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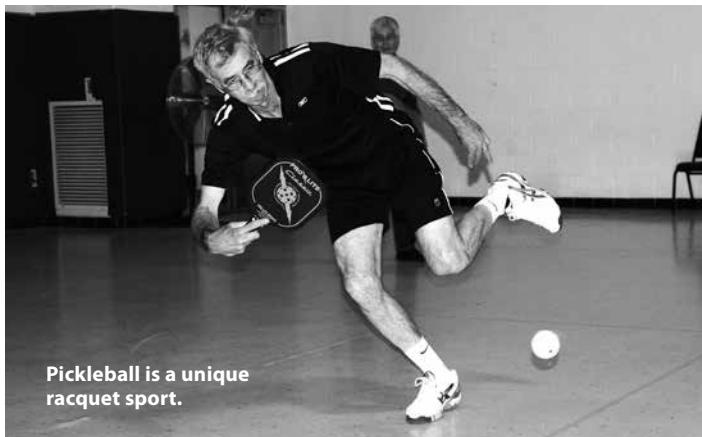

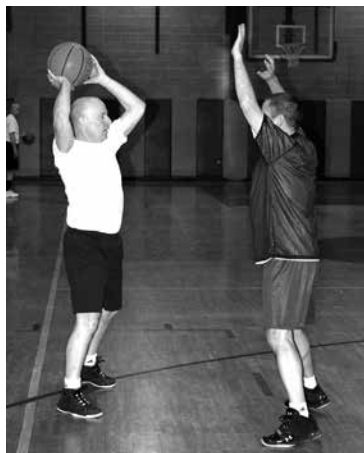

Tolland Assessor's Office

NOTICE TO TOLLAND RESIDENTS

The Tolland Assessor's office is currently receiving applications from individuals who are entitled to the following exemptions:

Any person who has been declared legally blind is entitled to a \$3000 exemption. Proof must be filed with the Assessor. Handicapped individuals who drive special equipped motor vehicles must apply annually to have their vehicle exempted from property taxes. Filing deadline is January 31, 2018.

Totally disabled persons who are receiving permanent total disability under the Federal Old Age Survivors and Disability Insurance Program are entitled to an exemption of \$1,000 of property assessment on property that they own. The filing deadline is December 1, 2017.

All persons filing for land assessment reductions under Public Act 490, farm, forest and open space for the first time must submit an application to the Assessor between September 1 and October 31, 2017. A State Forester must certify Forest Land applications before the Department of Environmental Protection will issue a Forest Certificate. New for the 2016 Grand List, Open Space applications no longer need Planning and Zoning approval and can be filed directly with the Assessor's office. Owners of land already under Public Act 490 that has not changed in use or acreage do not have to file annual applications with the Assessor.

Personal Property forms will be mailed out late September to those known individuals having taxable personal property. Taxable property consists of all unregistered motor vehicles,

campers and horses/ponies and construction equipment.

All Business located in Tolland are required to file an annual Personal Property Declaration. Any Business having personal property to declare and who have not received forms by October 1st, should contact the Assessor's office and forms will be mailed.

All Personal Property forms must be returned to the Assessor's office during October, or a 25% penalty will be applied according to State law. All Personal Property not declared and discovered by the Assessor will be valued by the Assessor. All appeal rights will be waived. If you closed your business during the past year, you must notify the Assessor in written form to have your account removed from the Grand List.



WHAT IS 2-1-1?

PLANNING FOR TOLLAND’S FUTURE - IN 1964!

What was on the minds of Tolland townspeople in the early 1960s? Tolland created its first town plan in 1964, at a time when the population was just under 3,000 (compared to 15,000 today). The “Comprehensive Plan” had two overarching objectives: “Develop the identity of Tolland as a complete community, maintaining a desirable balance between residential, commercial and industrial growth” and “Provide for maximum utilization of Town’s assets without sacrificing its general character.”

