



# Park & Beach Information

#### McCOOK POINT PARK, HOLE N' WALL, & CINI PARK

Open daily from 8:00 a.m. to sunset. Pets are permitted on beaches from the Tuesday after Labor Day until the Friday before Memorial Day ONLY; must be under owners control at all times and it is the owner's responsibility to clean-up all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year. \*\*

Restrooms will remain open until mid-November as weather permits. Contact the Parks and Recreation office for Pavilion reservations/availability. All are Tobacco Free Parks.

State Statute 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.

#### \*\*NO PETS May 24 - Sept 1 AT ANY BEACH FACILITY

STATE REGULATION (Public Swimming Area Regulations) Section 19a-36-B61 (10) states domestic animals shall be prohibited in the water and the land immediately adjacent to the water of a public swimming area when the public swimming area is open for use.

#### **BOARDWALK CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

Construction on the western half of the Niantic Bay Boardwalk is tentatively scheduled to start this spring. As part of the construction, a portion of the upper parking lot at McCook will be closed and access to the Hole in the Wall Beach at times will be restricted. # McCOOK POINT PARK, HOLE N' WALL, CINI PARK PARKING PERMITS

Parking permits will go on sale Monday, May 5th at the Parks & Recreation Office. Permits will be sold from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday, throughout the season. From May 22 through June 26 the office will extend the office hours to 7:00 pm on Thursdays. To obtain a season permit,

all applicants must present their car registration at the time of purchase. If you are new to town, please bring your tax bill or lease to expedite the process.

PLEASE NOTE: To avoid lines; Mail in a copy of your registration (to Parks & Rec office at 41 Society Rd., Niantic, CT 06357), a copy of your latest tax bill (if you are an East Lyme resident and your vehicle is not registered to East Lyme/Niantic address), the applicable payment (check should be made payable to the TOWN OF EAST LYME) and a self addressed stamped envelope and we will process your request and mail your beach pass to you.

Resident Seasonal add'l vehicles - \$25.00\*

\*Patrons must be in the same family with the car registered to same address

Senior Rate (age 62+) - \$15.00

Non-Resident Seasonal - \$100.00

Resident Day - \$5.00

Non-Resident Day - \$20.00

On Saturday, May 24th (Memorial Day Weekend) all vehicles must have a parking permit to enter the parks through September 1st (Labor Day). Park hours are 8:00 am to dusk. Lifeguards are on duty daily from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, beginning tentatively June 21st through mid-August. Per the East Lyme Parks & Recreation Commission Policy; beach sticker MUST be adhered to lower left driver side windshield. If sticker is not adhered to windshield admittance to parks and beaches will be denied. NO EXCEPTIONS!

#### **PAVILION RENTAL**

The pavilion is available for full day or half day rental (9:00 am to 1:00 pm or 1:30 pm until dusk) during the summer season (Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day) for East Lyme/Niantic residents/taxpayers. Rentals are also available before Memorial Day and after Labor Day and Non-Residents are able to rent during that period. Please contact the Parks & Recreation office for information and availability.

#### Boardwalk Benches Available

The East Lyme Public Trust Foundation Inc., in cooperation with the East Lyme Parks and Recreation Department, has announced the solicitation of 50 additional park benches. These benches will be added to the western half of Niantic Bay Overlook (the Boardwalk) once reconstruction has been completed. Plans for the new Boardwalk have been approved by the Zoning Commission with construction currently slated for March through December. There is a limit of fifty benches available at this time. They will be assigned to the first fifty completed and approved applications.

These commemorative benches have proven to be a popular addition to the East Lyme landscape and are a wonderful way to support the Town Park and to honor someone special.


To cap the summer we will be holding our second annual Back To School Family Campout Night at McCook Point Park







# Town Clerk's Office - Dog Owners

The Town Clerk's Office is reminding dog owners that they must register their dogs by June 30.

All dogs 6 months of age or older must be licensed. Fees for neutered or spayed dogs are \$8.00 and for dogs that are not neutered or not spayed, the fee is \$19.

A certificate of neutering or spaying from a licensed vet must be presented when licensing a dog for the first time.

An up-to-date certificate of rabies vaccination must be presented before a dog can be licensed. The rabies tag is not acceptable.

To license by mail, send all required information (which will be returned) along with a check made payable to Town of East Lyme and mail to East Lyme Town Clerk, PO Box 519, Niantic, CT 06357. We do require a self-addressed stamped envelope. Postage on the return envelope is 68 cents for the return of the license.

A penalty of \$1 per month will be assessed for payments received after July 1. For information, call the Town Clerk's Office at 860-739-6931, x 120.

