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
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# First Selectman's Corner

Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year. State Statue 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.







# Are You Prepared for a Major Storm?

East Lyme Public Safety wants to know.... Are you prepared for a Major Storm?

To prepare you should take the following measures:

# **BUILD YOUR DISASTER SUPPLY KIT**

A disaster supply kit is simply a collection of basic items your household may need in the event of an emergency. Try to assemble your kit well in advance of an emergency. You may have to evacuate at a moment's notice and take essentials with you. You will probably not have time to search for the supplies you need or shop for them. You may need to survive on your own after an emergency. This means having your own food, water and other supplies in sufficient quantity to last for at least 72 hours. Local officials and relief workers will be on the scene after a disaster but they cannot reach everyone immediately. You could get help in hours or it might take days.

# A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least 3 days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for per sonal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can food opener
- Local maps
- Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger

# Once you have gathered the basic supplies, you want to consider adding the following items:

Prescription medications and glasses

Infant formula and diapers

Pet food and extra water for your pet

Cash or travelers checks and change

Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a waterproof container

Emergency reference material such as a first aid kit Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider extra bedding if you live in cold-weather climates Complete change of clothing including a long sleeve shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes.

Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper

When diluted, nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color-safe or bleach with added cleaners

Fire extinguisher

Matches in waterproof container

Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items

Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils

Paper and pencil

Books, games, puzzles or activities for children

Additionally, basic services such as electricity, gas, water, sewage treatment and telephones may be cut off for days or even a week, or longer. Your supply kit should contain items to help you during these outages.

- Know your surroundings
- Learn the elevation of your property and whether the land is flood-prone. This will help you know how your property will be affected when storm surge or tidal flooding are forecasted
- Identify levees and dams in your area and determine whether they pose a hazard to you
- Learn community hurricane evacuation routes and how to find higher ground. Determine where you would go and how you would get there if you needed to evacuate
- Make plans to secure your property
- Consider permanent storm shutters which offer the best protection for windows. A second, less expensive option is 5/8" marine plywood, cut to fit and ready to install. Tape does not prevent windows from breaking
- Install straps or additional clips to securely fasten your roof to the frame structure. This will reduce roof damage
- Be sure trees and shrubs around your home are well trimmed so they are more wind resistant
- Clear loose and clogged rain gutters and downspouts
- Reinforce your garage doors; if wind enters a garage it can cause dangerous and expensive structural damage
- Plan to bring in all outdoor furniture, decorations, garbage cans and anything else not tied down
- Determine how and where to secure your boat
- Install a generator for emergencies. Remember, never run generators inside!

# Outdoor Stormwater / Environmental Classroom at the Hole-in-the-Wall Beach Parking Lot



On Thursday May 29, 2014, approximately 189 third grade students from all three of East Lyme's public elementary schools took a field trip to the town's "Outdoor Stormwater Classroom" at the Hole-in-the-Wall Beach parking lot.

The East Lyme Engineering Department and Public Schools worked together to create the educational day that allowed students in third grade to rotate through five stations to learn about recycling, native plants & soils, shoreline species & habitats, sources of pollution & pollution prevention, and the latest technologies & techniques available to treat and reduce stormwater runoff. The information covered at the Outdoor Classroom complemented the students' indoor classroom science units and was presented to the students in a fun and

friendly atmosphere.

The educational day started a few years ago as a pilot project for two classes who toured the various stormwater treatment practices installed at the Hole-in-the-Wall Beach parking lot. Now the annual event has been expanded to include the stormwater treatment tours led by East Lyme Public Works and CT DEEP, a session about native plants & soils led by a Master Gardener and a Natural Resource Specialist, and Enviroscape pollution models led by CT DEEP, an East Lyme Middle School teacher and AP Environmental Science Students from East Lyme High School. from DEEP's Marine Fisheries Division provided touch tanks and gave a presentation on shoreline species and the importance of protecting their habitats

and water quality, and staff from the Southeastern Connecticut Regional Resource Recovery Authority led sessions on recycling. The Niantic River Watershed Committee and Save the River-Save the Hills also contributed to the event.

The Outdoor Classroom sessions meet the CT DEEP requirements for "Public Education and Outreach" for the Town's General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems. Town Engineer Victor Benni hopes the Outdoor Classroom will build an understanding of pollution control for East Lyme's students at an early age, which in turn will foster their desire to help preserve and protect the Town's water bodies, especially Long Island Sound.

East Lyme Public Safety encourages everyone to sign up for CT Alert ENS (Emergency Notification System) at ctalert.gov.

The CT Alert ENS uses the state's enhanced 911 (E9-1-1) database for location-based notifications to the public for life-threatening emergencies. The E9-1-1 database includes only traditional wire-line telephone numbers in the state (the "land line" phone you may have in your home).

CT Alert ENS Citizen Sign-up Page allows you to add other means of communications to CT Alert ENS, in addition to your

current home phone "land line" if you have one.

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

# Feeling Stressed?

Therapy can also help, allowing us to talk through our inner struggles in a supportive, nonjudgmental environment. When positive coping strategies become habits, the results can be dramatic. Our outlook improves, relationships feel more supportive and intimate, and demands begin to feel more manageable.

If you want help finding the strategies that will work for you, a therapist can assist you in discovering the right path. Choose the positive approach and see the changes that will come your way!






"There are approximately 60,000 people in CT who have epilepsy and an estimated 50,000,000 worldwide.

- 7. Have a philosophy and teaching methods as taught by Dr. Montessori. The foundation of this philosophy is respect for each child, respect for others, respect for parents and families, and respect for the community and environment.

The Montessori Method of teaching is a scientifically based educational pedagogy that was developed over a hundred years ago in Italy. This method of teaching has withstood the test of time with little need to change. # Public Works Single Stream Recycling

In single stream recycling, recyclables are separated at the processing plant and not at your home. This means that all recycling can be placed in a single container separate from the trash container and can be compacted resulting in reduced transportation costs.

No other containers are used for recycling. A gray recycling can is the only one that will be picked up. Recycling collection has been moved to a cycle of every other week. To view the single stream recycling calendar visit our web site at www.eltownhall.com/public works.

Single stream accepts all plastics with the exception of plastic bags and Styrofoam.

As with your trash can the recycling can must have a four-foot separation from other objects including your trash can.