The plan called for commercial and industrial development and planned for new schools and town facilities, among other topics. A survey revealed overwhelming support for the town to acquire land for recreational uses. This and other previous town plans can be viewed on the town’s website at: <https://www.tolland.org/planning-development/pages/planning>. As we begin to update our most recent “Plan of Conservation and Development” (POCD), it can be useful to revisit past policies and priorities. This fall, the Planning and Zoning Commission will begin

discussions on how to proceed with the POCD update.

5 YEAR/\$5 MILLION ROAD IMPROVEMENT

PLAN UPDATE

Phase V of the 5 year/\$5 million Road Improvement Plan was recently completed. Browns Bridge Road and Grahaber Road (Bonair Hill Rd to the Town line) were chip sealed. Buff Cap Road, Grahaber Road (Shenipsit Lake Rd to Bonair Hill Rd), Hunter Road, Mountain Spring Road (Old Post Rd to 84 Overpass), Old Stafford Road (Susan Dr to Town line), and Sugar Hill Road (Bakos Road to Town line) were crack sealed. The following roads were repaved; Cider Mill Road (partial), Doyle Road, Fish

& Game Road, Hilltop Road, Lakeview Heights/Lakeview Heights Ext, Loehr Road, and Mountain Spring Road (Tolland Stage Rd to Old Post Rd).

WINTER PARKING BANS

Residents are reminded of the winter parking ban in effect from November 1st through April 15th. Overnight parking is not allowed on public streets or municipal parking lots between the hours of midnight and 6:00 am. A parking ban may also be declared if a significant snow event is forecast or in progress. For

information on whether a parking ban has been declared (beyond the midnight to 6 am ban) tune to WFSB (CBS), WTNH (ABC) or WVIT (NBC). You can also get updates on our Facebook page @Tolland Works.

SNOW REMOVAL

Snow and ice may not be plowed, blown or shoveled into the street. This practice presents a hazard to passing motorists and may contribute to unsafe road conditions. Please remember that you will also be held responsible for any actions of a contractor hired by you.

MAILBOXES

Your mailbox should be in good repair, firmly attached to a solid post and properly placed so no part of it is over the pavement. It will have to withstand countless tons of flying snow this winter and it may require periodic maintenance. If a mailbox or post is pushed over or damaged as a result of snow or slush coming off a snowplow, it is considered a winter hazard and the Town will not repair or replace the mailbox or post. The height of the bottom of the mailbox to the street should be between 42" - 48" and the mailbox door should be 6 to 8 inches back from the front face of the curb or road edge.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING TOTE PLACEMENT

Residents are reminded that garbage and recycling totes should be placed within 18" of the curb or roadside. Please know that they are to be placed on your property, not in the street. Doing so not

only creates a public safety issue but also hinders snow removal operations. The Town is not responsible for damage done to totes by plows.

PORTABLE BASKETBALL HOOPS

Portable basketball hoops and similar items should NOT be in the Town Right-of-Way. The Town is not responsible for damage done by plows to such items left in the Town Right-of-Way.

CATCH BASINS & STORM INLETS

Help minimize street flooding by shoveling snow and ice from in front of the storm inlet nearest your house. This includes keeping catch basin grates free of leaves and other debris all year long!

SIDEWALK CLEARING

By Town Ordinance it is the responsibility of owners and occupants of buildings and vacant lots to remove snow, sleet and ice from public sidewalks abutting their property within 24 hours after the storm has concluded. Failure to comply with this ordinance may result in a fine. Please remember that the final snow plow pass is not made until after the storm has concluded. Your cooperation in clearing sidewalks is an essential safety measure for pedestrians using the sidewalks.

CHRISTMAS TREES

Tolland does not offer curb side pick up of Christmas trees. However, Christmas trees may be dropped off at Crandall's II, near the Lodge driveway, from December 26th through January 26th.

Is Your Street Number Visible from the Road & Safety Tips

RESIDENTS AND BUSINESS OWNERS ARE ASKED TO PLEASE CHECK THEIR STREET ADDRESS NUMBERS.

