# **First Selectwoman's Corner**

Haddam Residents,

On February 8, 2017, Governor Malloy proposed a decrease in revenue funding to the Town of Haddam of -28.9%. The chart on pg. 3 identifies the areas affected just for the town of Haddam. The largest change is a proposed new mandate for all towns to contribute 1/3 to the Teacher's Retirement Pension. The state has been responsible for this since its inception. Legal opinion has been that this is not a municipal responsibility. The legislature will discuss how to handle this in the current session.

In addition, most towns are negatively impacted by this - only a handful of cities are receiving more funds. Killingworth will be decreased by -72.2%. This will be a significant impact for our

community being part of Regional School District 17. The state needs to take ownership of its budget and not pass this additional expense to towns that have managed their finances and budgets. We are still awaiting back up of these numbers and there are many unanswered questions. The figures may change during this session but the result is the same. Haddam cannot afford a property tax increase due to the state shortfall. I will continue to advocate on your behalf as I have testified in Hartford and have met with legislators from our area and others. I encourage all of you to do the same. Respectfully, Lizz Milardo

If you have any question, start there, it very well might have the answer you are looking for.

#### IMPORTANT UPCOMING DEADLINES

#### State of Connecticut Elderly Homeowner's (Circuit Breaker)/ Town of Haddam Elderly and Disabled Tax Relief Program

The filing period for these programs is February 1, 2017 to May 15, 2017. Persons who file must be 65 years of age as of December 31st, 2016 or totally disabled.

#### Additional Veteran's Exemption

The filing period for Additional Veteran's exemptions is February 1, 2017 to October 1, 2017.

Proof of income is required when filing for the above programs. Income includes all taxable, non-taxable income as well as social security income.

\*\*\*Disabled Veterans - When a disabled veteran receiving an exemption reaches the age of 65+ there is an increase in the amount of the exemption regardless of the percent of disability, even if the rating is only is 10%. Please contact the Assessor's Office if you have been receiving a veteran's disability exemption and are age 65 or older.

#### Assessor's Office Quarterly Spotlight - Unregistered Motor Vehicles

We get many inquiries about unregistered/non-registered motor vehicles and whether or not they are taxable.

The answer is yes.

Motor vehicle taxes are based upon ownership not registration. The fact of registration simply makes it easier to know who owns what motor vehicle(s).

According to Connecticut statutes, all motor vehicles (except those specifically exempted) are taxable. Examples of some specifically exempted motor vehicles are: the inventory of auto dealerships and upon proper application and approval of same; a modified motor vehicle for the personal transportation of a handicapped individual; certain commercial vehicles; a Connecticut serviceman's motor vehicle which is garaged out of state, etc.

Persons who own an unregistered/non-registered motor vehicle(s) are required to provide that information to the Assessor's Office, annually, by November 1st.

#### What if the vehicle is registered out-of-state?

If your motor vehicle is registered out of state but you also live and drive that motor vehicle in Connecticut, that vehicle is still taxable.

Connecticut Statutes state that, it must be presumed that a motor vehicle owned by a Connecticut resident and operated from a Connecticut address, is taxable unless evidence (satisfactory to the Assessor) is presented to the contrary. Connecticut Statutes also require that Connecticut registration(s) be obtained for all motor vehicle(s) owned by any person who has established residency for more than 60 days. Only non-residents who are students attending school in Connecticut and non-residents who are active duty members of the U.S. military, who are stationed in Connecticut due to military orders, are exempt.

If you have a vehicle that is unregistered, or registered out-of-state, and primarily garaged here in Haddam, please complete a Personal Property Declaration for the vehicle and file it with the Assessor prior to November 1st annually. This form can be downloaded off of the Assessor's Forms and Applications page on the website or can be obtained in person at the Assessor's Office.

If a vehicle is found to be unregistered, or registered out-of-state, and it is not reported to the Assessor's Office, the vehicle will be added to the personal property of the land owner where the vehicle is situated. In the event that a vehicle is found like this in Haddam, the Assessor will attempt to contact the land owner of record to ascertain the necessary information. If no information is provided, an estimate of value is entered based on the best information available and added to the personal property of the land owner.

It is important to note that Connecticut State Statutes currently allow for a \$1,000 fine for owners of vehicles found to be registered out-of-state but primarily garaged in Connecticut. At our office, we strive to achieve the goal of providing a fair and uniform administration of the local property tax. We are constantly at a loss to explain to taxpayers who comply with the law how their neighbors are allowed to register their vehicles out-ofstate and avoid taxation. It is widely known that for every vehicle that goes "off the books" it creates a tax increase for those who comply with the law.

Haddam residents who have concerns and notice out-of-state plates for a period in excess of 60 days, or unregistered motor vehicles, may write, anonymously, to our office via postal mail or using the "Rumor Busters" link on the front page of the www. haddam.org website. If using the website, please indicate that your request would like to be sent to the attention of the Assessor's Office. If known, please include the name of the person, their Haddam address, type of vehicle, the state the vehicle is registered to and plate number. The Assessor's Office will follow-up on all notifications.

