Transient Boat Dock Facility project:

\$45,000 DEEP Boating Infrastructure Grant

I am happy to report that our dock project has been completed. We received a grant for \$45,000 and began planning this project in 2012. Access to the docking facility is very simple. Airport Road runs south from the village center to the airport. Halfway between the village center and the airport is the current launch ramp where the transient boating facility is located.

The plan for this project was to construct approximately 50 feet of five-foot-wide fixed pile supported pier along the east shore bank of the Connecticut River just south of Goodspeed Opera House and north of the Goodspeed Airport. At the end of this fixed pier, two 8' x 20' floats were installed in an L-shaped configuration connected to the pier by a hinged ramp. Should funding become available, these dock facilities could be equipped to include electrical utilities including 30 and 50 amp power and fresh potable water.

The dock facility will provide an unparalleled opportunity for transient boaters to visit the village of East Haddam and enjoy the amenities and facilities which are within easy walking distance. The transient docking facility will be available to the public on a first come, first served basis.

This whole structure will be an innovative amenity to increase transient boating access to our community with a main goal of

supporting business in the East Haddam village.




Florida to enjoy his retirement.

East Haddam Ambulance Association

Over the past few months, members of East Haddam Ambulance Association (EHAA) have been busy with various training sessions and community events.

In August, over 30 EMTs, firefighters and lifeguards participated in a deep water rescue drill at the Town Beach. Drill topics and exercises included deep water search and rescue, back-boarding, transferring patients into the boat, transfer of care between departments and the use of rescue equipment. Skill sessions were also conducted within an ambulance. EMTs and lifeguards reviewed and practiced airway management, suctioning, CPR and cardiac

arrest scenarios for drowning victims. East Haddam Ambulance Association, East Haddam Parks and Recreation, East Haddam Fire Department, East Haddam Police Department, Colchester Hayward Fire Department, Gardner Lake Fire Department, East Haddam lifeguards and East Hampton lifeguards all participated.



Water Rescue Drill at Town Beach

On September 26th, four EMTs and two EMT students were victims at a Mass Casualty Incident drill at Bradley International Airport. Every three years the FAA requires the airport to conduct a scheduled drill to measure its response to an aircraft emergency. The drill tests Bradley International Airport Fire Department's Emergency Plan to a Mass Casualty event. The

drill, which simulates an aircraft accident, involved 25 different emergency response agencies and over 125 hundred people.

EHAA hosted Dr. Anthony Alessi as a guest speaker at a recent training night. Dr. Alessi spoke to EMTs and coaches from East Haddam and Colchester about signs and symptoms of concussions. The lecture focused on keeping younger athletes safe and preventing concussions. The program also featured a few videos of professional athletes suffering concussions during MLB and NFL games. Dr. Alessi is the director of the UConn NeuroSport Program and is a Clinical





Moodus Reservoir Herbicide Treatment Update

A targeted herbicide application to 25 acres of the Moodus Reservoir was completed the first week of August, 2015. The goal of the treatment was to understand the effectiveness of two herbicides, Reward and Clipper, to treat Variable Milfoil and Fanwort, two invasive weeds that now cover more than eighty percent of the shallow shoreline areas of the reservoir.

The treatment follows a lake study completed by the CT Agricultural Experiment Station which showed rapidly expanding growth of invasive weeds in the reservoir. It was sponsored by the Moodus Reservoir Preservation Group (MRPG) and the herbicides were applied by Aquatic Control Technology, a lake management company with extensive experience in managing invasive plants in fresh water bodies throughout New England. Funding for the study was provided through grants from the CT Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, the Town of East Haddam, and the Environmental Professionals Organization of CT, along with contributions from members of MRPG.

Initial short term observation shows a significant decrease in the number and density of invasive weeds in the treatment area. Longer term effects will be measured and reported this fall by Dr. George Knoecklein, Limnologist and founder of Northeast Aquatic Research, Inc.

MRPG is a local 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. New members are welcome and dues are \$25 per year. Donations to help us continue projects to improve this beautiful lake in East Haddam are always welcome and are tax deductible, as are dues. Sand for Winter Ice

Residents of East Haddam are reminded that they may take only a small amount of sand from one of the municipal sand piles for their personal use in sanding steps, walkways, or ice patches in driveways. Piles are located at the corner of Haywardville and Early Roads, and at the Town Garage, off Mt. Parnassus Road near Shagbark. For safety reasons, residents should not obtain

sand during storm conditions when operators are loading trucks and entering and leaving the site.

It is understood that sand is provided for private, personal use and is not to be used commercially or for profit, or for any application other than as a safety precaution. Residents needing more than a few buckets of sand per winter should purchase their own supply.

East Haddam Fire Department

Throughout the summer and early fall, the East Haddam Fire Department has been very busy with community events, and training. East Haddam Firefighters participate in a minimum of 2 training sessions per month. It is through this training that firefighters maintain their training requirements in accordance to department standards and OSHA.

The following is a list of the training that East Haddam Firefighters received:

- Firefighters participated in several marine rescue training sessions, on the Connecticut River and Moodus Reservoir.
- In July, the EHFD hosted a water operations drill that involved 5 different towns. East Haddam is not protected by traditional fire hydrants, thus it is imperative to stay proficient in the art of "moving water" via tanker vehicles and "drop tanks".
- In August, firefighters participated in their annual live burn training. Firefighters maintained proficiencies in forcible entry, search and rescue, ventilation, and fire attack. Thank you to the Colchester

Hayward Fire Department for the use of their training facility.