Can they be seen from the road? Are they faded, too small, overgrown or missing? If so, please update your numbers so that they are visible from both directions. The Fire Department offers blue reflective street address signs for \$16. The signs measure 6" wide and 18" long, your house numbers are placed on both sides and the blue coating is also reflective. These signs will make your address easier to find and they also make great gifts! For an order form please visit www.tollandfire.org, click the Forms button on the left. Questions? SMOKE ALARM SENSE

Install and maintain smoke alarms on EVERY level of your home, outside each sleeping area and inside each bedroom. For the best protection, interconnect the alarms. When one sounds, they all sound. TEST all smoke alarms MONTHLY.

REPLACING YOUR SMOKE ALARMS:

- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old. To determine the age of your smoke alarm, look at the back where you will find the date of manufacture. Smoke alarms should be replaced 10 years from the date of manufacture.
- Immediately replace any smoke alarm that does not respond properly when tested.
- Replace combination smoke-carbon monoxide alarms according to the manufacturer's recommendations.

ESCAPE PLANNING

Create a home escape plan AND practice it with all family members! Your ability to get out depends on advanced warning from smoke alarms and advanced planning. In 2014, there were an estimated 367,500 reported home structure fires and 2,745 associated civilian deaths in the United States. Fire can spread rapidly through your home, leaving you as little as one or two minutes to escape safely once the alarm sounds. A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire. Install smoke alarms in every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.

- Bring together everyone in your household and make a plan.
- Walk through your home and inspect all possible exits and escape routes.
- Households with children should consider drawing a floor plan of your home, marking two ways out of each room, including windows and doors. Also, mark the location of each smoke alarm.

For easy planning:

- Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows
- Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- All windows and doors should open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button monthly to make sure each alarm is working.
- Pick a meeting place outside. It should be in front of your home.
- Everyone will meet at the meeting place.
- Make sure your house or building number can be seen from the street.
- Talk about your plan with everyone in your home.
- Teach everyone to dial 9-1-1.
- Practice your home fire escape drill!

WOOD & PELLET STOVE SAFETY

As the temperature drops outside, wood and pellet stoves begin to be used inside the home. They offer warmth and give our homes that cozy feeling. What you may not realize is that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fires during the winter months. Below are some tips to help keep you safe:

- Have a QUALIFIED professional install stoves, chimney connectors, and chimneys.
- Stoves should be listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- In wood stoves, burn only DRY, seasoned wood. In pellet stoves, burn only dry, seasoned wood pellets.
- Have your chimney and stove INSPECTED and cleaned by a certified chimney sweep every fall just before heating season.
- CLEAN the inside of your stove periodically using a wire brush.
- Keep a CLOSE EYE on children whenever a wood or pellet stove is being used. Remind them to stay at least 3 feet away from the stove.
- Stoves need SPACE. Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away from the stove.
- INSTALL and maintain carbon monoxide alarms (CO) outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. For the best protection, interconnect the CO alarms. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Allow ashes to COOL before disposing of them. Place ashes in a covered metal container. Keep the container at least 10 feet away from the home and other buildings.

CARBON MONOXIDE

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely. In

the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel are potential sources of carbon monoxide. Vehicles or generators running in an attached garage can also produce dangerous levels of carbon monoxide.

Facts & figures

- The dangers of CO exposure depend on a number of variables, including the victim's health and activity level. Infants, pregnant women, and people with physical conditions that limit their body's ability to use oxygen (i.e. emphysema, asthma, heart disease) can be more severely affected by lower concentrations of CO than healthy adults would be.
- A person can be poisoned by a small amount of CO over a longer period of time or by a large amount of CO over a shorter amount of time.
- In 2010, U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 80,100 non-fire CO incidents in which carbon monoxide was found, or an average of nine such calls per hour. The number of incidents increased 96 percent from 40,900 incidents reported in 2003. This increase is most likely due to the increased use of CO detectors, which alert people to the presence of CO.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Children dressed in costumes excitedly running door to door to trick-or-treat, festive decorations like glowing jack-o-lanterns, paper ghosts and dried cornstalks adorning front porches - these are some of the classic hallmarks of Halloween that make the holiday special for kids and adults alike.

Unfortunately, these Halloween symbols and activities can also present lurking fire risks that have the potential to become truly scary. But by planning ahead, you can help make this Halloween a fire-safe one. Taking simple fire safety precautions like keeping decorations far away from open flames and using battery-operated candles or glow-sticks in jack-o-lanterns can help ensure your holiday remains festive and fun!