# Public Works Single Stream Recycling

In single stream recycling, recyclables are separated at the processing plant and not at your home. This means that all recycling can be placed in a single container separate from the trash container and can be compacted resulting in reduced transportation costs.

No other containers are used for recycling. A gray recycling can is the only one that will be picked up. Recycling collection has been moved to a cycle of every other week. To view the single stream recycling calendar visit our web site at www.eltownhall.com/public works.

Single stream accepts all plastics with the exception of plastic bags and Styrofoam. As with your trash can, the recycling can must have a four-foot separation from other objects including your trash can.

# Facebook Depressive Disorder?

How often do you look at Facebook? Occasionally? Daily? Every 10 minutes, to see what friends are up to? Who are your friends? The people you actually speak to occasionally and enjoy viewing their family pictures? Or every friend of a friend who will accept your invite, so you can stay on top of what's happening out there? Research into the effects of Facebook (and other social media) shows that people who spend a lot of time on these sites often become less satisfied with their lives. They struggle more with depression and loneliness. Not just that lonely and depressed people use Facebook, but that their use actually increases these depressive feelings. Increased envy, wanting to have/look/be like those happy, celebrating people in the pictures also occurs. Yes, we see the posts complaining of a bad day, but they are far outnumbered by the posts and pictures of happy times with friends, everyone smiling and having a great time. We start to think that others live that kind of life, while we are still struggling with work, school, relationships, or boredom. Social media can be a great way to keep in touch, especially with those we can't get together with often. But sometimes the best way to interact with friends is to shut down and call (not text), or get together in person.



#### Playing it Safe in the Sun

The sun sends us heat and light and is beneficial to our health. Ninety percent of our Vitamin D comes

from sunlight hitting our skin but too much sun can cause skin cancer. It is important to balance the benefits and risks of exposure to sunshine and use sunscreen correctly.

#### 4 Steps to Playing it Safe in the Sun

#### 1. Avoid Too Much Sun:

Wear protective clothing (shirt, hat, pants, sunglasses) when in the sun for more than 15 minutes; seek shade as much as possible; avoid mid-day sun.

#### 2. Apply Sunscreen to Exposed Skin:

Apply 15 minutes before sun exposure; apply a generous coat and reapply every 2 hours or more often if getting wet or sweating heavily.

#### 3. Choose Sunscreen Wisely:

Look at the label. Choose a sunscreen that: Offers broad spectrum (UV-A & UV-B) protection, Is rated as SPF 15 or 30, Contains zinc oxide as the active ingredient or as a blend with titanium dioxide. These mineral blockers are preferable to chemical absorbers. Choose water resistant.

#### 4. Do Get Some Sun Every Day:

Your body needs a daily dose of Vitamin D from the sun. For most people 15 minutes of sunshine without sunscreen

will not damage the skin and will give you enough Vitamin D.

# How Do I Choose A Sunscreen?

Read the label for the following features: SPF 15 or 30: The SPF



(sun protection factor) is an indication of how much extra time you can spend in the sun and not get a sun burn. For example, if it normally takes you 1 hour to get a sunburn, using a SPF 15 sunscreen will prevent a burn for 15 hours. But that is not realistic as the sunscreen will wear off from swimming, sweating and contact with other surfaces. Proper use of a SPF 15 or 30 sunscreen is usually sufficient to protect the skin. A higher SPF is not needed and would still need to be reapplied just as often.

# Should I Apply Sunscreen To My Infant Or Young child?

For babies under six months of age, it is best to shelter them from the sun with hats, clothing and shade. If there is sun exposure, use sunscreen sparingly over small areas of exposed skin. Beyond 6 months of age you can use sunscreen normally but avoid the area around the eyes because children may wipe it into their eyes and cause irritation.

# Health Info - Shingles

#### What are Shingles?

Shingles, also called herpes zoster or zoster, is a painful skin rash caused by the varicella zoster virus (VZV). VZV is the same virus that causes chickenpox. After a person recovers from chickenpox, the virus stays in the body. Usually the virus does not cause any problems; however, the virus can reappear years later, causing shingles.

#### What do shingles look like?

Shingles usually starts as a rash on one side of the face or body. The rash starts as blisters that scab after 3 to 5 days. The rash usually clears within 2 to 4 weeks. Before the rash develops, there is often pain, itching, or tingling in the area where the rash will develop. Other symptoms of shingles can include fever, headache, chills, and upset stomach.

#### Is there a vaccine to prevent shingles?

Yes. Zostavax, made by Merck, was licensed May 25, 2006 by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for use in people 60 years old and older to prevent shingles. This is a one-time vaccination. Zostavax does not treat shingles or post-herpetic neuralgia (pain after the rash is gone) once it develops. How effective is the FDA-approved vaccine?