# Winner of Gardens Day Poster Contest Announced

CT's Historic Gardens Announces Winner of 2017 Historic Gardens Day Poster Art Contest ~ Chester, Connecticut artist Leif Nilsson paints the winning image

Connecticut's Historic Gardens, a group of 15 distinctive historic sites and gardens dotted throughout the state, is pleased to announce Connecticut artist Leif Nilsson of Chester, CT as the winner of the fourth annual Historic Gardens Day Poster Art Contest. This contest gives local artists a chance to showcase their talents while advertising CT Historic Gardens Day, an important, statewide event. The group began the contest to encourage Connecticut artists to visit and capture these historically significant homes with beautiful gardens. They hope that these sites will provide inspiring subjects for their art. Along with a cash prize, the winning artist receives widespread exposure - at the annual Connecticut Flower & Garden Show, at each of the 15 Connecticut's Historic Gardens sites throughout the year, and at Connecticut's Historic Gardens Day itself, an event that attracts thousands of garden lovers throughout the state and beyond. This year's Historic Gardens Day takes place on Sunday, June 25, 12-4 pm; visit cthistoricgardens.org for details on activities offered at each site.

Contest winner Leif Nilsson of Chester, CT paints in an impressionistic style, en plein air to capture the beautiful surroundings of the Lower Connecticut River Valley where he calls home. Leif (pronounced Layf) studied art at the Lyme Academy of Fine Arts in Old Lyme, CT from 1980 through 1986, and continued his education on several sojourns to Scandinavia, Asia Minor and Europe. His painting style reflects the influence of early 19th and 20th century painters Monet and Bonnard for their use of color; Pissarro and Vuillard for composition; and Van Gogh for his energy. Leif has been a successful working artist for over 20 years. 

# **Historic Bottle Talk**

#### HISTORIC BOTTLES

On April 9, the Haddam Historical Society joined with antique bottle expert Ed Stanton of Higganum to learn about old and antique bottles. Ed was instrumental in the Thankful Arnold House Museum's archaeological dig in the summer of 2016 and helped identify many of the intact recovered bottles.

He discussed the evolution of bottle manufacturing and showed examples of Connecticut bottles made for area businesses. He also talked about what makes a bottle valuable including



markings, condition and shapes. Attendees brought bottles they may have dug up in the yard, found washed ashore or plucked from the privy pit.

# **Outhouse Tour**

On Saturday, April 29th, from 1 pm to 5pm, the Haddam Historical Society will host a historic outhouse tour of seven area privies in Haddam and Higganum.

The self-guided tour will start at the Thankful Arnold House Museum where the newly interpreted four-hole backhouse will be unveiled. The tour will highlight a variety of "necessaries" including some with a plaster interior, four-holes and even a basement. Outhouses on the tour are found at the John Brainerd House, Levi Ward Tavern, Ezra Kelsey House, Merwin House, Sears-Usher House, Nathan Fuller House and Thankful Arnold House.

Tickets are \$10 per person and can be purchased the day of the tour at the Thankful Arnold House Museum, 14 Hayden Hill Road where visitors will pick up their maps and visit Thankful's necessary.

# **Age-Related Vision Loss**

Age-Related Macular Degeneration (AMD) is the leading cause of severe vision loss in adults over the age of 50. This eye disease occurs when there are changes to the macula, a small portion of the retina that's located on the inside back layer of the eye. Commonly, older people develop macular degeneration as a natural part of the aging process. AMD causes loss of central vision and it can occur in two forms: wet and dry.

With macular degeneration, you may experience symptoms such as blurriness, dark areas or distortion of your central vision, or permanent loss of your central vision. It usually does not affect your peripheral vision. For example, with advanced macular degeneration you could be able to see the outline of a clock, yet you may not be able to see the hands of the clock to tell what time it is.

The majority of people with macular degeneration experience the dry form, which does not have a known treatment, but many people benefit from a vitamin regimen. Unfortunately, vision loss cannot be reversed. The less common wet form may respond to lasers and medical injections if caught and treated early. Smoking and high blood pressure are often associated with the wet form of macular degeneration.

If you have been diagnosed with dry macular degeneration, you should use a chart called an Amsler grid every day to monitor your vision. Dry macular degeneration can quickly change into the more damaging wet form. If you notice any change of vision, you should contact your ophthalmologist immediately.

# **Haddam Volunteer Fire Company**



During their weekly drill on March 20, members of Haddam Volunteer Fire Company practiced advancing hose lines through a smoked-out room and flowing wet and dry foam from a compressed air foam system (CAFS). CAFS is used in firefighting to deliver fire retardant foam to extinguish a fire. CAFS notably extinguishes fire faster than water, it saves water, and since the material weighs less, it helps with firefighters' fatigue. Members also learned how to operate the foam system on the new Engine 6-13, which will go into service this spring.

"The drill allowed firefighters to physically feel and see the difference between flowing water, and flowing wet foam and dry foam," said HVFC Captain Richard Zanelli. "Wet foam is used for fire suppression, whereas dry foam is used for exposure protection."