- Keep decorations far away from open flames and other heat sources like lightbulbs and heaters. Remember to keep all of your home's exits clear of decorations so nothing blocks escape routes.
- Use battery-operated candles or glow sticks in jack-o'-lanterns.
- Use flashlights as alternatives to candles or torch lights when decorating walkways and yards. They are much safer for trick-or-treaters whose costumes may brush up against

the lighting as they walk to from your door.

- Choose costumes that don't require long-trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so they can clearly see where he or she is walking to prevent trips or falls near dangerous or flammable items.
- Talk to your children and remind them to stay away from open flames, including jack-o'-lanterns with candles inside. Provide them with flashlights or glow sticks to carry for lighting as part of their costume.

THANKSGIVING

For most, the kitchen is the heart of the home, especially during the holidays. From testing family recipes to decorating cakes and cookies, everyone enjoys being part of the preparations. So keeping fire safety top of mind in the kitchen during this joyous but hectic time is important, especially when there's a lot of activity and people at home. As you start preparing your holiday schedule and organizing that large family feast, remember, by following a few simple safety tips you can enjoy time with your loved ones and keep yourself and your family safer from fire.

- Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires, followed by Christmas Day and Christmas Eve.
- Unattended cooking was by far the leading contributing factor in cooking fires and fire deaths.

Safety tips

- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children - up high in a locked cabinet.
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.

Help Us Help You!

Tolland Fire Department is currently seeking additional Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) to join our volunteer ranks. If you currently hold an EMT license or would like to train to become an EMT please consider volunteering for your community.

- Did you know that the Tolland Fire Department is a combination department? A combination department means that both career and volunteer members work together to provide emergency services to the residents, businesses and visitors of Tolland. Our small career staff is on duty Monday through Friday covering the hours of 7:00 am to 4:30 pm. Our volunteer staff covers nights, weekends and major holidays. This type of coverage is a resourceful and cost-effective way to provide top-level services to the Town. Career staff may be called into work to cover major emergencies or during severe weather events. We are grateful that there are still a handful of volunteers that supplement the career staff during the daytime hours.
- The Department operates two ambulances and responds to emergency calls 24/7/365. Handling approximately 170 calls for fire/medical emergency service each month.
- We have a flexible duty schedule in which volunteer EMTs can sign-up for night or weekend shifts. This schedule allows EMTs to fit volunteering into their personal schedules.
- With the increased emergency call volume we are starting to burn-out our core membership. If we could recruit a few more people to assist us we can lighten the load of our members, possibly hold onto these well-trained EMTs and extend their years of service to the community.
- Unfortunately with limited budgeting we have been unable to

increase the number of career staff. Eventually we would like to have enough career staff to cover from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm. This schedule would allow the career staff to cover when our volunteers are getting ready for their normal workday as well as giving them a chance to return home and get settled in from their day. At this time this goal is unobtainable with our current small career staff of only six.

- Additions to the Town's population both residential and commercial over the past years have affected our membership as well. Members have moved away from volunteering for a variety of reasons such as work and family obligations. Bottom line is we need additional volunteer EMTs to keep delivering our high-level of service. We need to plan for Tolland's future, now.
- Volunteer EMTs often reflect on their service to their neighbors and community as a personally fulfilling and extremely rewarding experience.

STATE LAW: Move Over or Slow Down for Stopped Emergency Vehicles



Flashing red, blue and yellow lights are a familiar sight on highways and Emergency Responders (Police, Fire and Tow Truck Operators) are asking motorists to "Move Over" and "Slow Down" to provide enough room for them to safely do their jobs.

When lights are flashing Emergency Responders are working in extremely hazardous and sometimes stressful conditions using very limited space. Close calls are beginning to become the norm as motorists speed by emergency scenes. A split second could mean the difference in everyone going home safely or a responder being injured or killed.

Drivers are reminded that they must move over one lane and slow down if they see emergency vehicles and tow trucks stopped on the shoulder of a highway with their lights flashing. If all lanes are full and drivers can't move over, they are required to slow down as they pass the scene. Connecticut passed its Move Over law in 2009, fines for breaking the law start at \$181.

