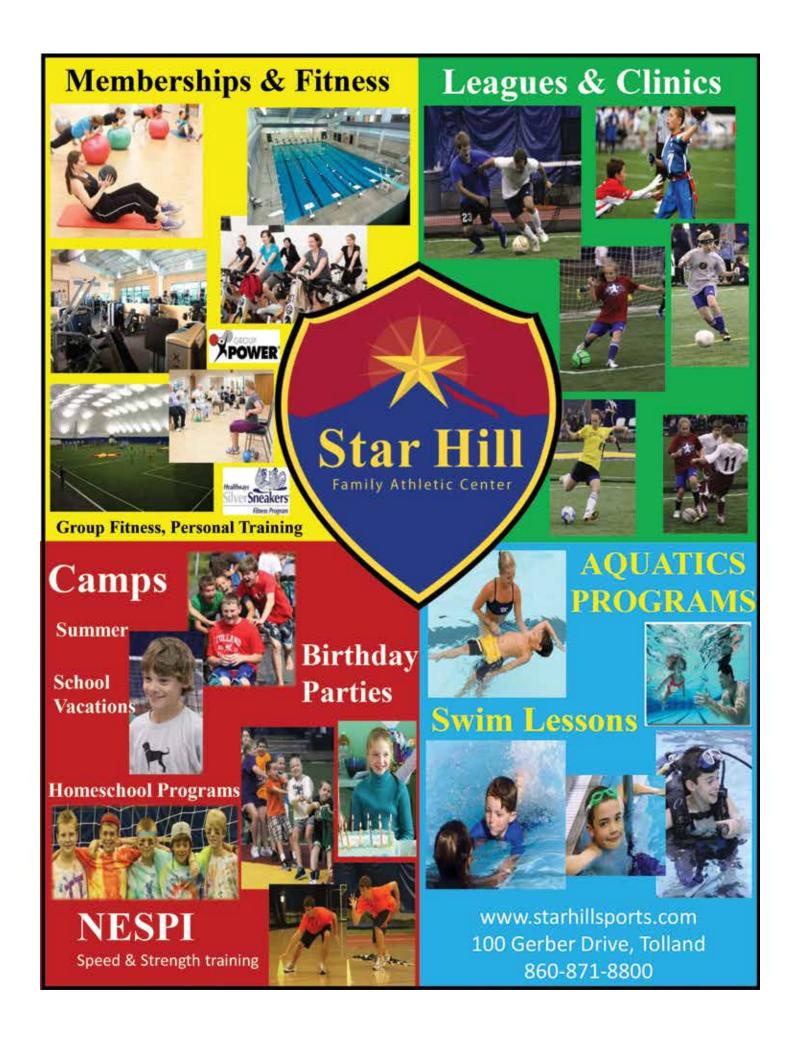
Homeowner Aid for the Elderly and Disabled Program (Circuit Breaker) is a State program which requires homeowners to be 65 years of age as of December 31, 2016, or be 50 years of age or over and the surviving spouse or civil partner of a homeowner who at the time of death had qualified for and was entitled to tax relief, or be eligible to receive permanent total disability benefits under Social Security. Such spouse or civil union partner must have been domiciled with the homeowner at the time of death. You must also have been a resident of Connecticut for at least one year. Your 2015 income, including Social Security, cannot exceed \$42,900 if married or \$35,200 if unmarried.

Tax Deferral for Senior Citizens (Ordinance 25) is a local tax deferment program. This program defers property taxes for low income homeowners while they own their property. When the property is sold or a use change occurs, all back taxes are due with interest. Your maximum income cannot exceed \$52,650 for this program. You must be over 65 years of age or eligible to receive permanent total disability benefits under Social Security.

Local Tax Relief Program for Permanently Disabled and Senior Residents (Ordinance 60) is a tax freeze program. Eligibility requirements are that homeowners must have resided and paid taxes on property since July 1, 2015 or earlier, at least one of the homeowners must be 65 years of age by December 31, 2015 or eligible to receive permanent total disability benefits of the surviving spouse or civil union partner or homeowner who at the time of death qualified for this program. Household income for the year 2015 cannot exceed \$52,650 and total household assets (excluding the home) cannot exceed \$526,500.

The application period for all three programs is February 1, 2016 through May 15, 2016. All applications must be accompanied with proof of 2015 income. For an application or more information, please call the Tolland Assessor's office at 860-871-3650.









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