• Also in August, 6 firefighters attended advanced UTV (utility terrain vehicle) training. During that 8 hour training, firefighters became certified in the latest rescue techniques utilizing Ranger-15, East Haddam's Polaris Ranger 6x6.

On September 22nd the EHFD took part in a "Tip a Firefighter" event. This annual event has been held at the Hilltop BBQ since the events inception. Our 4th annual event was a huge success. A very special thank you to Hilltop BBQ for their hospitality and to everyone who came to support us!

During the week of October 4th, Firefighters, along with the local Fire Marshal, participated in Fire Prevention Week. Career and volunteer firefighters alike, spent the day at the elementary school.



The Snow will be Back!


We hear frequent complaints about the dangerous road conditions that result when people push driveway snow out into our public roads. We actually have an ordinance prohibiting this practice, which states, "No person shall plow, throw, put or cause to be thrown or put any snow or ice from any private property or from any area in the rear of said private property or in area between a private dwelling house or structure and the legally laid out sidewalk into any public highway in the town of East Haddam."

As a reminder to residents the town also has an ordinance regarding the clearing of sidewalks adjoining or fronting a resident or business property. The ordinance states:

"Whenever the sidewalk, or any part thereof, adjoining or fronting any building lot of land or any street, square or public place in the Town of East Haddam, shall have upon it an accumulation of snow, sleet or ice, it shall be the duty of the owner, occupant or any person having the case of such building or lot, to cause such sidewalks to be made safe and convenient by removing the snow, sleet or ice therefrom, or by covering the same with sand or some other suitable substance, and in case such owner, occupant or other person having the care of such building or lot shall neglect to do so for the space of eight (8) hours during the daytime, the person whose legal duty it shall be to clear the sidewalk, and so neglecting, shall be fined not more than twenty five (\$25.00) dollars for each occurrence, and every hour of neglect to make the sidewalks safe in accordance with the provisions of this section, after notice from the First Selectman or his designee, shall constitute a separate offense."

Please keep this in mind this winter. Your neighbors will appreciate it.


Please remember, due on January 1, 2016, is the second installment of Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills that were mailed out in July 2015. A second bill will not be sent on these accounts. If you are a new owner of real estate property and need a copy of your tax bill, please contact the tax office immediately. Motor Vehicle Supplemental bills are also due January 1, 2016. Supplemental bills will be mailed by the end of December 2015. The last day to pay these bills will be February 1st, 2016. Payments may be made in person at the Town Office Building, by mail to: Tax Collector, P. O. Box 376, East Haddam, CT 06423-0376 or on-line at easthaddam.org and click the link "Pay Taxes". There is a fee associated with on-line payments which goes directly to the processing company, Point & Pay, for their service. This fee applies to online and in the office credit/debit card payments. A secure lockbox is located in the front hallway for payments dropped off after normal business hours. Anyone wishing a receipt must include a self-addressed, stamped envelope with their payment.



Meet Joe Zaid, Conservation Volunteer



Joe Zaid is a groundskeeper by trade. He manages the grounds of I-Park, the large arts community near the Devil's Hopyard. So what does he do in his spare time? He "keeps the grounds" of East Haddam's open space. Joe began coming to Conservation Commission meetings several years ago, just after moving to Acorn Dr. with his wife and young daughter from Norfolk, Virginia, where he had served with the US Navy as a navigation and electronics specialist on the USS Scranton. Figuring that it would be a good way to meet people and learn about his

new home town from the people who know it best, he plunged into Commission work days, planning projects and clearing and marking trails.

The Conservation Commission quickly figured out that it had found a "keeper" and nominated him to be an official member. Now Saturday afternoons often find him checking the trails of the Rose Farm preserve, locating boundaries of the Davison Walking Park, or clearing a fallen tree on the Harris Property. His favorite activity? Designing trails on new parcels....and the team work of shared goals. His favorite parcel is the Hatch Lot, with its spectacular views, miles of marked trails, and links to other beautiful parcels. He is especially looking forward to helping with the construction of the ambitious 75 foot bridge that will cross the Eightmile River and link our Chapal Farm preserve with the Richard C. Goodwin Trail, a four town project.

And here is something unusual about Joe, the outdoorsman. He enjoys Commission meetings. Granted, our meetings are lively and regularly improved with amazing homemade delicacies. It was one of our lucky days as a Conservation Commission when Joe showed up to help. Advanced Cataract Surgery

Lasers have saved vision in patients with Diabetes, eliminated the need for glasses with LASIK, and now assist in Cataract Surgery. In the past, the surgeons would use blades and eye markers to create openings and guides for lens implantation; new technology shines a digital reflection onto the cornea eliminating the marking on the eye, uses a laser to break up your cataract and create near perfect openings for surgery. With this new technology, the plan starts from your visit in the office. Most patients complain of glare, halo, yellowing of colors, and blurred vision when having cataracts. Typical aging cataracts are seen in patients at approximately 50 years of age. With a dilated exam by your surgeon at Middlesex Eye Physicians, they determine if your cataract is ready for removal. Small cataracts are left alone until they "grow".

Once diagnosed with a cataract and deemed ready for surgery, our patients are sent to the surgical schedulers. The scheduler will educate the patient and make appropriate appointments. The process begins. Patients will have an ultrasound of their eye with specialized equipment. After this measurement, patients will be placed on a machine that will capture fine details on the eye for surgery such as the eyes external blood vessels and the iris composition (color part of the eye). This precise computer information is transferred to the physician to view and create a plan for cataract surgery. More precise measurements customized to the patient's own eyes means better visual outcomes.