TOLLAND ALERT

Get alerted about emergencies and other important community news by signing up for Tolland Alert, our Emergency Notification Program. This emergency notification system enables Tolland Public Safety officials to provide you with critical information quickly in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons, and evacuation of buildings or neighborhoods. This Emergency Notification Program is independent from “Tolland Notifications” (formerly E-Blast) the Town’s routine community email delivery system.

Once signed up, you will receive time-sensitive messages wherever you specify, such as your home, cell, or business phone, email, text messages, hearing impaired receiving devices, and more. You pick where, you pick how.

and click on the Tolland Alert button (as seen below). The button appears on the upper left hand corner of the homepage.



Once you click the button scroll to the bottom of the page to find “Don’t have an account? Sign up”

1. Click “Sign up” to create your profile. Please retain your profile information in order to update your account in the future. We do not have access to profiles.
2. Once you have created your profile, you will be asked to select how you’d like to receive Alerts (Telephone/Text/Email). Choose the method in which you wish

to receive alerts AND the order in which you would prefer to receive them.*

3. Next you will be able to choose the Tolland location(s) that are important to you. Such as your home address, your child’s school address, etc. You may add multiple Tolland addresses.
4. Next you will be asked to select ALL Important Community Alerts or only Specific types of alerts which may be of interest to you.
5. Click Finish

**Please Note: Once you elected the method in which you wish to receive Alerts (Phone/Text/Email) when you begin to receiving Alerts, the system will continue to send the alert to your 2nd and 3rd choices until you reply that you received the message.*

The information that you provide will be used for notification purposes only. We will not distribute your telephone numbers or email addresses to any vendor or other organization.

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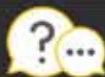

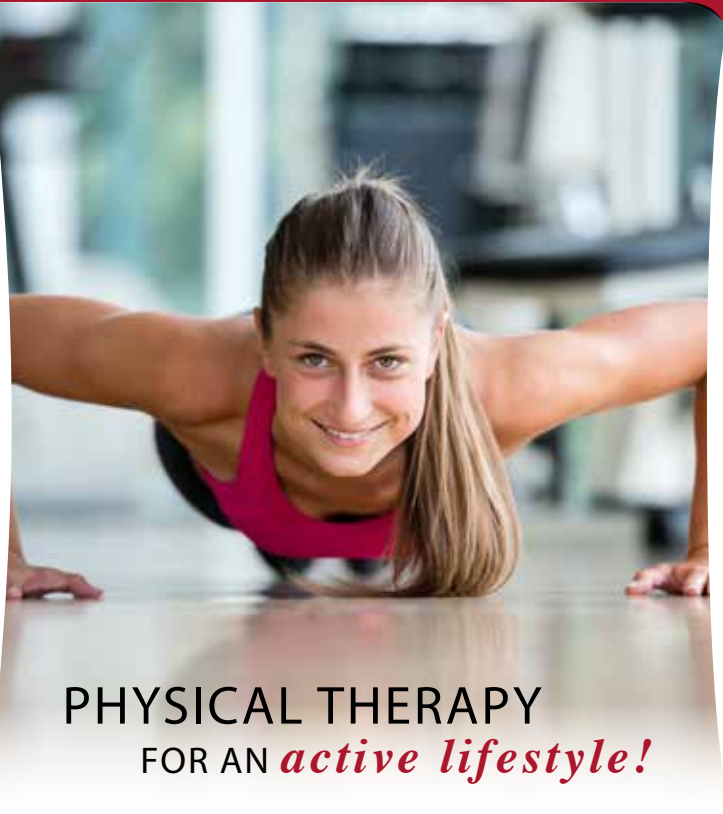

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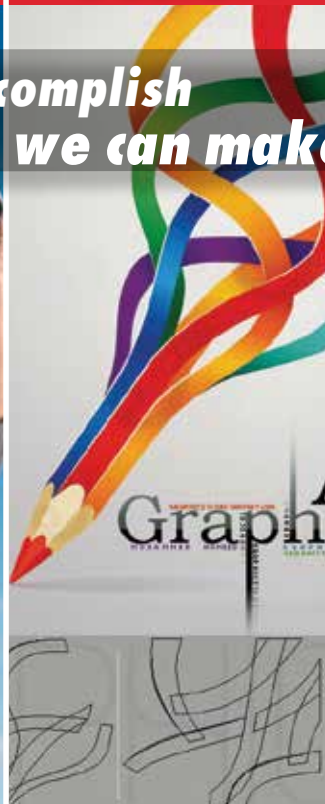
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The Arts Center of Tolland Celebrates 20 Years

First and foremost is our anniversary and a new exhibit! A photo exhibit, "Landscapes, Birds, People" by Bill Byers will run until October 28. You can view

this exhibit on Saturdays from 10-2 and Wednesdays from 2-5 through October 28. Open to the public at no charge.

Twenty years ago Arts of Tolland concluded a two-year renovation of the old 1879 town hall and officially christened the antique building as the Arts Center of Tolland. If you haven't visited the Center before, now is a terrific time to check it out, including the restored original tin ceiling.

The Kenn Morr Band will perform at the Arts Center on Friday, October 13. The show begins at 7. Tickets are \$10, or \$8 for members of Arts of Tolland. Inspired by such artists

as Dylan, Van Morrison, and Gordon Lightfoot, Kenn Morr's music has an elemental quality to it - water, earth, relationships, change, and loss.

A gallery of artwork by Andrea Wisnewski and Kathleen Lepak will open on Saturday, November 4, with a reception at 1 pm. If you can't make it on the 4th, the gallery will be open on Saturdays from 10-2 and Wednesdays from 2-5 through December 2 (except Thanksgiving week). Free admission.

Art Mart, AOT's annual sale of artist-decorated fresh evergreen wreaths and select arts and crafts will be open on Friday, December 1 from 3 to 5, and Saturday, December 2, from 10-4.

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About Tolland

The Town of Tolland, first settled before 1715, covers an area of forty-one square miles and is situated twenty miles northeast of Hartford, CT. Tolland, originally a part of the Town of Windsor, was settled by people who felt that Windsor was becoming overcrowded and that their growing families were in need of homesteads. People had started moving to the east, to lands that had been purchased from the Native Americans.

On April 18, 1713, a committee was appointed to lay out a settlement, and the General Assembly was petitioned to charter it as a town. When the Charter was obtained in 1715, the town was named after an English town in Somerset, and was incorporated as Connecticut's 49th town in May 1722.

In 1785, Tolland County was organized by action of the General Assembly and Tolland was designated the county seat. The costs of building the first courthouse and a jail were raised by town subscription. This jail (and three later replacements) proved to be unsatisfactory. The existing jail, of stone construction, was erected in 1856 and served the county continually until 1968 when the state decided to discontinue its use. In 1969 this jail and the 1893 jailer's home, became town property and are leased to The Tolland Historical Society, and used as a museum. A new courthouse replaced the original in 1822 at the center of the town green.

It is recognized as one of five examples of early civic architecture in Connecticut. The Tolland Green Historic District was placed on the National Register in June 1997. Several of the important buildings within the District have been adapted to serve modern needs while retaining the flavor of the older village.

The Hicks Municipal Building was built as the Ratcliffe Hicks Memorial School in 1908. The Hicks - Stearns Homestead is also a museum. The Tolland Board of Education building started life in 1830 as Tolland County Bank. Directly across from the Municipal Building the town's original 1879 Town Hall has become the Tolland Arts Center. The Courthouse recently became a museum of the Tolland Historical Society and leases the first floor to the French Canadian Genealogy Library.

Until November 1973, the legislative body of the town was the Town Meeting. At that time, the new Town Charter provided for the legislative functions to be shared by the town Meeting and the Board of Selectmen. The Town Council became the primary legislative body under Charter revisions approved at a referendum on November 7, 1984. Under provisions of the Charter and Connecticut General Statutes, the Planning and Zoning Commission and the inland Wetlands Commission also have legislative authority.



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
